### **I. FORM LIST**

With your Legal Documents for the Guardian of a Minor Package, you will find the forms that are commonly required to comply with various guardianship duties. Included in your package are the following forms:

## II. DESCRIPTIONS OF FORMS

Brief descriptions of the forms contained in your U.S. Legal Forms™ Legal Documents for the Guardian of a Minor Package are found below.

1. Parent Guardian Permission For Child To Participate - This form is a release for a child to participate in an after-school activity. The child is verified to be fit to participate. It also provides for emergency phone numbers to be contacted and a consent for any emergency dental or medical treatment that may arise out of the activity.
2. Guardianship Current Assets - This form is used to make a current accounting of current assets of a minor, including cash accounts, real property interests, and other personal and miscellaneous property.
3. Guardianship Expenditures - This form is used to detail expenses made by a minor's guardian on the minor's behalf.
4. Guardianship Receipts - This form is used to track guardianship receipts, detailing the date, source and reason for the receipt, and amount.
5. Power of Attorney for Care of Minor - This form is a Limited Power of Attorney. The form lists the natural guardians of minor children and provides that the attorney-in-fact may act with limited powers in regard to the health, education, and general welfare of the minor children.
6. Waiver and Release From Liability For Minor Child for School Field Trip - This form is a waiver and release for injuries to a child from participating in a school field trip. It does not apply to any acts of gross negligence, or intentional, willful or wanton misconduct. Known medical conditions may be detailed, as well as any prohibited activities the guardian expresses.

By clicking on the appropriate form field, you will be able to enter the needed information. In some instances, the form field and the line will disappear after information is entered. In other cases, it will not. The form was created to function in this manner.
