Are you a pharmacist providing immunizations or CLIA-waived testing services? If so, you must have <u>live</u> OSHA training <u>every year</u>. OSHA's fines for non-compliance can exceed **\$90,000**. You can comply with OSHA's training requirements **less than \$100**.

(You do the math.)

Even if you participate in an OSHA training program every year, you are not in compliance with OSHA's requirements if the training doesn't have a LIVE component.
