II. DESCRIPTIONS OF FORMS

Brief descriptions of the forms contained in your U.S. Legal Forms™ Power of Attorney Package are found below.

<u>General Durable Power of Attorney for Property and Finances Effective Upon Disability</u> – This General Durable Power of Attorney for Property and Finances Effective upon Disability form is a general, durable power of attorney which is effective ONLY upon the principal's disability,

incompetency or incapacity. This form allows you to appoint an attorney-in-fact (agent) to make decisions regarding property, financial, business, banking, management and other matters for you. The powers granted to an Agent in this Power of Attorney are very broad, but do NOT provide for health care services.

General Durable Power of Attorney for Property and Finances Effective Immediately - This General Durable Power of Attorney is a general, durable power of attorney which is effective IMMEDIATELY. This form allows you to appoint an attorney-in-fact (agent) to make decisions regarding property, financial, business, banking, management and other matters for you. The powers granted to an Agent in this Power of Attorney are very broad, but do NOT provide for health care services. This form complies with all applicable state statutory laws.

<u>Power of Attorney for Care and Custody of Children</u> – This Power of Attorney is a form which provides for the appointment of an attorney-in-fact for the care of a child or children, including health care. This Power of Attorney form requires that the signature of the person giving another the power of attorney to be notarized.

<u>Health Care Proxy - Statutory</u> – This is a statutory form that is provided in the Oklahoma Statutes that allows you to state that you do not wish to be resuscitated by medical personnel in the event that your heart stops beating or you stop breathing.

Health Care Directive – Statutory - This is a statutory form that is provided in the Oklahoma Statutes and provides a means for you to express a variety of health care choices and decisions: specific instructions for life sustaining procedures or treatment, appointment of a health care agent, and the making of anatomical gifts. An individual of sound mind and eighteen (18) years of age or older may execute an advance directive governing the withholding or withdrawal of life sustaining treatment. The advance directive must be signed by the declarant and witnessed by two individuals who are eighteen years of age and who are not legatees, devisees, or heirs at law of the declarant.
