#### FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

Since becoming the Financial Secretary, I have noticed that a number of Brother Knights have allowed their membership status to lapse because of non-payment of their annual dues. This has become increasingly problematic, because the Council must pay a "per capita assessment" to the State and Supreme Council. In combination with the monthly Knight Life mailing and the quarterly dues notices that go unpaid, each delinquent member costs the Council approximately \$35 each year. This very topic was the subject of a significant dues increase while I served as your Grand Knight last year.

My analysis of this issue has resulted in one significant finding: The vast majority of our delinquent members are only First Degree members and appear to have joined to take advantage of EDW's facilities (e.g., the swimming pool or our summer camp) only to allow their membership to fall in arrears after their children are no longer of age to have interest in EDW's facilities. While I recognize that the Council has benefited from these "wet members" (those who join solely for the purpose of utilizing the pool) in the short term, we all should exercise care when proposing a candidate for membership to ensure that new members do not end up costing us significantly in the long run.

Moreover, we should all be aware that membership retention begins amongst those Brother Knights who sponsor new members. Considering all of the forgoing, I will begin publishing in the August issue of the Knight Life the names of those Knights who have fallen more than one year in arrears. I want everyone to know that my intent is NOT to embarrass anyone. In fact, I am advising the membership (including delinquents) of my intent well in advance of publishing the list. By publishing the names of Brother Knights who are delinquent, I hope that our members will recognize some of those names and help them get back into the fold. (There are other options...if you know someone who is in arrears, please call me to discuss them.)

I am saddened to announce the death of Brothers Ira Protz, John Amorosi and Edward Steigelman. Please keep them in your prayers.
