EXPLANATION OF SCHOLARSHIP PROCESS

- IMPORTANT! All Scholarship Applications MUST BE complete and postmarked by 10/15/14 or faxed or emailed date stamped no later than 12 midnight on 10/15/14.

- All Scholarship Applications must include all of the REQUIRED INFORMATION outlined above. Failure to include any of these items will result in disqualification of the applicant from consideration.
- Weight is given to those applications showing a compelling current event that resulted in the need for scholarship consideration.
- 4 GPA's below 2.30 are considered a disqualifying element for scholarship consideration. However, consideration will be given to an individual who may have a documented diagnosed learning disability.
- The participation of the player in volunteering and/or working in order to earn money for their hockey fees is an important consideration. However, the Scholarship Committee understands this isn't always possible for a variety of reasons (age, school, etc.), so we allow for an explanation if there is no volunteering/work and consideration for parental volunteer commitments within their club or organization.
- The Scholarship Committee believes all applications should be given equal consideration. Therefore, applications will be reviewed as submitted. Requests for additional information will only be made in rare cases, since this would give some applicants time to strengthen their application and other would not be given that same opportunity.
- Additional weight will be given to those players at the A and B level. While the Scholarship Committee understands AA and AAA fees are generally greater, there are other hockey venues available to these players that would be less expensive. No consideration will be given to applications that list, in the Attached Explanation, that the compelling current event is the increased fees of AA or AAA hockey.
