ADMISSION INFORMATION

Fontbonne University accepts applications for admission to degree programs for the fall and spring semesters. Admission to the University is based upon evaluation of the individual's ability to succeed in, benefit from, and achieve his/her educational goals through the academic programs at Fontbonne.

In reviewing student credentials, the University looks for evidence of successful completion of prior academic work, self-motivation, and academic aptitude. Accepted students are admitted to the University; admission to the department of the student's intended major is determined by the department.

The University operates on rolling admission and will notify an applicant of his/her admission as soon as possible after receipt of all required credentials. All credentials must be on file no later than one week prior to final registration for any term in which enrollment is desired.

Prior to registration for classes, degree-seeking students may be required to take the Fontbonne University placement test. The Admission Office will determine which students are required to take all or part of the placement test. The test results are used for evaluation, placement, and academic advising. Monday, December 12, 2011 is the deadline for admission as a classified (degree-seeking) student for the Spring 2012 semester.

APPLICATION FEE

An application fee of \$25 must accompany each initial application for admission to the university. The fee is the same for special and regular students and for full-time and part-time students, as well as for admission to the summer session. FINAL REGISTRATION

Thursday, January 12, 2012 from 4-5:30 p.m. for all students who have not previously registered. Anyone registering after final registration will pay a late fee of \$25.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Students should:

1. Pick up registration materials at the Registrar's Office, Ryan 205.
2. Meet with their departmental advisor to complete course request forms. *(If you are undecided as to a major, a staff advisor will be assigned.)*
3. Complete any independent study forms or obtain any prior authorizations.
4. Returning students enter their schedules online. Advisors enter the new student's schedule online.
5. All students' white registration form must be returned to the Registrar's Office, Ryan 205.

CHANGES AND WITHDRAWAL DEADLINES

To change registration, including withdrawal from a course, the student must:

1. Obtain the appropriate form from the Registrar's Office.
2. Give the supporting reason for the change or withdrawal.
3. Obtain approval and signature from the advisor before the end of the first week of the semester. After the first week of the semester, the student must obtain the signatures of the advisor, the Business Office and the Financial Aid Office. Students may not add a course after the first week of the semester.
4. Return the form to the Registrar's Office before the deadline.

After the first week of the semester has been completed, no further changes may be made with the exception of withdrawals and 2nd 8-week course additions. A student who, with proper authorization, withdraws from a course before a date specified in the University calendar (usually one week after midterm) receives a grade of "W." No withdrawals will be accepted after the date specified in the calendar. Exception to this policy, for reasons beyond the student's control, may be made by an Academic Dean for an individual course or for the semester. Students who withdraw without authorization receive a final grade of "F."

FAILURE TO ATTEND CLASSES DOES NOT CONSTITUTE A WITHDRAWAL

For 1st 8-week courses, the last day to withdraw is:

UNIVERSITY EXPENSES

TUITION (2011-2012)

Full-time undergraduate tuition:

A full-time undergraduate student takes 12-18 credit hours per semester. Full-time students taking any hours in excess of 18 per semester will pay the undergraduate part-time rate for additional hours (\$558 per hour).

TUITION DISCOUNTS

ALUMNI TUITION DISCOUNTS

Students who have earned a degree from Fontbonne University may apply for an alumni discount on tuition rates. Please see below for your program eligibility.

Fontbonne undergraduate alumni who enroll in an undergraduate course(s) may apply for a 35% discount on undergraduate level course(s). These reduced rates apply to fall and spring semesters only for traditional students.

Alumni who have received a Master's degree from Fontbonne can enroll in a graduate course(s) and be eligible for a 35% discount on graduate level course(s).

PERSONS 60 AND OLDER

Persons 60 years of age and older are eligible for half price tuition rates for undergraduate courses excluding lab and studio courses.

EDUCATOR'S DISCOUNT

Students who are taking graduate courses at Fontbonne University and who are employed at least half-time in a preschool through twelfth grade school or school system may apply for a 15 percent discount. Students need to obtain the educator's discount form from the appropriate program director.

***NOTE:** Only one discount will be applied per course. If a student is eligible for more than one discount on the same course, the larger discount will be applied.

PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS

Accounts are due in advance for the spring semester. Payment-in-full less any financial assistance must be received by December 5, 2011. A \$25.00 late fee will be assessed for payments received after December 5, 2011. For students who are registering after December 5, 2011 payment is due upon registration.

Fontbonne University offers the convenience of Electronic Billing (E-Bill) and payments online. You may enroll to receive your monthly statements electronically and pay online. An email notice will be sent to your Fontbonne e-mail address whenever a statement is generated for your account. You may also provide your parents or other payers with your personal log-on so they can have access to the bill and make payment. Visit our website at www.fontbonne.edu and click on Student Information Management. Fontbonne University accepts MasterCard, Visa and DISCOVER.

Fontbonne University has contracted with Tuition Pay to provide a payment plan that will allow monthly payments without interest charges. You can enroll online at www.fontbonne.edu or www.tuitionpayenroll.com.

Employed students should check with their companies to see if tuition reimbursement is available.

Failure to make payments for tuition, fees, or other amounts owed the University when due, or failure to arrange for such payments before their due dates, is considered sufficient cause to 1. bar the student from registering for courses, 2. drop the student from pre-registered courses, with subsequent registration subject to late fees, and/or 3. withhold the transcript of record, certificate, or diploma.

REFUNDS

No adjustment or refund is made for late entrance, for absence after entrance, or for dismissal.

Tuition and fee adjustments resulting from withdrawal from the University or withdrawal from a specific course will be computed from the date on which the Registrar approves the official permit for withdrawal.

Tuition adjustments will be made according to the following scale:

- Withdrawal before first day of classes100%
- Withdrawal during first drop/add period.....100%
- Withdrawal within first 10% of the semester 90%
- Withdrawal within 11-25% of the semester..... 50%
- Withdrawal within first 26-50% of the semester 25%
- No refund after 51% of the semester.....0%

Fee adjustments will be made according to the following scale:

- Withdrawal before the first day of classes100%
- Withdrawal during the first drop/add period100%
- No refund after the first drop/add period.....0%

If withdrawal from classes results from extraordinary circumstances beyond the student's control (such as serious illness) the student should complete an Extenuating Circumstance Withdrawal. To begin the process, an application can be attained in the Office of the Dean of Undergraduate Studies or in the Office of the Director of Graduate Studies.

A \$25 residential life processing fee will be charged on all withdrawals after the first day of classes.

Fontbonne University's refund process provides you with quick access to your funds with direct deposit into your personal checking or savings account. Access to your money is quick and convenient. Go to www.fontbonne.edu/refund and follow the simple enrollment steps.

NOTICE:

Students receiving Financial Aid/Federal Title IV Financial Aid

Students must officially withdraw from Fontbonne University. The withdrawal forms are located in the Office of the Director of Academic Advising and must be signed by the following departments: Director of Academic Advising, Financial Aid Office, Business Office, and Registrar's Office.

Upon receiving official notification of withdrawal the Financial Aid Office will calculate a refund using the Return of Title IV Funds software, if the student has received Title IV aid. Those who receive cash refunds before withdrawing must repay all excess funds to Fontbonne University. Failure to repay funds when requested would bar you from receipt of financial aid in the future. Students will receive written notification of the adjustments to the financial aid package, which will indicate if a post-withdrawal disbursement is allowed. Students receiving Institutional grant or scholarship dollars will receive a refund based on the Tuition adjustment schedule. The Business Office should be contacted if any questions arise about billing.

Finally, please note withdrawal from a specific course(s) may result in an adjustment in the financial aid package. Also, failure to properly withdraw from the University will result in the adjustment of financial aid after the end of the semester. Therefore, please contact us immediately upon leaving the University.

Room & Board Refunds:

Withdrawal from a residence hall will be prorated on the same basis as tuition and fees. The room deposit will be refunded subject to any outstanding financial obligation to the University.

STUDENT SERVICES

CAMPUS HOUSING:

Campus housing is available on a limited basis to enrolled Fontbonne students. Inquiries should be made to the Office of Residential Life at (314) 889-1422.

I.D. CARDS:

The Student Affairs Office in Medaille Hall issues picture I.D.s during regular office hours, 8:00-4:30, Monday through Friday. OPTIONS students may have their I.D.s made at the Strassner site. Students must present proof of semester registration and a receipt for paid fees. There is no charge for the first I.D. card. If the card is lost or damaged, a replacement card can be purchased for \$10. The I.D. card identifies the holder as a Fontbonne student and is issued for campus security, library borrowing privileges, use of facilities in the Dunham Student Activity Center, using Griffin Bucks, and for cashing checks in the Business Office on the main campus. It may be used throughout the city for discounts to selected movies, sporting events, plays, museums and cultural events. For additional information, call (314) 889-1411.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT:

The Career Development Department provides assistance with career planning and decision-making, selecting academic majors, and learning job search techniques. Job and internship openings are posted on the Career Services website. The department is located in the Student Affairs Office on the first floor of Medaille Hall. Appointments may be scheduled in person or by telephone (314) 889-4516.

COUNSELING AND WELLNESS:

The Counseling and Wellness Department provides short-term professional counseling on-campus to deal with a variety of personal concerns. The department can also make referrals for off-campus counseling. The department is located in the Student Affairs Office on the first floor of Medaille Hall. Appointments may be scheduled in person or by telephone (314) 889-4516.

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES:

Fontbonne University offers accommodations to students with documented physical, visual, hearing, learning or psychiatric disabilities. Any Fontbonne student is eligible for special services or accommodations if:

1. The student self-identifies that he or she has a disability and needs accommodation.
2. The student provides appropriate and verifiable documentation of the disability.
3. The student provides notification to the ADA Coordinator in a timely fashion.

TEXTBOOKS:

New and used textbooks may be purchased in the Fontbonne bookstore.

CAMPUS SECURITY REPORT:

A copy of Fontbonne's Campus Security Report is made available by October 1st of each year. FAMILY EDUCATION RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT POLICY (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), also known as the Buckley Amendment, is a federal regulation that protects the privacy of student education records. It applies to all schools that receive funds from the U.S. Department of Education.

In accordance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act, certain information designated as "directory information" may be released without the prior consent of a student, unless the student has forbidden its disclosure in writing by completing a Request to Withhold Release of Directory Information form available in the Registrar's Office. This form must be turned in to the Registrar within two (2) weeks of the start of the semester. It will stay in effect until the fall term of the next academic year. The University will assume that a student does not object to the release of Directory Information unless the student files this written notification.

A complete listing of Directory Information items is included in the FERPA policy which is posted on Fontbonne's website at <http://www.fontbonne.edu/academics/registrar/ferpa.htm>. Students should read the FERPA policy to know their rights and responsibilities as they pertain to their education records. Questions should be directed to the Registrar's Office.

POLICY: FACULTY UNANNOUNCED ABSENCE FROM/LATENESS FOR CLASS

In the event that a class has not been notified of the absence or late arrival of a faculty member:

1. For courses which meet two or more times per week, students must wait 15 minutes before leaving a class.
2. For courses which meet only once per week, students must wait 30 minutes before leaving a class.

ONLINE COURSE INFORMATION

To begin the Blackboard Tutorial:

Students should check their Fontbonne University email two weeks before the start of their online course for a "Welcome to the Blackboard Tutorial" email. This email explains how to begin, and successfully complete, the Blackboard Tutorial.

To Access the Blackboard Tutorial:

1. Navigate to **<http://bblearn.fontbonne.edu>** in your **Internet browser**. The university recommends using Mozilla Firefox for Blackboard.
2. Enter login/password; these are the same login and password as those used for Fontbonne University email.

3. Blackboard Tutorial should be listed on the courses tab if it is required. Any online courses a student is registered for will be blocked from the course list until the Blackboard Tutorial is completed.

Minimum Technology Requirements for online students include:

- Minimum of 2 GB of RAM with DSL or high-speed Internet access.
- Windows and Office 2007 or higher for PC and Office 2008 for Mac. Most online courses require Word and PowerPoint, and many require Excel. Fontbonne University's standard software platform is MS Office 2010.

INCLEMENT WEATHER AND ONLINE COURSES

Online courses and online sessions of blended courses at Fontbonne University will not be cancelled for inclement weather, even when all campus locations are closed. Students and faculty are expected to access their courses just as they would if Fontbonne were open.

MSL 102: INTRODUCTION TO LEADERSHIP II - SPRING SEMESTER

Investigate leadership fundamentals such as problem-solving, listening, presenting briefs, providing feedback, and using effective writing skills. You will explore dimensions of leadership attributes and core leader competencies in the context of practical, hands-on, and interactive exercises. Learn fundamental military concepts and explore the Army's leadership philosophy. MSL 102 is open to all students and enrollment does not require a commitment to join the US Army.

MSL 202: FOUNDATIONS OF TACTICAL LEADERSHIP- SPRING SEMESTER

Develop greater self-awareness as you assess your own leadership styles and practice communication and team building skills. Examine and practice the challenges of leading teams in the complex operational environment. Study dimensions of terrain analysis, patrolling, and operation orders. Explores the dynamics of adaptive leadership in the context of military operations. Enrollment in MSL 202 does not require a commitment to join the US Army.

MSL 302: APPLIED TEAM LEADERSHIP- SPRING SEMESTER

Continue to learn and apply the fundamentals of Army leadership, officership, Army values and ethics as you hone your leadership abilities in a variety of tactical environments and the classroom. Successful completion of this course will help prepare you for success at the ROTC Leader Development and Assessment Course (LDAC) which you will attend the summer following this course at Fort Lewis, WA. You will receive systematic and specific feedback on your leadership attributes, values and core leader competencies from your instructors, other ROTC cadre, and senior cadets. Prerequisite for this course is the successful completion of MSL 301.

MSL 402: LEADERSHIP IN A COMPLEX WORLD – SPRING SEMESTER

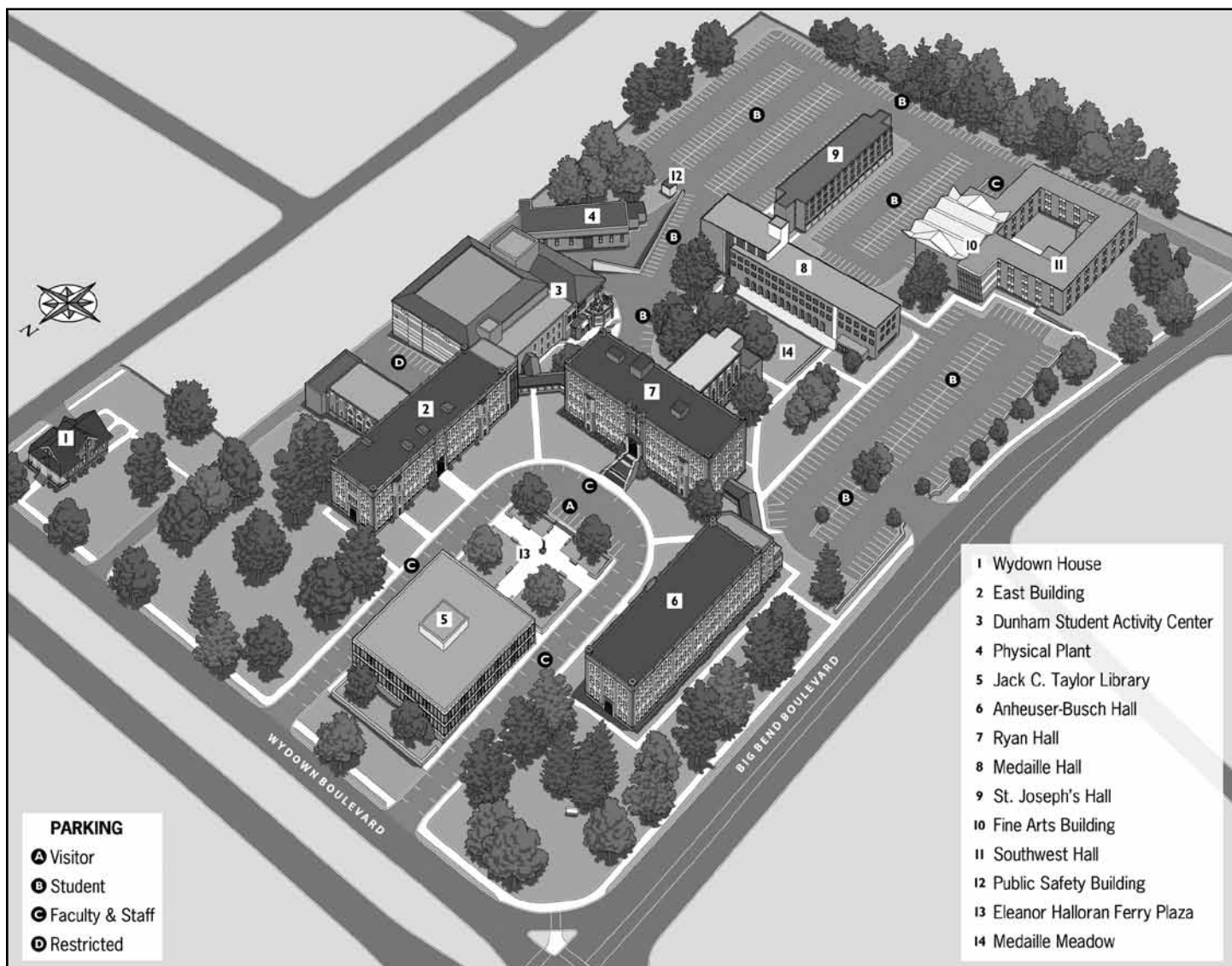
Explore the dynamics of leading in the complex situation of current military operations in the contemporary operating environment. Examine differences in customs and courtesies, military law, principles of war, and rules of engagement in the face of international terrorism. You will also explore aspects of interacting with non-government organizations, civilians on the battlefield and host nation support. Significant emphasis is placed on your transition to officership, preparing you for your branch school and first unit of assignment. Prerequisite for this course is the successful completion of MSL 401.

MSL 450: MODERN AMERICAN MILITARY HISTORY – FALL AND SPRING SEMESTERS

A survey of US military involvement beginning with the Treaty of Versailles following World War I and concluding with the current Global War on Terror. Students will follow a chronological study of crucial battles of World War II, Korea, Vietnam and conclude with in-depth case studies from Iraq and Afghanistan. The class focuses on both tactical and strategic lessons learned and the political and cultural influences that effect the way wars are fought. Prerequisite for this course is sophomore status and good standing in the ROTC program.
