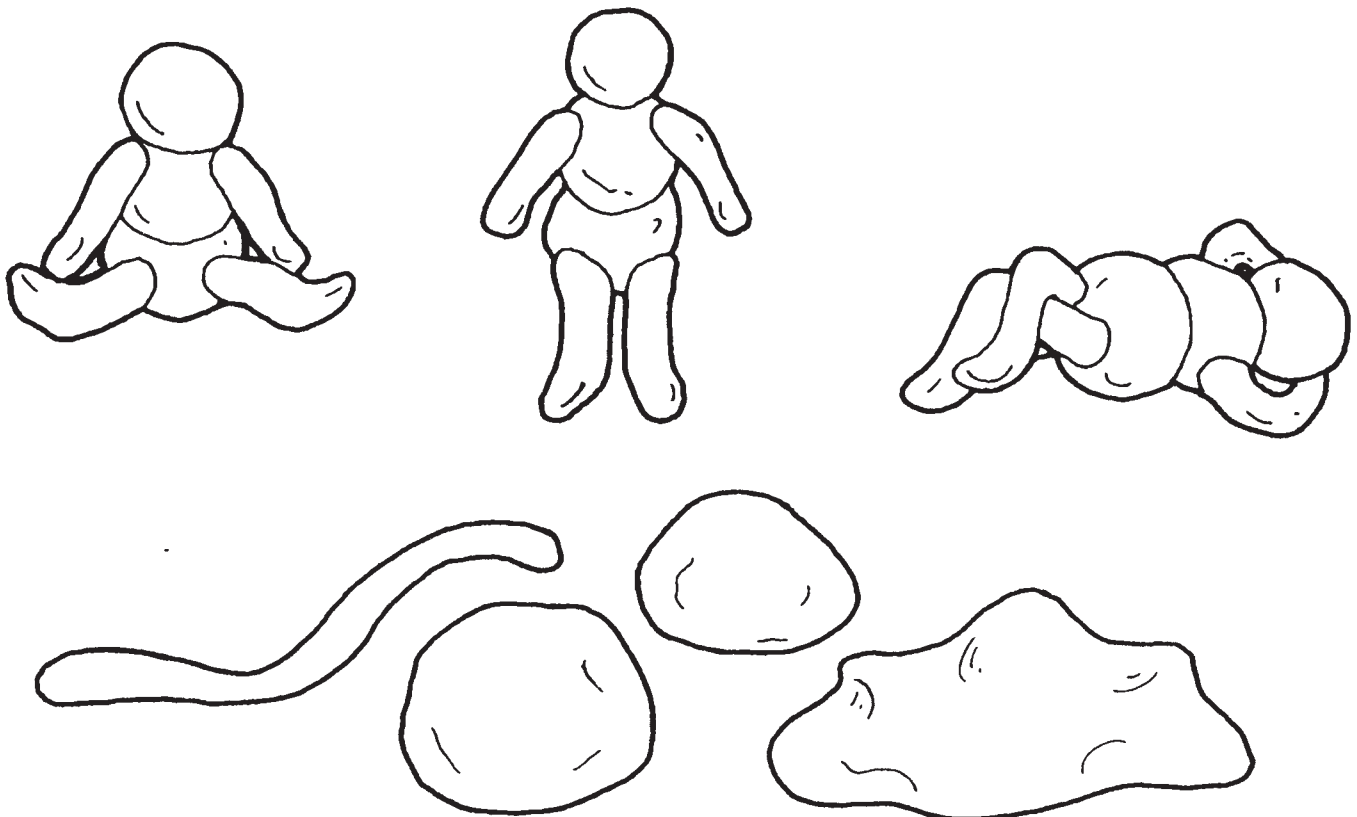
Clay Modeling Direction Sheet

What You Need

- modeling clay
- a small cup of water to wet your clay if it starts to get dry
- an old sharpened pencil to shape the face and clothes on your figure
- an old shirt to keep your clothes clean
- newspaper to cover your working space

What You Do

1. Decide what position you want your figure to be in. It can be sitting, standing, or even lying down.
2. Your figure will be made mostly of balls and rolls. Knead your clay into a big ball to get out air holes before beginning. Then look at the pictures below and make a figure you like.
3. Keep going until you are happy with your clay figure. Remember, if you don't like your work, just smash it and start over again.
4. After your figure is done, let it dry before painting it. Let the paint dry, and your clay figure is finished!

Buttons and Beads Wind Chimes

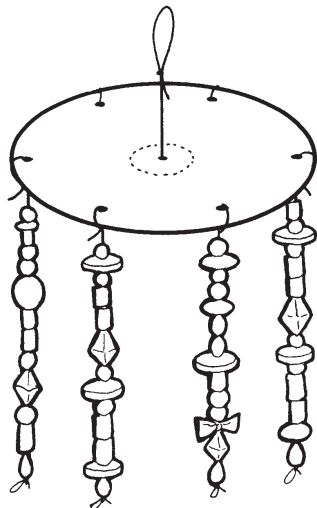
Purpose: to make wind chimes using old buttons and beads

Materials

- assorted miscellaneous buttons and/or beads *
- string or dental floss *
- small round pre-punched paper or plastic plate *
- direction sheet*

Procedure

1. Using the buttons and beads supplied in the art bag together with any you may have around the house, help your child to plan an attractive arrangement of colors and sizes for six strands of varying lengths.
2. Next, have your child string the buttons and/or beads and fasten them to the paper plate. Use a large button to secure a piece of string to the center of the plate for hanging. (See directions).
3. Send the completed wind chimes to school for sharing along with the other side of this form by the date due.
