

Talent Scholarships

Description: The University of Glasgow awards Postgraduate Talent Scholarships each academic year to support students who could face financial difficulties in taking up their place to study at the University. The value of each scholarship is £2,000 and they are for students undertaking a one year Taught Masters programme in any of the University's colleges.

Value: £2,000

Eligibility: To be eligible, applicants must

- intend to commence a one year postgraduate Taught Masters programme in September 2016
- not previously have undertaken postgraduate study
- provide evidence of excellent academic achievement in their undergraduate studies (i.e. 2:1 degree classification, or above)
- not be in receipt of a University scholarship
- be ordinarily resident in Scotland for 3 years prior to the start of their programme for a purpose other than studying and be classified as a 'Home' student for fee purposes
- provide evidence that their circumstances are such that they may find it difficult to take up a place at the University for financial or other reasons.

N.B. It is the applicant's responsibility to send the additional information and documentation requested below to email address by the stated deadline. Applications cannot and will not be considered without the relevant documents and information to support them.

These scholarships are available to applicants who will be registered as new postgraduate taught students at the University of Glasgow. Applicants who will be registered as Postgraduate Research students are not eligible.

All sections of the application must be completed as instructed on the online application.

Applicants must have an offer of a place for the next admission intake in order to be considered and will be expected to meet all the conditions of their academic offer in time to register at the University of Glasgow.

Scholarships may not be deferred to the following academic year. Applicants must therefore register on their academic course by the given start date, as specified in their award communication.

Scholarships are awarded for a set period of study as stated in the award communication. Scholarships cannot be extended.

Award of scholarship is conditional upon the status for fee-paying purposes being correctly determined by the Admissions team. Scholars whose status is pending or has changed must notify the scholarship team immediately.

Scholarships are supplementary to a scholar's main source of income.

Scholars may be requested to participate in current and future promotional activities and as such may be interviewed and photographed by our marketing team. Scholars may also be asked to contribute occasionally to the promotion of the University of Glasgow during events organised by the Marketing Recruitment and International Office. Scholars agree no payment will be made by the University to the scholars for their participation in promotional activities

If scholars are awarded a 'named' Talent Award (i.e. the funding for which has been provided to the University by a donor), in accepting the award, scholars agree to write to the donor(s) to provide a progress report on their studies on an annual basis when requested to do so.

To support the University's work to increase the Scholarship Fund further, scholars agree they will provide feedback about how the Talent Scholarship has been of assistance to them when requested.
