ORDER GRANTING CONDITIONAL STAY

Upon motion of _____, petitioner, for a stay of enforcement of order of the Mississippi Gaming Commission, revoking certain conditional licenses of petitioner to operate as a commercial lessor pursuant to the Charitable Bingo Law, and upon a hearing of same, the court finds, as follows:

1. Jurisdiction of the appeal from the Mississippi Gaming Commission's order revoking the conditional licenses of petitioner rests with the Circuit Court of _____ County, Mississippi.

2. On _____, _____, the Mississippi Gaming Commission, upon petitioner's request for a stay, and upon due consideration of the evidence, found that a stay would disserve the public interest and that potential harm to the public and to charitable organizations outweighed the threatened injury to the petitioner and denied a stay.

3. Mississippi Rule of Civil Procedure 62 and the Gaming Control Act allows the court to stay enforcement of the order of the Mississippi Gaming Commission, pending review.

4. Petitioner would suffer irreparable harm if the stay is not granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that enforcement of the order of the Mississippi Gaming Commission, revoking the conditional commercial lessor's licenses of petitioner, be stayed, conditioned on the following:

1. Petitioner shall receive no more than \$ _____ per bingo session from (" _____") as rental.

2. Petitioner shall receive no more than \$ _____ per bingo session from (" _____") as rental.

3. Petitioner shall receive no more than \$ _____ . per bingo session from _____, (" _____") as rental.

4. Payments from , , or to shall be made by personal check drawn on the separate bingo accounts of each and signed by their designated members in charge.

5. Petitioner shall not have a direct payment, of any kind or nature, directly or indirectly, with , , or .

6. Petitioner may not .

7. part in its lessees' bingo activities or the holding, operation or conducting of it lessees bingo games.

8. Neither petitioner nor shall be on during bingo sessions.

9. Petitioner shall establish internal controls and timely submit reports in accordance with the Charitable Bingo Law and the regulations adopted by the Mississippi Gaming Commission.

10. Petitioner shall freely allow the Mississippi Gaming Commission and its staff to exercise its enforcement powers.

11. Petitioner shall comply with the laws of the State of Mississippi and regulations of the Mississippi Gaming Commission.

12. The Mississippi Gaming Commission shall immediately notify this court of any violation of this order. If the court finds that petitioner has violated any provision of this order, the stay shall be .
