Class Content:

The art curriculum is designed to give students an experience that is challenging, culturally relevant, and FUN! We will explore art in its many dimensions through studio projects, historical inquiry, art criticism, and aesthetics. During the course students will work on skills such as creative problem solving and self-evaluation, while building a deeper understanding of art making techniques, visual culture, and The Elements of Art & The Principles of Design.

Make-up Work:

School and District policies are enforced and expected to be followed to ensure a positive learning experiencing for all students in the art room.
