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Identifying and Understanding Hidden Dangers

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The Prosecuting Attorneys Association of Michigan (PAAM) Child Abuse Training Services program (CATS), in cooperation with the Prosecuting Attorneys Coordinating Council (PACC), and the Department of Human Services (DHS), is pleased to present a state-wide, cross-professional Specialized Child Abuse Training seminar on the topics of internet safety and understanding grooming behavior. This seminar will be held Wednesday, October 3, 2012. The seminar will begin with registration at 8:30 a.m. and conclude by 4:00 p.m.

The morning session on internet safety will provide the attendee with a broader knowledge of how information is gathered and distributed via the web. Attendees will be presented with the different types of grooming behavior, the types of suspects who utilize the techniques, how to obtain this information in the forensic interview, how to utilize the information during the investigation and prosecution, and why it is important to recognize the behavior.
