
Sacred Heart School Summer Reading for Students Entering Third Grade 2012-13 School Year



Students entering third grade are expected to read at least **three books** over the summer which can be **either fiction or non-fiction**.

Expectations:

- □ Read *at least three fiction or non-fiction books* over the summer.
- □ Complete a Summer Reading Log listing all of the books you read over the summer.
- □ Complete at least one Graphic Organizer about one of the books you read.
- □ Summer Reading Log and Graphic Organizer are due by Friday, September 7, 2012.
- □ Students will have an opportunity to share their graphic organizer in class with their classmates.
- □ The attached rubric serves as a guideline for what is expected and indicates the points on which the grade is based.
- □ Summer reading will be reflected in the first marking period.

- □ We encourage you to use the King Co. Summer Reading Program Book List as a source for possible books. Not only is this great resource and a fun place to visit during the summer, but students can also earn prizes for reading!

- Talk about the book you read to your parents and friends


- Play a board game
