Teacher In-Service Training Opportunity



Project WET (Water Education for Teachers) is a standards-based, water conservation education curriculum (suitable for all ages) funded in part by an EPA water quality initiative. Acadiana educators have the opportunity to attend a workshop on this exciting, experiential-based curriculum at Longfellow-Evangeline State Historic Site on Wednesday February 10, 2016 from 9am – 3pm.

Workshop attendees are instructed on the use of the Project WET Curriculum and Activity Guide which contains over 60 water-related activities. Upon completion of the six hour workshop, participants receive a copy of the Guide and a certificate of workshop completion.

Project WET is designed for all educators. Because the materials and activities of Project WET are coded for language arts, math, science, music, art, geography, and other subject areas, WET easily fits into a schools' existing curriculum.

Project WET is sponsored by the La. Dept. of Agriculture & Forestry / Office of Soil & Water Conservation, the La. Association of Conservation Districts, and the St. Martin Soil & Water Conservation District.
