3. Scope of works/Technical specifications

3.1 BACKGROUND

The National Treasury pronounced on the introduction of a Carbon Tax in the 2013 Budget Speech. The tax was to be implemented in 2015, however, the implementation was postponed in the 2014 Budget Review to 2016 to allow for logistical arrangements and further consultation to be completed before implementation.

The 2014 Budget Review proposed that a carbon offsets scheme be introduced to complement the proposed Carbon Tax policy package to address climate change and protect households and businesses. In April 2014 the National Treasury published a Carbon Offsets Discussion Paper which outlined how companies will be able to reduce their carbon tax liability by up to 10% of their actual emissions. Using carbon offsets as a flexibility mechanism to reduce carbon tax liability mirrors current trends globally, where a number of countries are employing economic instruments to reduce their greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions.

In November 2015, National Treasury published a Carbon Tax Bill which among others makes a provision that companies can use Carbon Offsets to reduce their Carbon Tax liability by up to 5 to 10 per cent of their actual emissions and the Department of Energy (DoE) is expected to administer the Carbon Offset Administration System (COAS).

A number of Carbon Offsets standards used internationally have been identified as viable in the South African market and this includes Clean Development Mechanism (CDM), Verified Carbon Standard (VCS), Gold Standard (GS) and Climate, Community and Biodiversity Standards (CCBS). The projects developed using these standards will be eligible as carbon offsets projects.

The Carbon Offsets Discussion Paper published by National Treasury listed possible initiatives that can be eligible for Carbon Offsets and Carbon Emission Reductions (CERs). It is against this background that the DoE would like to conduct a feasibility study to ascertain the possibility considering a SWH programme among other carbon offset programme from which liable entities can use the credits generated through it to reduce their carbon tax liabilities. The Discussion Paper also indicated that the CERs generated from such a programme can be traded on the proposed Carbon Trading Platform.

In the National Development Plan the government of South Africa envisions the installation base of SWHs in South Africa to reach 5 million by 2030. Since 2009 this programme has evolved with a significant potential to reduce emissions if the implementation is intensified nationally. The majority of government fully subsidised SWHs are being installed in disadvantaged households or low cost housing countrywide thereby contributing to poverty alleviation, value-chain job creation (manufacturing, installation and related services as well as maintenance) whilst mid-high market (partially) subsidised installations aid in the reduction of the electricity load on the national grid thereby contributing towards ameliorating the challenges of constrained supply the country is currently facing.

As at 30 September 2015 the recorded footprint of SWH installations was in upwards of 500 000 and it is expected that the installation rate will significantly increase considering that a new

implementation model that is being administered by the DoE has given the programme a new boost. It is also important to highlight that the programme, which is largely funded by government from the National Budget, is being implemented under a constrained fiscal environment and in the midst of other competing government priorities. However it is worth noting that the government funding commitment does not take away the fact that private sector has also invested in this programme in their own facilities as well as in some community projects as part of their social corporate responsibilities.

It is therefore necessary and compelling that other innovative funding mechanisms be identified and investigated to fund and sustain the programme in the implementation and maintenance phases, including but not limited to the trading of Carbon Credits that can be generated by the programme.

The Carbon Offset Discussion Paper made provision that CERs generated from projects developed under the four accepted international carbon offsets standards as mentioned above will be accepted as carbon offsets projects. This has created a space to investigate the suitable standards that can be used to develop a self-sustaining South African SWH Programme to generate CERs and eventually to be packaged and submitted as a carbon offset project. CERs from such a qualifying carbon offset project can be purchased by companies to reduce their carbon tax liability.

3.2 PROJECT OBJECTIVES

3.2.1 The main objective of this assignment is to conduct a feasibility study for the development of a self-sustaining South African SWH Programme as a project that can generate Carbon Credits through one or more of the international carbon offset standard(s) identified in the carbon offset discussion paper. The main objective should be realized through the following specific objectives:

3.2.2 To identify suitable international carbon offsets standard(s) through a detailed analysis of all identified standards in Carbon Offset Discussion paper that can be used to develop the envisaged self-sustaining South African SWH Programme as a project that can generate Carbon Credits that can ultimately be traded in the carbon offset programme.

3.2.3 To conduct the feasibility of generating carbon credits through the recommended international carbon offsets standard(s); and

3.2.4 To propose an appropriate implementation model that can be used to implement the South African SWH Programme, taking due cognizance of the national context and the current delivery model, to be registered in line with the recommended international carbon offsets standard(s) to be eligible for generating carbon credits and further recognising that the DoE is host of the Designated National Authority (DNA) and the proposed administrator of the carbon offset programme.

3.3 SCOPE OF WORK

The appointed service provider will be expected to thoroughly undertake the following activities

3.3.1 Develop an inception report detailing the methodology that will be used to respond to the main and specific objectives of the assignment.

3.3.2 Analyse the South African SWH Programme including its current implementation model, its sustainability and funding structure and advise whether the programme in its current structure can be developed into a carbon credit eligible for the carbon offset programme.

3.3.3 Conduct a thorough analysis in relation to the criterion, processes, procedures, administrative requirements, and technical requirements of the different identified international carbon offsets standards namely CDM, VCS, GS and CCBS in the Carbon Offset Paper.

3.3.4 Based on the analysis conducted in 3.2 and 3.3 recommend the appropriate carbon offset standard(s) suitable that can be used to develop the South African SWH Programme as a carbon credit project eligible for the carbon offset programme.

3.3.4.1 The recommendation of the appropriate carbon offset standard(s) must include clear reasons justifying why the standard(s) should be selected. The recommendations should be based on an analysis of both advantages and disadvantages of all four standard(s) as identified by the Carbon Offsets Discussion Paper.

3.3.4.2 Clearly outline the process and procedures of the selected carbon offset standard(s) that would be followed specifically for the SWH Programme, the associated challenges thereof of the selected standard(s) and how to mitigate those challenges should be included.

3.3.5 Conduct a thorough feasibility study of the selected carbon offset standard(s).

3.3.5.1 The implementation plan should consider all the processes and procedures that must be followed under the recommended carbon offset standard(s) and the costs associated with adhering to such processes and procedures.

3.3.5.2 The implementation plan should recommend appropriate institutional arrangement, also identify and recommend relevant institutions that should form part of implementing structure for the project whilst indicating the roles and responsibilities of the recommended institutions. This should take into consideration that DoE is currently both the implementer of the South African SWH Programme and the host of the country's DNA and the proposed administrator of the carbon offset programme. The costs associated with implementing the recommended plan should be quantified as part of 3.5.2

3.3.5.3 Recommend how the proposed implementation plan can be funded and also propose how the envisaged accrued benefits can from carbon credits can be channeled back to the implementation of the SWH programme in order to sustain and expand this national programme

3.3.6 Capture the outputs of all the 6 project activities into a final report providing clear recommendations of what should be considered as next steps in terms of taking the project forward.

3.4 EXPECTED OUTPUT

3.4.1 An inception report which amongst other outlines a clear methodology, milestones and timelines for completing the assignment successfully.

3.4.2 A report analyzing the South African SWH Programme and all the identified international carbon offset standards and recommending the appropriate standard(s) that would be appropriate for the development and implementation of the South African SWH Programme as a carbon credit project eligible for the Carbon Offsets Programme.

3.4.3 A feasibility report quantifying all the costs and benefits associated with development and implementation of the South African SWH Programme into a carbon credit project and recommending whether the investment into the project will be justifiable or not. The report should also include an analysis of all the challenges envisaged and how they could be mitigated. The mitigation plan should also be costed.

3.4.4 A report with a clear implementation plan and the associated costs and the required institutional arrangement to operationalize the plan. The report should also propose how the costs can be funded and indicate how the benefits from carbon credits can be accrued back to government and propose how they can be used to sustain and expand the programme

3.5 PAYMENTS

3.5.1 The DoE will not process an upfront payment to a successful service provider(s).

3.5.2 Payment(s) will only be processed in accordance with the delivered service (i.e. certified / approved deliverables and milestones) as agreed upon by both parties in line with the payment schedule and upon receipt of an original invoice that is based on an approved deliverable. The 30 day period (maximum time set to settlement the invoice) will be counted after all the required documents have been submitted to the DoE.

3.5.3 The payment schedule will be negotiated with recommended service provider(s) prior to parties concluding the Service Level Agreement (SLA).

3.5.4 The DoE will certify all the deliverables prior to SANEDI processed any payments.

3.6 REPORTING REQUIREMENT AND PROGRESS MEETINGS

3.6.1 It is envisaged that the DoE will require an initial meeting with successful bidder(s) to agree on the project process and implementation. This will be followed up by an inception workshop for approving the inception report and sharing of experiences.

3.6.2 A plan for progress meetings shall be included in the inception report and will be subject to the DoE's approval. All meetings will be held in Pretoria. Representatives from service provider's organization shall be obliged to attend. Where applicable, conference calls shall be held to facilitate such meetings.

3.6.3 The DoE will provide record of all progress meetings which shall be held at least monthly.

3.7 COMPLETION DATE

3.7.1 The duration of the project to carry out all the analysis, feasibility modeling and developing implementation plan shall be 6 months after signing of the contract with the successful service provider(s).

5 Tax Clearance Requirements

16.	It is a condition of bid that the taxes of the successful bidder must be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the bidder's tax obligations.
17.	In order to meet this requirement bidders are required to complete in full the attached form TCC 001 "Application for a Tax Clearance Certificate" and submit it to any SARS branch office nationally. The Tax Clearance Certificate Requirements are also applicable to foreign bidders / individuals who wish to submit bids.
18.	SARS will then furnish the bidder with a Tax Clearance Certificate that will be valid for a period of 1 (one) year from the date of approval.
19.	The Tax Clearance Certificate must be submitted together with the bid. Failure to submit a valid Tax Clearance Certificate will result in the invalidation of the bid. Certified copies of the Tax Clearance Certificate will not be acceptable.
20.	In bids where Consortia / Joint Ventures / Sub-contractors are involved, each party must submit a separate Tax Clearance Certificate.
21.	Copies of the TCC 001 "Application for a Tax Clearance Certificate" form are available from any SARS branch office nationally or on the website www.sars.gov.za
22.	Applications for the Tax Clearance Certificates may also be made via eFiling. In order to use this provision, taxpayers will need to register with SARS as eFilers through the website www.sars.gov.za .

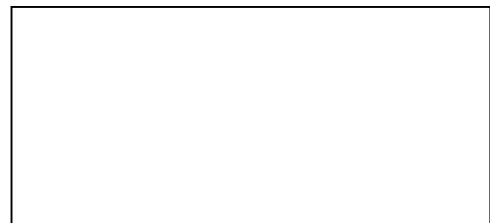
