

Adding a Codicil to your Will

If you have an existing will, you may convey your charitable gift by simply adding a codicil, or addendum, to the document. This should include the following:

Second: Except as herein modified, I hereby confirm my said Last Will and Testament.

The foregoing instrument was the day of, 20 Signed by the above testator, in our presence; and said testator thereupon in our presence declared the same to be a Codicil to his Last Will and Testament, and requested each of us to sign the same as attesting witnesses; and we thereupon having first read this certificate, sign our names hereto as such witnesses, in the presence of the testator, and each in the presence of the other.
