► BWorks Computer Camp: Earn-a-Computer Program

The St. Louis Byte Works Earn-a-Computer Program teaches youth that they can set goals – and reach them. Dream, challenge yourself and reach for more. Harvard/MIT curriculum includes:

- Introduction to computers; Computer setup and use
- Computer programming using MIT's Scratch software
- Networking basics; Internet safety
- Creating and delivering presentations using *LibreOffice Impress*

Students who attend every class earn a computer, monitor, keyboard, mouse and flash drive. (*Computer pickup on Saturdays*).

► Robotics Camp

Learn how to build and maneuver a *LEGO Mindstorm NXT* robot, Simplebot. Working in small groups, students will learn to program their robots to navigate a maze, make a sound and display a message. Students will complete challenges, such as the *Dizzy Drill* and *Buried Treasure*. All supplies, including *LEGO Mindstorm NXT* kits and netbook computers are provided by St. Louis County 4-H.

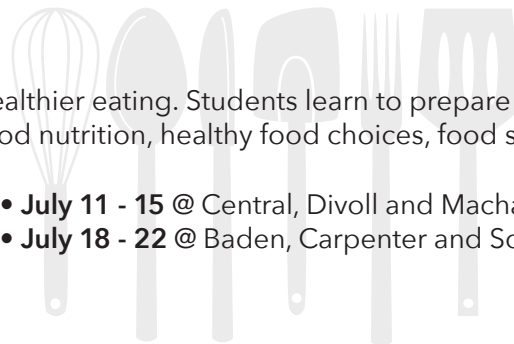

She now teaches theater at Lindenwood University. She has extensive experience organizing youth theater, having directed a Summer Shakespeare Boot Camp for high school students, the JCC Youth Theatre program and Summer Camp of the Arts and the St. Louis Science Center's Science Theatre Caravan.
