All of the coursework need not be completed prior to applying for admission, but the applicant must have a plan for completion of all prerequisites prior to initiation of the graduate program.

Courses taken at other institutions may be titled something different than the GVSU equivalent. In such cases, a review of course syllabi may be undertaken to ensure that the relevant content has been covered.

## **Communication Sciences and Disorders Application Requirements**

Application deadlines: February 15 for August/ Fall semester enrollment / July 15 for January/Winter semester enrollment To be eligible for admission consideration, applicants must submit

- **GVSU** Graduate Application
- A baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution of higher education
- Official transcripts from all Non-GVSU colleges and universities attended
- Minimum 3.0 prerequisite GPA
- Plan of completion outlining how prerequisites will be completed prior to the start of the program.
- Official results from the GRE (Graduate Record Exam: verbal, quantitative, and writing)
- Personal written statement
- Professional vita or resume
- Name and contact information of three individuals willing to serve as a reference (letters of reference not accepted)
- Student must meet all Technical Standards as indicated at the CSD website
- International/Foreign born applicants must submit: 1) Original or certified original transcripts, 2) Official TOEFL test with minimum 610 score (253 on computer-based), 3) Official credential evaluation (e.g., WES, ECE)
