Type of invented holiday (circle one)	<b>Religious/Cultural</b> : This kind of holidays is strongly connected to some religious or cultural tradition or originates from it. Examples: Christmas, Hanukkah, Eid al-Fitr, Easter, Yom Kippur, Diwali, Halloween, Easter, Kwanzaa, Mardi Gras		
	<b>Calendar</b> : This kind of holidays celebrates some seasonal or astronomical events. Examples: New Year, Vernal Equinox, Oktoberfest, Groundhog Day.		
	<b>Historical/Political:</b> This type of holidays commemorates some important political/historical events or symbols. Examples: Thanksgiving, Victory Day, Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day, Independence Day, Flag Day, Election Day		
	Personage/Professional/Social: These holidays commemorate great persons, some groups of people that share one profession or occupation or dedicated to people of a particular family role or age group. Examples: Helen Keller Day, Birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr., International Workers' Day, Administrative Professionals Day, Veteran's Day, Mother's Day, Children's Day, Parents' Day, Father's Day
