# **▶** BWorks Computer Camp: Earn-a-Computer Program

The St. Louis Byte Works Earn-a-Computer Program teaches youth that they can set goals – and reach them. Dream, challenge yourself and reach for more. Harvard/MIT curriculum includes:

- Introduction to computers; Computer setup and use
- Computer programming using MIT's Scratch software
- Networking basics; Internet safety
- Creating and delivering presentations using LibreOffice Impress

She has extensive experience organizing youth theater, having directed a Summer Shakespeare Boot Camp for high school students, the JCC Youth Theatre program and Summer Camp of the Arts and the St. Louis Science Center's Science Theatre Caravan.
