Low-Light Combat Shooting Techniques

The majority of police involved shootings occur under low light conditions. Yet, very little training is devoted to this type of training.

This night time deadly force encounter training is what every officer needs to survive armed encounters on the street. It deals with engaging multiple targets, multiple times with speed and accuracy. Topics include combat stance, principles of combat shooting, muzzle rise control, tactical reloading/drawing, engaging multiple target threats, target transfer and shooting/moving, shooting on steel tactical range.

Students will learn:

- Backlight Shooting headlights, spotlights, overheads
- Tactical Shooting multiple targets with a flashlight
- Survival shooting using a mounted light
- Night-fire shooting methods
- Shooting and Moving at night

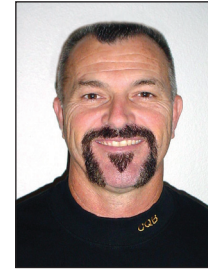
Equipment Requirements:

NOTE: Students must bring 1500 rounds of frangible handgun ammo to class. Ammo is not provided.

Students are required to bring their own duty weapon, flashlight, mounted light if assigned, safety eye protection and muff style ear protection, body armor, duty firearm, 3 magazines, and a duty / holster belt. Appropriate firearms range long pants, shirt and hat, boots, hydrating beverages are also required. Note taking material is needed for the classroom session.

The goal of this course is to provide quality training on the topics of proven low light tactical patrol shooting response methods to deadly force situations.
