Principal's Report

Dear Parents/Carers,

Student Welfare

Two of the students in our school community are receiving medical treatments, which puts them at risk if they develop chicken pox, mumps, measles or shingles.

It is very important therefore, that you let us know immediately if you believe that your child has contracted or recently been exposed to chicken pox, mumps, measles or shingles. Please contact the school office as soon as possible so that children's parents can be alerted immediately.

This protection lasts for a few weeks only and must be repeated every time the children come into contact with these illnesses.

Your child is not at risk whatsoever from this situation

Assembly

It was pleasing to see so many members of our school community at our first Assembly for 2015 on Monday morning. The prep students did a fantastic job with not only being there but with their participation in singing and signing the National Anthem and our School Song. Assembly will be held each Monday morning, and in the event of a public holiday on Monday, assembly will be held on Tuesday morning. As always parents, carers and members of our school community are invited to attend.

School Captains

At assembly on Monday morning we presented badges to the Grade 6 students who have leadership positions for 2015. We also presented badges to our School Captains Reuben W and Lauren M. It was a privilege to acknowledge these school leaders and we look forward to their work throughout the year.

Weather Conditions

It is important that our students are adequately protected from the sun. Our 'Hats On' Policy requires all students to wear a bucket or broad brim hat from the 1st September through until 30th April each year. It is important that students apply sunscreen to assist with protection. Whilst we are able to remind students to apply sunscreen, we are not able to provide sunscreen or apply sunscreen. Therefore if you want your child to reapply sunscreen during the day, they must have their own sunscreen and they must be able to apply it themselves. During extreme weather conditions, (generally temperatures above 35 degrees), students will remain inside during recess and lunch breaks.

Children and Hot Cars. No Exceptions. No Excuses.

ON HOT DAYS, <u>NEVER</u> LEAVE KIDS ALONE IN CARS **NO EXCEPTIONS. NO EXCUSES.**

We have been asked to publish the following information in our school newsletter.

On hot days, it is important to remember that children should never be left alone in a car.

The temperature inside a car on hot days begins to rise as soon as the door closes and within minutes the temperature inside can be double the temperature outside. Leaving children in hot cars – even for a moment – can result in injury or death.

Young children's smaller body size and underdeveloped nervous system places them at a much greater risk of life-threatening heatstroke, dehydration and other serious health risks.

Victorian legislation makes leaving a child unattended in a car a criminal offence, with penalties ranging from fines of \$2,165.00 or three months in prison.

If you are travelling with a child in a car and you need to get out, make sure you take your child with you. No exceptions. No excuses.
