Next meeting Thursday, February 2, 2012 @ 7:00pm.



Annual Sandhill Crane Count

The date for the Annual Sandhill Crane Count is **April 13 & 14**. How to Run a Safe Temporary Food Event

Wednesday, March 14, 2012 • 2-4 pm or 6-8 pm Green Lake Co. Government Center, Training Room

If you are a special organization (defined by WI Stats as: church, religious, fraternal, youth or patriotic organization or a service club or other civic organization), you are required to attend the class to obtain a license to serve food.

Training is FREE and will include the following topics: Impacts of foodborne illness on the public and your organization, licensing changes, proper food temperature controls, food handling, storage procedures, proper food booth construction/layout and proper utensil washing & sanitizing.

Keeping food safe and sanitary in a temporary food stand can be a real challenge due to its unique conditions. By attending our class, you will learn and reinforce the guidelines that will help you serve safe food and help prevent a foodborne illness.


2012 Wisconsin State Fair Livestock Exhibitors


