Crestwood Elementary School Library Media Center

Your child will be bringing home library books weekly from the school's LMC, Library Media Center. We have a large number of books and other resources that are part of our shared collection.

Here are some things that you can do with your child to help them really enjoy the library experience.

- 1. Read to your child daily and encourage them to read to you as well. Talk about what you are reading together.
- 2. Make a special place for library books, so they can always be found and returned weekly to school. (Some examples may be: your child's book bag or backpack, on a shelf near your child's bed, a special place on a bookshelf or end table.)
- 3. Teach your child to handle library books with great care. Try to keep library books from younger siblings who may be too young to handle a book properly. Also keep books away from pets that may chew on them.
- 4. Find out what day is your child's scheduled library day. Then you can look forward to new reading material on that day. Also you can help your child return their books <u>weekly</u>.



After your child gets into the routine of borrowing and returning library books, then we increase the number of books checked out from one to two books and more, depending on the student's grade level. Students will not be allowed to check out additional books if they have not returned their books.

Playground Update!

Thank you for all your feedback on the upcoming updates to Crestwood's playground. We will know within the next week which design the students have chosen. How exciting! We are hoping to have the new playground open for the 2017-18 school year.

Many parents have expressed an interest in nature play spaces to be added to the Crestwood Woods and we want that too! We have prioritized completing the new playground first and then we will work to add the natural play elements to the forest.

The cost of the playground is going to be roughly \$40K-\$50K based on the chosen design and how much of the work can get done through volunteers and donated materials, but the good news is we already have \$10K raised and dedicated to the project.

We plan to raise money for the playground in a variety of ways. There will be an Election Day bake sale, as well as letters to the community asking for donations and gifts to support the project. Stay tuned for volunteering and fundraising opportunities, including:

- Volunteer to be the project manager
- Volunteer to help install the playground
- Help with fundraisers (organize, donate time to staff a table)
- Bake items for the November 8 bake sale this should be a big one since \$1,000 was raised on primary election day!
- Volunteer for a few hours on November 11, 12 or 13th at the Madison Marathon. For every hour volunteered, a donation of \$9 is made to Crestwood's playground project. Anyone can volunteer and there is a job to fit everyone's interest. News from Outdoor Ed!

Crestwood has a thriving outdoor education program. It is well-documented that children benefit greatly from spending time outside in natural spaces and gardens; studies show improvement in behavior, decreased anxiety, higher standardized test scores, and lower rates of obesity-related illnesses among children who spend a significant amount of time outside. We have many different outdoor learning spaces, and we are proud to provide a variety of opportunities for students in the gardens, woods, orchard, and conservation parks near the school. If you have visited Crestwood this fall, you may have noticed rows of apple trees in our orchard, a large patch of flowers in our butterfly garden, our beautiful woods behind the school, and vegetable gardens all around the building. These spaces are an integral part of the outdoor education program, and our whole school community takes care of them! With the help and support of staff and parent and community volunteers, students plant and harvest vegetables in the gardens, pull invasive weeds and plant native flowers in the woods, and help prune apple trees and plant pollinator-friendly flowers and herbs around the orchard.

What's new with Outdoor Education at Crestwood? Last spring, we were extremely fortunate to raise enough money through grants from generous donors* to hire a Gardener-in-Residence through Community Groundworks to coordinate and lead the garden activities. Our GiR is Krysta Post. She joined us in April and will continue through the end of October when the growing season wraps up. We're also happy to announce that we have nearly secured funding to continue the GiR program for the 2017 growing season!

Every Monday this fall, students have been pairing up with their buddy classes and going outside with either Krysta Post for garden activities, or art teacher Mr. Bassuener to work on a special documentary project about the school woods. Spending time outside every Monday is part of a school wide initiative to integrate outdoor programming into the mainstream curriculum.


