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I. FORM LIST

Other useful forms are also included to assist Newly Divorced Individuals in getting their legal life in order.

The documents in this package are written to comply with the laws of your state and include the following:

- 1.) A Will that meets your specific needs
- 2.) A Written Revocation of Prior Will
- 3.) A General Power of Attorney with Durable Provisions
- 4.) An Advance Health Care Directive
- 5.) A Name Change Notification Form
- 6.) A Personal Planning Information and Document Inventory Worksheet

II. DESCRIPTIONS OF FORMS

Brief descriptions of the forms contained in your U.S. Legal Forms™ Personal Planning Package are found below.

<u>Last Will</u> - Complete this form to detail in writing your wishes regarding who is to receive your property at death and who will administer your estate. It also enables you to appoint trustees or guardians, if applicable.

Revocation of Will - This Written Revocation of Will form is to revoke a prior will by separate written instrument. A separate revoking document is needed because when a new will is made, it will usually contain a clause revoking all prior wills. But what if the will containing the revocation clause is not favored by your heirs and they also have your old will which they do favor? Sometimes an unfavored will may be ignored by the heirs, destroyed or otherwise withheld from probate. Instead, a prior will is probated by your heirs. This written revocation is to make it clear that no prior will shall be probated and to provide additional evidence of your intent to revoke.

<u>General Power of Attorney with Durable Provisions</u> – This Power of Attorney is a statutory form which means it has been approved by the state legislature. It provides for the appointment of an attorney-in-fact (agent) for various matters, including property, finances, real estate, business, banking, litigation and many more options.

<u>Statutory Advance Health Care Directive</u> -This Statutory Living Will form allows you to express your wishes and desires if it is determined that your death will occur whether or not lifesustaining procedures are utilized and where the application of life-sustaining procedures would serve only to artificially prolong the dying process. It is a declaration that such procedures be withheld or withdrawn, and that you be permitted to die naturally with only the administration of medication or the performance of any medical procedure deemed necessary to provide you with comfortable care.

<u>Name Change Notification Form</u> - This form is for use after you have changed your name through a legal process. It is used to notify companies, organizations, government agencies and others of the name change.

Personal Planning Information and Document Inventory Worksheets - A Legal Life Document - This form enables you to document matters relevant to your life and personal planning such as the location of your important legal documents, names of relatives, contact information, medical information, financial asset inventory and more.

The form(s) in this packet may contain "form fields" created using Microsoft Word or Adobe Acrobat (".pdf" format). "Form fields" facilitate completion of the forms using your computer. They do not limit your ability to print the form "in blank" and complete with a typewriter or by hand.

It is also helpful to be able to see the location of the form fields. Go to the View menu, click on Toolbars, and then select Forms. This will open the Forms toolbar. Look for the button on the Forms toolbar that resembles a shaded letter "a". Click this button and the form fields will be visible.

By clicking on the appropriate form field, you will be able to enter the needed information. In some instances, the form field and the line will disappear after information is entered. In other cases, it will not. The form was created to function in this manner.
