

What to bring to your assessment Act now to help us maintain trust and security

To help us maintain trust and security at British Airways, please bring at least four original documents to your assessment. These documents will confirm your identity and address; prove your right to work in the UK and provide proof of your <u>National Insurance number</u> (if you have one).

Please ACT NOW to collect the right documents and ensure you bring them on the day. You will not be able to complete your assessment without them. These checklists will help you.

What to bring

EITHER

You only need four documents at the assessment centre if you have a passport, National Insurance card, driving licence and bank statement with your address (dated in the last three months.) Use this checklist to make sure you have all you need:

Check all four documents
Passport valid for at least 12 months (plus visa if applicable)
□ National Insurance card
Photo card driving licence
Bank or credit card statement (Includes your address and is dated in the last three months. (Please delete any credit card number shown on the credit card statement.)

OR

If you do not have the four documents above complete sections A-C on pages 2-4, and bring all your chosen documents to your assessment:

- A. Proof of identity and address
- **B.** Proof of your right to work
- C. Proof of your National Insurance Number (if you have one)

A. Proving your identity and address

There are two ways of proving your identity and address. Please choose **one** option and collect the documents you need bring.

B. Proving your right to work

All employees of British Airways must have the right to work in the UK. Please ensure you bring one of these original documents to prove your right to work in the UK.

Bring one document from this table
A current, valid passport showing you are a British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies, having the right of abode in the UK.
A passport or national identity card showing you are a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
A current <u>Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit)</u> issued by the <u>Home Office</u> showing you are allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or have no time limit on your stay in the UK.
A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to you as a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
A <u>Registration Certificate</u> or <u>Document Certifying Permanent Residence</u> issued by the <u>Home Office</u> to you as a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
A current passport endorsed to show you are exempt from immigration control, are allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, have the right of abode in the UK, or have no time limit on your stay in the UK.
A current Immigration Status Document issued by the <u>Home Office</u> showing you are allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or have no time limit on your stay in the UK, AND an official document giving your permanent National Insurance number and your name, issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of your parents or adoptive parents, AND an official document giving your permanent National Insurance number and your name, issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland, AND an official document giving your permanent National Insurance number and your name, issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, AND an official document giving your permanent National Insurance number and your name, issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.

C. Proof of your National Insurance number (if you have one*)

You'll pay National Insurance from what you earn, in return for certain benefits including the State Pension.

If you have a National Insurance number, please bring **one** of these **original** documents as proof:

A P45 or P60 showing your National Insurance number
An official document showing your National Insurance number (e.g. a letter from HM Revenue and Customs or Jobcentre)
X We cannot accept payslips.

***NO NATIONAL INSURANCE NUMBER?**

If you have lost your National Insurance number, you will need to find it and bring it to your assessment. Find your lost National Insurance number.

If you have never had a National Insurance number, you can still attend your assessment. You must <u>apply for a National Insurance number</u> if we offer you a role.
