Grade Level Goals and Objectives:

Utah has adopted The Common Core which outlines standards of learning that are essential for all students at each elementary grade level. I will be covering the core using small and whole group instruction. The curriculum includes ideas, concepts, and skills to provide a foundation on which subsequent learning may be built. Instructional Materials and Practices:

<u>Math:</u> Emerson uses the <u>Houghton Mifflin</u> interactive math program called Expressions. This program will offer different ways to meet the needs of all students. Math homework will be sent home in the home folder when home practice is required. Concepts that are covered in 2^{nd} grade include

- \rightarrow solving addition and subtraction problems, including the use of models, within 1,000
- →calculating sums and differences mentally for numbers, with only 10s or only 100s; use mental strategies to add and subtract problems quickly
- \rightarrow know, from memory, all sums of two one-digit numbers (5+7=12, 4+9=13, etc); understand the value of each digit in a four-digit number.

<u>Reading:</u> Emerson uses the McGraw-Hill reading program, Wonders. Students will learn many comprehension, accuracy, fluency, and vocabulary strategies and skills to become a stronger reader. It is important to continue to instill a love of reading at home. Please read with your child every night. During school we use varied types of reading experiences including small groups, read aloud, shared reading, and poetry. Students will be challenged on their individual level.

<u>Writing:</u> Students will participate in various activities daily, across many content areas, in which to write. We will dive deeper into the writing process and structure. They will write stories that include a clear beginning, middle, and end. We will participate in shared research projects and produce a report.

Room 2 students may enter and exit the building through the front doors. If your student needs to meet a sibling or daycare provider after school, please plan accordingly and let the teacher know if there are any changes.

WEATHER, RECESS, AND CLOTHES

 \rightarrow Students may enter the building early when weather is severe. Students may wait in the cafeteria.

⇒Students will be outside every day except for extreme conditions. Please make sure your child is prepared DAILY (Sweatshirts do NOT suffice when it is snowing!). Students need to wear appropriate clothes and shoes to ensure safety and comfort while playing at recess. No flip flops.

ABSENCES

Behavior Plan:

Emerson has a positive behavior system in place that teaches students rules and procedures and uses positive praise and rewards for appropriate behavior. Students will learn how to be students in the classroom and receive positive praise for following rules. Students will be

warned and redirected when rules are not followed. Parents will be notified if a child's behavior becomes too disruptive for the class and a plan will be made with the parents, teacher, and student to improve behavior.

Grading Procedures: Clear standards and expectations are established for all students. To be on grade level, students are expected to be able to demonstrate knowledge for the information that has been taught with minimal assistance from the teacher. Second graders are formally assessed in reading and writing at the beginning and end of the year. The DRA is used to determine reading levels. The DIBELS is used to determine reading fluency. Formal math benchmarks are given at the beginning, middle, and end of the year. Ongoing, informal assessments occur continually to assist the teacher in planning/teaching for all of the students.
