Pass-It-On Program

Project C.A.R.

Provides safe transportation for elderly riders going to specific sponsor activities such as church, some volunteer activities, etc. Sponsoring churches are First Congregational, First Lutheran, Our Savior's Lutheran, St. John American Lutheran, St. Mark's Lutheran, and Asbury United Methodist.

Bus Stop: 120 E. 11th Street Public transportation serving Sioux Falls. Transit service is available on most routes from 5:45am - 8:45pmpm, Monday -Friday and from 7:45am to 6:45pm, Saturday. Daily, weekly, and monthly passes are available. Fares: \$1.50 Single Ride, \$.75 for children ages 6 – 10, seniors and disabled individuals may apply for eligibility cards for half price fare, and veterans ride for free with identification. Paratransit - SAM

Curb-to-curb transportation for individuals who are unable to use the fixed-route system because of a disability. Service is provided within a defined Paratransit service area.
