The Coroners Act 1988 requires every Coroner within seven days of the holding of an inquest into the death of any person who is proved to have been killed on a railway, or to have died in consequence of injuries received on a railway, to make the Secretary of State, in such form as he may require, a return of the death and the cause thereof. The following is the form required by the Secretary of State.
