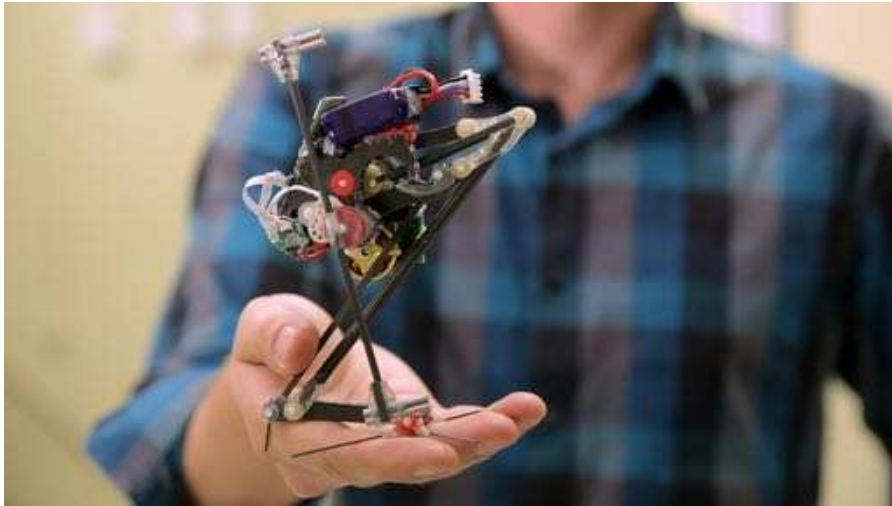

**STUDENT COUNCIL**

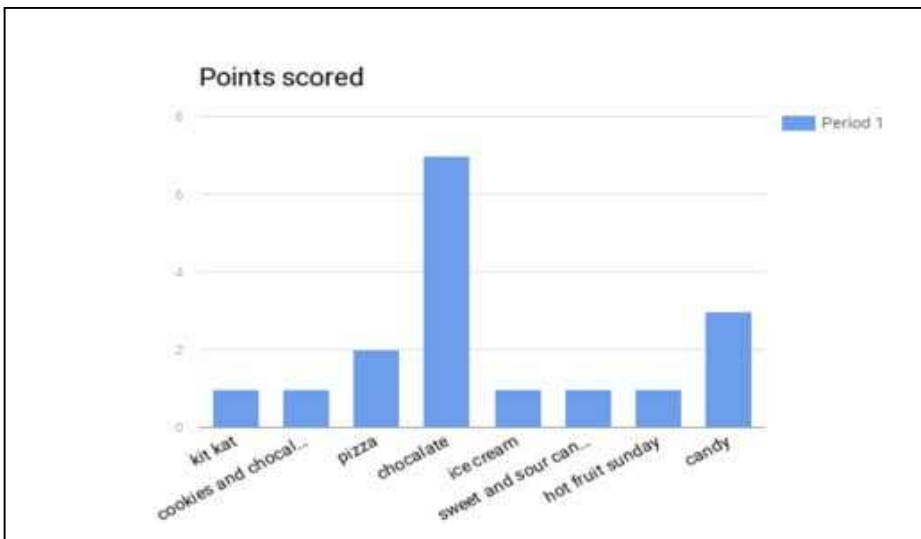

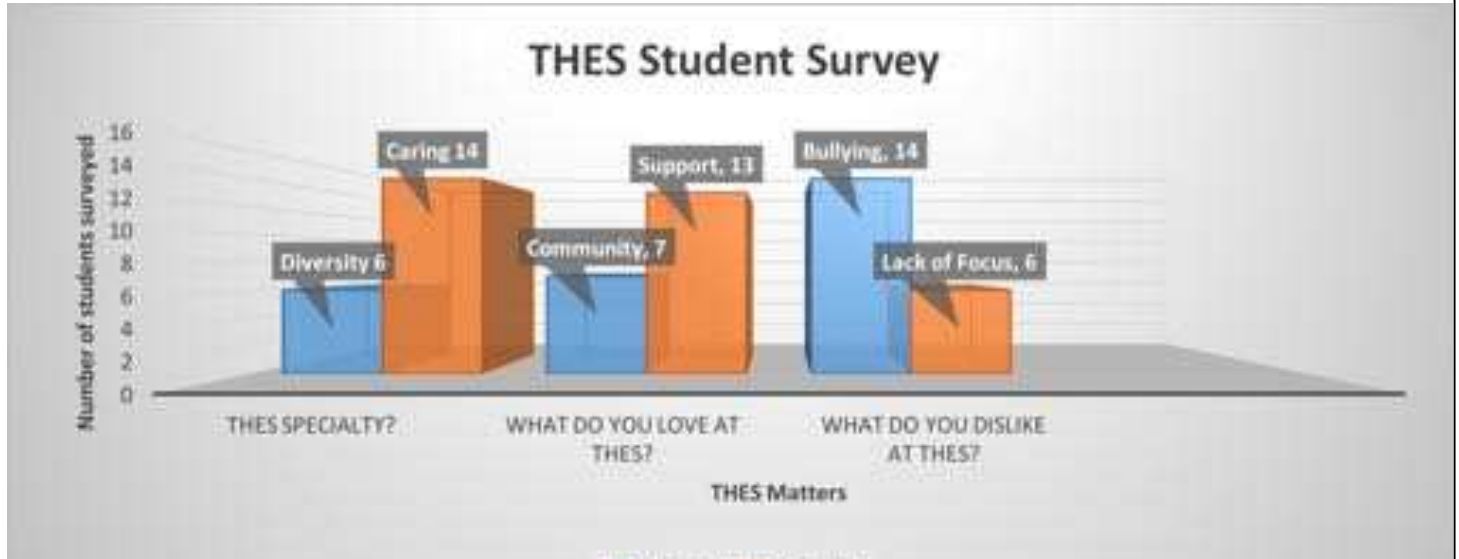

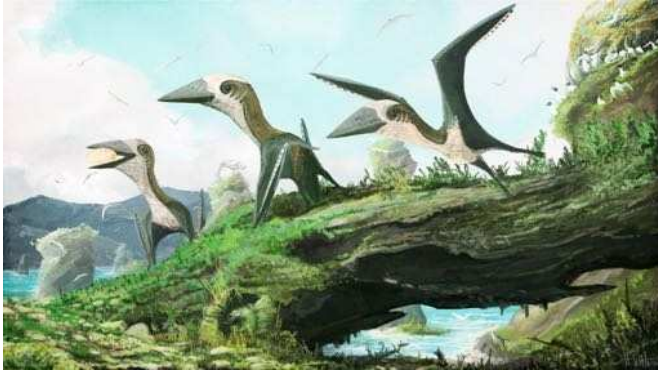

## NEW PTEROSAUR

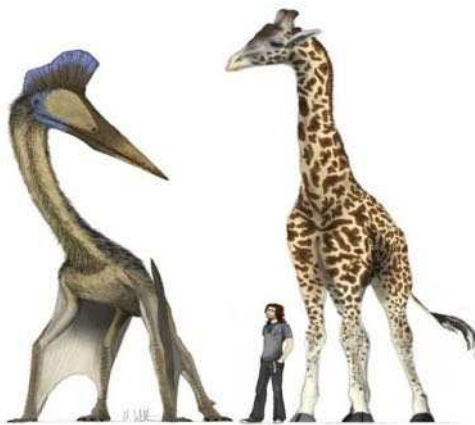

## Tasty Food?

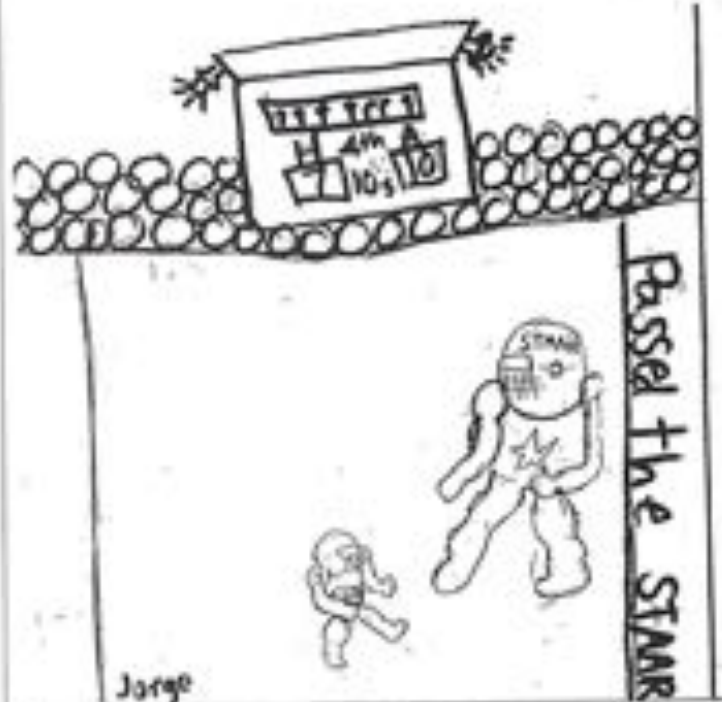
