

Mini-Mental State Examination

Everyone is forgetful now and again. Most people who have mild forgetfulness do not have Alzheimer's disease. But when memory loss starts to interfere with daily activities, it is time to consult with a physician to determine the cause for the problem.

Alzheimer's disease is not a product of the natural aging process. Scientists do not know what causes the disease; however, age is a factor in the percentages of those who have the disease. The disease usually begins after age 60 and the risk goes up with the increase in age. Approximately 5 million Americans currently suffer from Alzheimer's disease.

If Alzheimer's disease is suspected, a thorough assessment is recommended. Tools like the MMSE are beneficial in determining mental status.

Mini-Mental State Examination

The Mini-Mental State Examination (MMSE) is a tool that can be used to systematically and thoroughly assess mental status. It is an 11-question measure that tests five areas of cognitive function: orientation, registration, attention and calculation, recall, and language.

The maximum score is 30. A score of 23 or lower is indicative of cognitive impairment. The MMSE takes only 5–10 minutes to administer and is therefore practical to use repeatedly and routinely.

You may initiate this exam by stating the following: "The next few questions are ones that some people find difficult and some people find easy to answer. We ask them of everyone, so I hope you will bear with me."

9. Have the client read and follow the command: "Close your eyes." (See attached.) _____ 0-1

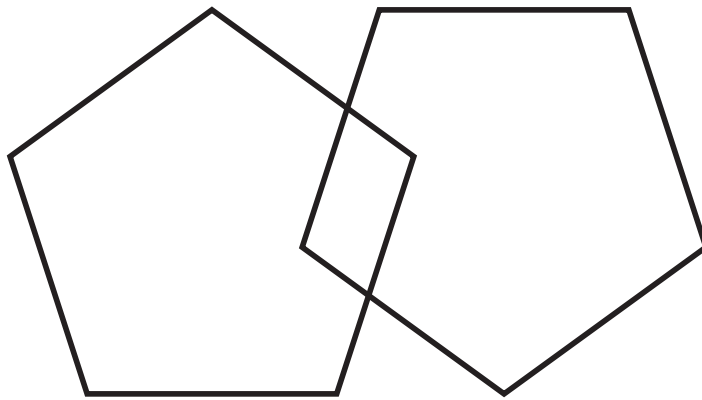
Ability to Write and Comprehend:

11. Show the client the diagram on the following page. Ask the client to reproduce the diagram beneath the one that appears there. To be considered correct, the diagram must have 2 figures, each with 5 connecting sides. The two figures must have one intersecting angle, (not necessarily the same intersecting angle depicted in the original). _____ 0-1
