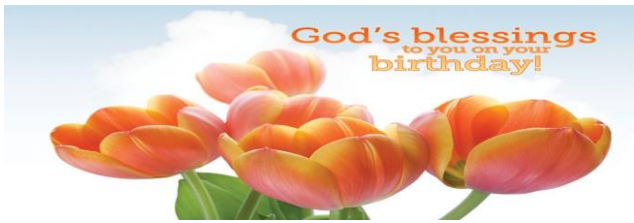

News from the Central Atlantic Conference

After serving our association since 2012, Rev. Marie Bacchiocchi will become interim Conference Minister for the Southeast Conference. Although she is sad to leave this area, she is pleased for this new opportunity as it fits with her long-term call.

In the next few months, leaders from our association will meet with the interim Conference Minister, Denise Mason Bullitt to discuss the needs of churches in our association as plans are formulated for conference support for our association.

Rev. Bullitt started her ministry in the Central Atlantic Conference and has family in Heritage UCC in Baltimore. She attended Lancaster Seminary and holds her Masters of Divinity from Howard University. For the last 16 years, Rev. Bullitt has served as lead pastor of the Community of Reconciliation Church in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

In addition to her parish work, she has served on the National Staff of the UCC, as the Minister for Church Life and Leadership. Rev. Bullitt is committed to interfaith and justice work, serving on Interfaith Councils for Chatham College, University of Pittsburgh and Carnegie Mellon University. She has also served as Adjunct Faculty for Religious Studies at The Neighborhood Academy, a private high school in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Rev. Bullitt began her work with the conference on January 24. She has been part of the "moving opportunity" of the CAC staff as they relocated from their offices on Rolling Road to the building next door. The staff seems very pleased with the move.

In addition to welcoming Denise, saying goodbye (for now) to Marie, moving their offices, and developing new working relationships, the CAC staff has their hands full with the details of the upcoming Synod gathering Baltimore this summer. Please keep them in prayer during this time of transition and challenge.

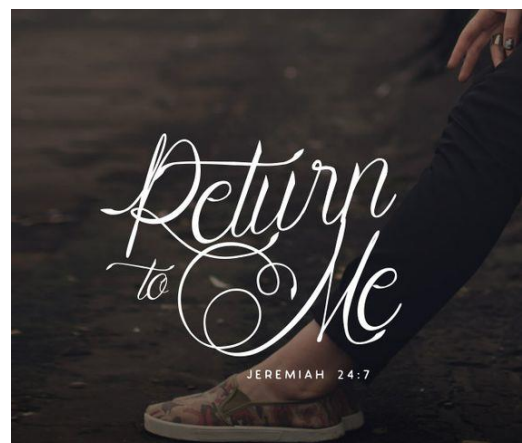
2017 Annual Congregational Meeting

The 2017 Annual Congregational Meeting was held on January 29 after church service. Each attendee was provided with a printed copy the 2016 Annual Report. Pastor Suzanne and each committee chairperson reviewed their 2016 accomplishments.

The following topics were then discussed in New Business:

- The Sanctuary ceiling is bowing in some areas due to some cracking and splitting of trusses in the ceiling / roof structure. Major restoration repairs will be needed and will cost more than \$100,000 and will not allow the Sanctuary use for several months. The target date to start this restoration work would be right after Easter Sunday. A loan from Cornerstone will probably be needed to pay for the repairs and then hopefully we will get some grant money and begin fundraising efforts to repay the loan.
- Trinity's VBS Program was discussed and determined that someone will need to take over the Leadership for 2017. It was also decided that a VBS meeting needs to be held to decide how VBS will be handled this year if the Sanctuary isn't available for use.
- It was discussed that an effort will be made to eliminate more items in the weekly bulletin if they are projected on the screen.
- The 2017 Lenten Services were discussed. These services will begin on Ash Wednesday and will alternate each Wednesday between Trinity and Immanuel Lutheran.

The meeting concluded at 2:00 P.M.



Consistory Meeting Highlights for February

The monthly meeting of the Consistory was held on February 01, 2017

TREASURER'S REPORT

- Sue Myers, treasurer, presented and explained two reports, Assets and Liabilities and Income and Expenses.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Suzanne reported that this past month that:

- The worship committee is preparing for Lent and Easter
- A Lenten guide will be used in the Bible studies being offered during the Lenten season.
- Immanuel Lutheran and Trinity UCC will share a meal, study and worship on Wednesdays during Lent. Participants may choose to attend at 12 noon or 6:00 p.m.

PROPERTY

Robert provided the following update from the Property Committee:

- Waiting on the delivery and installation of the handicap accessible door for the front entry.
- Lights outside of the door will need to be installed by an electrician when the door is installed.
- Structural engineers, Skarda and Associates, from Baltimore have sent a proposal to inspect the ceiling. A second company, TAI from Owings has been on site and Robert is awaiting their estimate.
- Attendees then reviewed a proposal from Diverse Management and Planning, LLP (DMP) for grant writing services.
- The boiler has been off three times and some of the water pipes froze.

FINANCE

- Chairperson, Sue Myers, had nothing to report for this meeting.

PERSONNEL

- Chairperson, Deb Seal, had nothing to report for this meeting.

EVANGELISM

Chairperson, Marge Bailey stated that:

- Approximately 40 persons attended the congregational luncheon held in conjunction with the Annual Meeting on January 29, 2017
- Plans are in progress for the Shrove Tuesday pancake and sausage dinner on February 28, 2017 from 5:00-7:00 p.m.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

- Chairperson, Michelle Wolfgang-Fantone, announced that Candace Brown has stepped forward and volunteered to lead VBS (Vacation Bible School) this year. The first VBS planning meeting is scheduled for February 19, 2017.
- Michelle reminded this group that a bowling party is scheduled for February 12, 2017.

WORSHIP

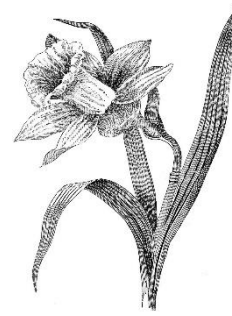


Inclement Weather Policy
