Children's Book Week encourages children to enjoy new authors and books, and is celebrated in schools, libraries, homes, and bookstores during a selected week each May. During this event, celebrate children's literature with storytelling, parties, author and illustrator appearances, and other literacy events in your school and community. As part of the celebration, children are invited to help select the top children's book of the year by voting online or at their school or library.

Each year, schools and libraries from coast to coast celebrate books and reading during Children's Book Week. Below are a list of classroom ideas.

- Organize a visit from a local author or illustrator. Contact the publisher of his or her most recent work to find out if a visit can be arranged.
- Stage a [Read-In](#).

- Hold a contest asking students to submit 75-word reviews of their favorite books. Post the reviews in the library, on the class website, or in the school paper.
- Show and Read: Ask students to select an illustrated book from the library to read in class during Children's Book Week.


