MISSING THE MARK

Steve Higginbotham of the South Green Street Church of Christ made some astute observations in an email article. He referenced the recent Olympic competition. Let me reword some of his thoughts.

Recently we enjoyed watching with enthusiasm and pride our American representatives participate in the Olympics. We were awe stricken by their abilities and obvious hard work invested. The Olympics are usually characterized by some drama or some human-interest story that teaches us a valuable lesson about life. This year was no exception.

Matt Emmons was competing as an American marksman in the rifle shoot on Sunday. He was shooting in the final round of the 50-meter, three position rifle competition. He had a commanding lead, needing only an average shot in his final shoot to win the Gold Medal. He squeezed off the final round, not only did he get close, but he scored a bull's eye! He waited patiently to see his name posted on the scoreboard as the new Olympic Gold Medalist. He was shocked to see that he was given a score of zero, reducing him to eighth position rather than winning the Gold Medal.

The reason being, he had shot at and hit the wrong target! Even though he hit the bull's eye, he had hit the target in the wrong lane. He was devastated by disappointment.

His mistake is not all that uncommon. Seldom does a day pass when people are not taking careful aim at the wrong target. Each of us is seeking fulfillment and happiness in life. Most of us wish to avoid Hell and live with God in Heaven. On the surface, that sounds great, but the problem is that we are aiming at the wrong targets in an attempt to achieve our goals. We are taking aim at things that do not deliver our heart's desires.

I feel sorry for *Matt Emmons* because of his having worked so hard, being so skilled and exhibited such a strong desire. But aiming at the wrong target failed to bring his desired Gold Medal result, but a sense of defeat. However, as badly as we feel for this young man, we should feel worse for those who want to serve the Lord today and go to Heaven. They spend the bulk of their life in their service to Him, only to learn that they aimed at the wrong target and have missed out on the Crown of Life. It would be prudent for each of us to take another serious look at that which we are aiming our lives!

How does the Bible handle this subject? Consider the following scripture that help put it into proper perspective: "Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize" (I Cor. 9:24). "No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize (1 Cor. (:27). "I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:14).
