# **Compliance Checklist for Company Websites**

### I. Website Design and Development and Set-up

- A. Agreement with Web Developer
  - Work for Hire Company retains all rights, especially rights in intellectual property
  - 2. Control and indemnification obligations
  - 3. Ownership of the domain name
- B. Other Agreements -- Agreement with web hosting company/ASP agreements
- C. Website Use
  - 1. Terms and conditions of website use
  - 2. Interrelation with privacy statement
- D. Other
  - Process for checking links, databases and E-mails systems for functionality
  - 2. Website instruction (i.e., instructions to refresh images)
  - 3. Legal infrastructure

## II. Company Set-Up/Structure

- A. Situs Issues
  - Nature of business entity
    - a. Corporation/partnership/limited liability company/other
    - b. Single entity/multiple company structure
  - 2. Location of Equipment
    - a. Implications for Taxation and other issues
      - (i) Personal property tax issues
      - (ii) Compliance with state "sales tax" requirements
  - 3. Physical Presence of Company/Company unit
    - a. Does location of equipment vs. location of physical offices constitute "doing business" in a particular state or taxing jurisdiction for purposes of real property/state franchise/sales taxes

- b. Does existence of website constitute "doing business" under state law?
  - (i) "Qualification to transact business" under state corporate or similar "doing business" laws
  - (ii) Licensing laws

- B. Interaction with Third Parties

  - 2. Contracts with vendors/suppliers -- Can Company get the product/service to the consumer

- C. Obtain (and disclose if required) Federal/State Licenses Required to Operate

- 1. Regulated industries -- Contractors, professional engineering firms, common carriers, pest control companies
- 2. Regulated persons -- Accountants, lawyers, doctors, engineers

### III. Intellectual Property

- A. Company Property
  - 1. Use of registered marks
    - a. Company's names, logos, taglines
    - b. Use of other party's registered trademarks
  - 2. Use domain names
  - 3. Information provided on the Website
    - a. Is Company inadvertently disclosing "confidential" or "proprietary" information

    - a. Compliance with the Company's confidentiality policy

    - c. Defamation and other liability issues
    - d. First Amendment rights

- B. Third-Party Intellectual Property
  - 1. Does the Company have adequate rights to use that property?
    - a. Web development agreement
    - b Third-party license
    - c. Proper use and Attribution of third-party marks and copyrighted information
  - 2. Joint marketing agreements
  - 3. Linking/framing issues
  - 4. Publicity issues
- C. Web Technology

- 1. Technology, software, internet methods and processes
  - a. Owned/developed by the Company
    - (i) Patent and copyright rights
  - b. (ii) Licensed from third parties
- 2. Does use of website require use by customer of special processes/software? (e.g., required use of Adobe Acrobat to Company files)
  - a. Method for download/use
  - b. Required licenses and terms of use
