ORDER GRANTING CONDITIONAL STAY

RESPONDENTS

Upon motion of , petitioner, for a stay of enforcement of order of the Mississippi Gaming Commission, revoking certain conditional licenses of petitioner to operate as a commercial lessor pursuant to the Charitable Bingo Law, and upon a hearing of same, the court finds, as follows:

- 1. Jurisdiction of the appeal from the Mississippi Gaming Commission's order revoking the conditional licenses of petitioner rests with the Circuit Court of County, Mississippi.
- 2. On , , the Mississippi Gaming Commission, upon petitioner's request for a stay, and upon due consideration of the evidence, found that a stay would disserve the public interest and that potential harm to the public and to charitable organizations outweighed the threatened injury to the petitioner and denied a stay.
- 3. Mississippi Rule of Civil Procedure 62 and the Gaming Control Act allows the court to stay enforcement of the order of the Mississippi Gaming Commission, pending review.
 - 4. Petitioner would suffer irreparable harm if the stay is not granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that enforcement of the order of the Mississippi Gaming Commission, revoking the conditional commercial lessor's licenses of petitioner, be stayed, conditioned on the following:

- 1. Petitioner shall receive no more than \$ per bingo session from (" ") as rental.
