WHEREAS, the (<u>Township Planner/Zoning Board Attorney/Planning Board Attorney/Township Attorney</u>) has issued a letter (the "Confirmation of Density Bonus Letter"), a copy of which is attached, stating that the Project has not received a density bonus; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council wishes to endorse the Confirmation of Density Bonus Letter.
