Garden Place of Millstadt "Senior Care Conversations"

Question: What is assisted living, and how do I know if my parent needs it?

Answer: Assisted Living is a licensed level of care in the state of Illinois with oversight by the Department of Public Health. Assisted living provides services based on "activities of daily living" that an individual needs help with— things such as dressing, using the bathroom, taking medication, bathing, making meals, etc. Health services may include medication reminders, bathing assistance, dressing help and hygiene reminders.

Socialization is a key aspect of any assisted living community— the peace of mind that a lively conversation with a friend is just steps away. Many people will state, "Mom is just not ready for assisted living yet." However, think about the amount of time she spends alone. Loneliness can lead to depression, poor eating, lack of proper hygiene, and a decrease in overall quality of life. The health care aspect of services is important, but not nearly as much as the socialization.

Most assisted living communities offer an array of services:

 Activities— from crafts to discussion groups to social outings

- Most also offer private apartments with the ability to decorate
- Meals are typically provided, although the quality, method of delivery and quantity can significantly vary
- Transportation to local physician visits may also be offered
- Light housekeeping, laundry & basic maintenance should be offered
- A system for the resident to alert staff to a need for assistance
- Most long-term care insurances will cover services offered by a licensed assisted living
- All assisted livings are required to offer 24 hour awake staffing

Assisted living is NOT:

- A nursing home. While some assisted livings are licensed for a higher level of care— for example, assistance for those with dementia or memory loss— most assisted living communities do not offer 24/7 nursing care.
- Paid for by Medicare or Medicaid.





The club's present name was adopted in March 1943, the same year it became part of the General Federation.

The club also gives out two scholarships yearly to a high school student and a returning adult student age 25 or older. These scholarships are funded completely by the club's annual High Tea fundraising event, taking place this year on January 26.
