CHECKLIST OF WARNING SIGNS OF SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Sexual harassment can be defined as unwanted verbal or physical behavior of a sexual nature that is repeated after there has been a clear statement that it is not welcome. Listed below are warning signs of behavior considered to be sexual harassment.
Inappropriate Comments.
Note: Managers should note inappropriate sexual comments, jokes, flirting, or use of affectionate terms.
Inappropriate Physical Contact.
Note: Managers should watch for any touching that appears suggestive. Managers should let employees know immediately if something is inappropriate.
Howling, Catcalls, Whistles.
Leaving sexual messages on email.
Content in letters and notes, facsimiles, and e-mail that is of a sexual nature.
Unwelcome touching, patting, brushing up against, or tickling.
Behavior that creates a "hostile" work environment.
Displaying pictures, calendars, cartoons, or other sexual material in the workplace.
