SUBSAFE Program at Newport News Shipbuilding

As part of our focus on Quality this month, we are highlighting Newport News Shipbuilding's SUBSAFE Program this week. The program was formed following the tragic loss of 129 personnel during USS *Thresher*'s sea trials and was implemented to provide maximum reasonable assurance of hull integrity to preclude flooding, operability and integrity of critical systems to control and recover from a flooding casualty. The program also has responsibility for the Deep Submergence Systems – Scope of Certification (DSS-SOC) and the Fly-By-Wire Ship Control System certification boundaries. These programs are similar to the SUBSAFE program because they provide reasonable assurance that an accident will not occur, but if an accident were to occur that all personnel would be recovered safely.

"The SUBSAFE Program stresses to always be on guard against ignorance, arrogance and complacency," said **Sean Coons**, SUBSAFE program manager. "Despite our robust process of conducting inspections and audits, there are many operations where the only person who will ever know if your work was done correctly and per requirements is you. For every job you complete, ask yourself if you'd be willing to take that job on initial sea trials."
