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# **Gear Up for College Entrance Exams**

Juniors who want to go to a four-year college will need to take a college entrance exam. Whether you're taking the SAT or ACT, it takes planning and preparing to do it right. Please note the redesigned SAT is being administered. Find the latest news for 2016 at www.collegeboard.org.

#### **The Best Testing Schedule**

There is no one test plan or schedule that is best for everyone. It depends on your schedule, your ability to prep, the classes you're taking, and many other factors. But since we are always pressed for an answer, we will tell you one schedule that works well for many students. Consider taking the SAT test in May and June of your junior year. You may need to reserve May for AP tests and SAT Subject tests in the same subjects (if required). AP (Advanced Placement) World History students will register for the June SAT Subject Test date, and take the May SAT. If you are taking the ACT, consider the June test. The advantage of this plan is that you have a place to start from and can spend the summer prepping for your fall test(s). This allows you to use the fall of senior year for getting your applications in early. If you are applying to schools with very early deadlines, such as November 1<sup>st</sup>, you will need to register to take the SAT in October or the ACT in September. If you are still not satisfied with your scores, you may still have the opportunity to take your test one more time in November and/or December. We don't recommend taking the SAT or ACT more than three times, but the testing strategy is obviously your decision.

## **Prepping and Registering for the Tests**

The sad reality is that prepping for the SAT, ACT, and SAT Subject tests has become the rule, not the exception. You must face the fact that students competing with you are probably prepping for these tests in some way. Our advice is to prep for the test one way or another, buy the best method you can

afford. At least purchase a book of real practice SATs and take them at home. Time yourself. You have resources available to you through Study Island at school, and you should take advantage. For the SAT, College Board has hired Khan Academy to develop a FREE, personalized, online SAT preparation course: <a href="https://www.khanacademy.org/sat">www.khanacademy.org/sat</a>

#### The SAT Test

This test has been redesigned to reflect the real work of school and career. Along with your high school record of courses and GPA, the SAT scores will help colleges

predict academic success in college. The SAT is typically taken by high school juniors and seniors. The fee is \$54.50 for the plus writing and \$43 for the assessment only as of this printing.

The Evidence-Based Reading and Writing Section and Mathematics Section of the SAT are scored on a scale of 200 - 800, with three essay sub-scores for reading, analysis and writing with scores from 2 to 8. It is administered seven times a year in the U.S., Puerto Rico, and U.S. Territories, and six times a year overseas. Here are some **highlights of the SAT Test:** 

#### **Evidence-Based Reading and Writing**

Reading Test: 65 minutes, 52 questions (all multiple choice)

\*4 single and 1 pair of reading passages; some will contain graphics (tables, charts, etc.)

\*3 content areas (subject knowledge not tested): literature, history/social studies; science

Writing and Language Test: 35 minutes, 44 questions (all multiple choice);

1 or more graphics in 1 or more sets of questions

\*4 reading passages of 3 types: argument, informative/explanatory, nonfiction narrative

\*4 content areas (subject knowledge not tested): careers; history/social studies; humanities; science

Total Time: 100 minutes Score: 200-800

#### **Mathematics**

Calculator Section: 55 minutes, 38 questions (30 multiple choice, 8 grid-in)

\*4 content areas: Heart of Algebra, Problem Solving and Data Analysis, Passport to Advanced Math, Additional

topics in Math

No Calculator 25 minutes, 20 questions (15 multiple choice, 5 grid-in)

## **Essay (Optional)**

Based on the text of an argument written for a broad audience, you will be asked to consider how the author uses:

- \*Evidence, such as facts or examples, to support claims
- \*reasoning to develop ideas and to connect claims and evidence
- \*stylistic/persuasive elements (word choice, tone, etc.) to add power to the ideas expressed

Time: 50 minutes Score: 2 to 8 on each of three categories: reading, analysis, and writing

Be sure to get plenty of sleep the night before and bring snacks and water. Concentrate on staying focused and watch your pacing. Use #2 pencils only. No mechanical pencils or ink pens allowed.

#### The SAT Subject Tests: \$24.50 per registration (add \$13 for additional) 3 allowed per date

These are the 20 subject tests that measure knowledge or skills in a particular subject. Each test is one hour, and many subjects are offered. Not all colleges require the SAT Subject Tests, and some don't even consider the scores. Those that do will generally want two or three in different subject areas and will probably weight them equally to the SAT Test. So once again, research pays. Find out what your prospective colleges require or recommend, and watch for changes. Take the SAT Subject Tests whenever you peak in that particular subject. For instance, if you've taken AP Biology, take the Biology test that May or June.

#### The ACT Test

The ACT® test contains four multiple-choice tests: English, mathematics, reading, and science. The ACT with writing includes the four multiple-choice tests and a writing test.

#### **Test and Content**

English	75	45	Measures standard written English and
	questions	minutes	rhetorical skills.

Mathematics	60 questions	60 minutes	Measures mathematical skills students have typically acquired in courses taken up to the beginning of grade 12.
Reading	40 questions	35 minutes	Measures reading comprehension.
Science	40 questions	35 minutes	Measures the interpretation, analysis, evaluation, reasoning, and problem-solving skills required in the natural sciences.
Optional Writing Test	1 prompt	40 minutes	Measures writing skills emphasized in high school English classes and in entry-level college composition courses.

ACT has an optional 30-minute Writing Test as a component to the ACT Assessment. Prompts used for the ACT Writing Test describe an issue relevant to high school students and ask students to write about their perspective on the issue. As a starting place, two different perspectives on the issue are provided. Examinees may choose to support one of these perspectives or to develop a response based on their own perspective. They will need to clearly state their position and provide reasons and examples. The ACT Writing Test will be required by some colleges and costs \$56.50. Some institutions only want the assessment portion, ACT No Writing at \$39.50. Please check with your prospective colleges.

You will actually receive 12 separate scores on the ACT: 1 composite, 4 subject scores, and sub-scores. However, the composite – or scaled – score is the most important. It ranges from 1-36. Nearly half of those who take it fall in the 17-23 range.

The ACT test has traditionally been more content-based than the SAT. The ACT more closely reflects core curriculum taught in high school classes, although the SAT is now doing more of the same. Some other significant differences are that the ACT has a science reasoning section while the SAT does not. ACT provides a comprehensive 80-page prep booklet free of charge at

#### **Sending Your Test Scores**

Always check the score reporting requirements for each college, as it can vary. Most colleges want scores sent directly from the testing agency not from your high school transcript. The NCAA Eligibility Center requires scores to be sent directly from testing agencies. Keep track of what you have sent to which school(s), and be sure you have sent scores to all schools you are applying to (unless not required). Also, if you are applying for early decision or early action, be mindful of the early deadlines.

#### **SAT and Score Choice**

Four score reports are free with your SAT registration. These reports encourage immediate and early reporting, even before results are seen. There is a \$15 fee for additional reports. Score reports contain all SAT and Subject Test scores taken up to the request date UNLESS you choose a single score choice. (That is, a score from a single SAT test date or an individual Subject Test score.) Visit these links for more information about "Score Choice" and sending your scores:

Colleges will still use their own method to evaluate SAT scores sent. Some colleges take your best single sitting; others take your best from each test section. None average them. For SAT Subject Tests, colleges generally use your highest scores from each test.

#### **ACT**

Four score reports are free with your registration. With ACT, you have always been able to choose which scores to send. ACT will send only the score from a single requested test date. The cost is \$11 per report per college as of this printing. There is a rush option that will cost more.
