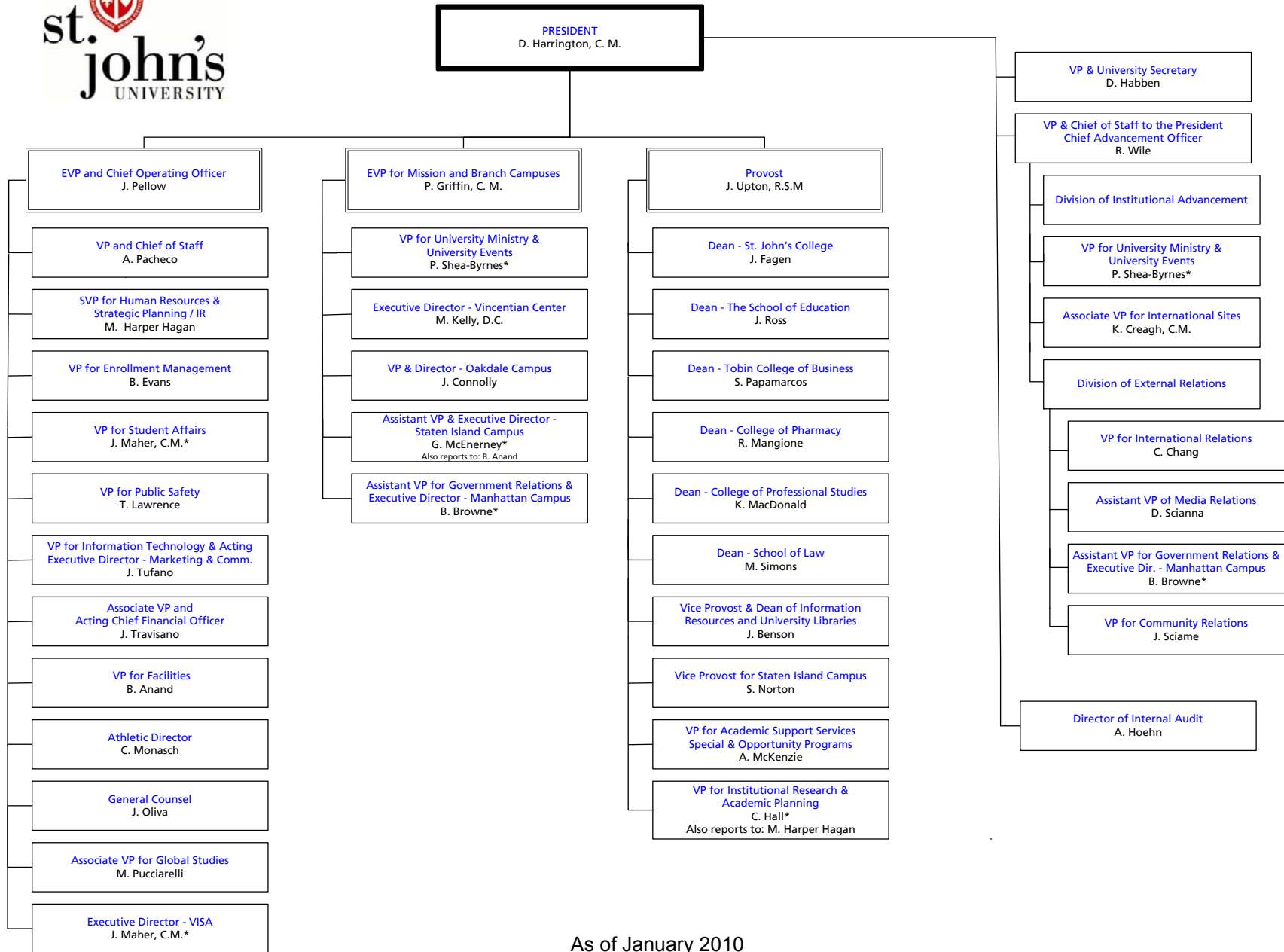

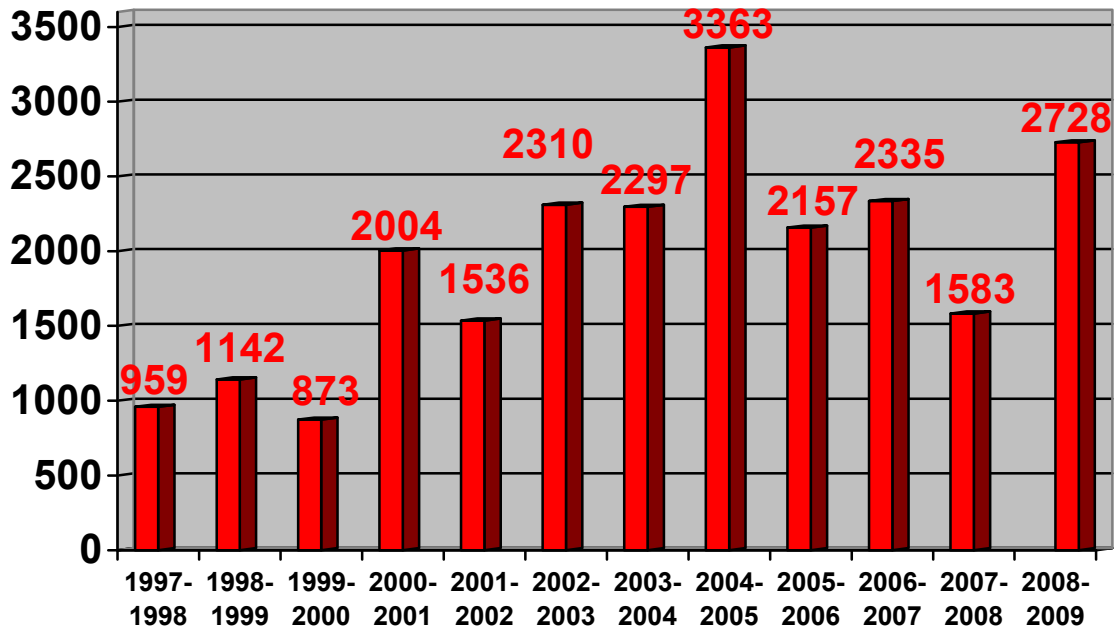

### Student Participation



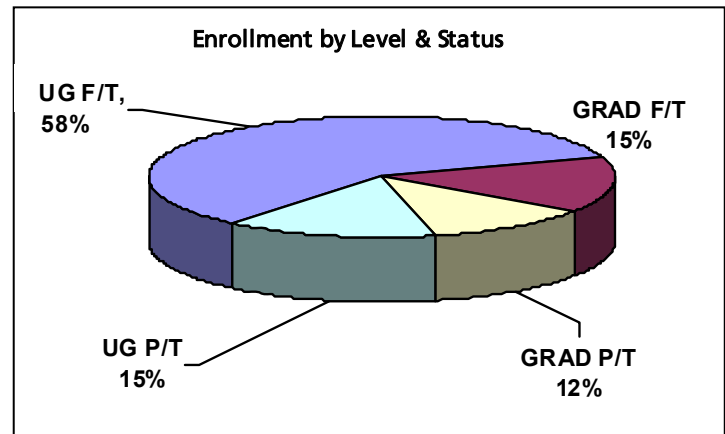

OVERVIEW

Enrollment

- Total enrollment for Fall 2009 increased to 20,352 students from 20,109 in Fall 2008. The full-time equivalency of 17,595 was higher than the 16,775 in Fall 2008 due to the change of full-time status of graduate students from 12 credits to nine credits. Undergraduates decreased from 14,816 to 14,808. The number of graduate students increased from 5,293 to 5,544.
- Overall, there were no significant changes in the distribution of enrollment between Fall 2008 and Fall 2009.

- Eighty-seven percent of the students are on the Queens campus.
- Eighty percent of undergraduates and fifty-four percent of graduate students are full-time students.

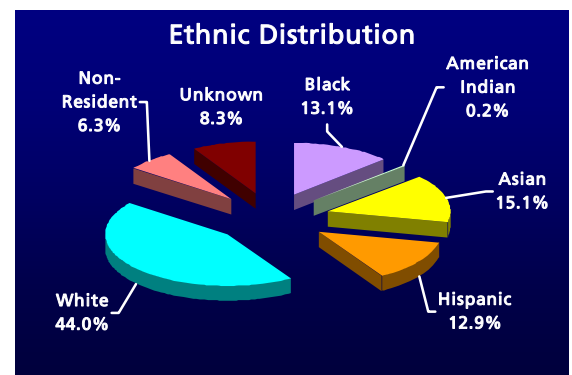
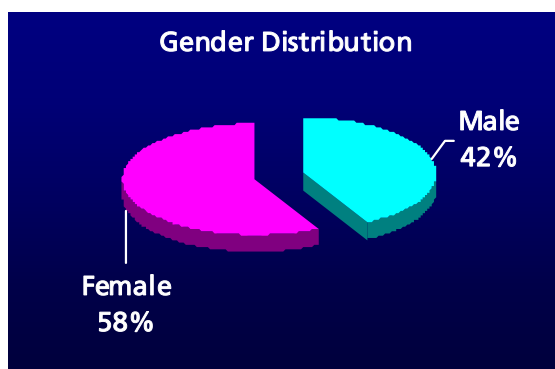


- The number of resident students on the Queens, Staten Island and Manhattan campuses increased from 3,499 to 3,804.
- Overall, new student enrollment decreased from 4,808 to 4,726.
  - The number of new freshmen decreased from 3,268 to 3,108.
  - The number of new graduate students increased from 1,540 to 1,618.
- External transfers decreased from 501 to 456.
- Continuing students increased from 11,249 to 11,492.
- Readmitted students decreased from 153 to 123.
- Internal transfer students increased from 515 to 525.
- Non-matriculated, Visiting, and Special increased from 2,882 to 3,030 students.

## Demographic Characteristics

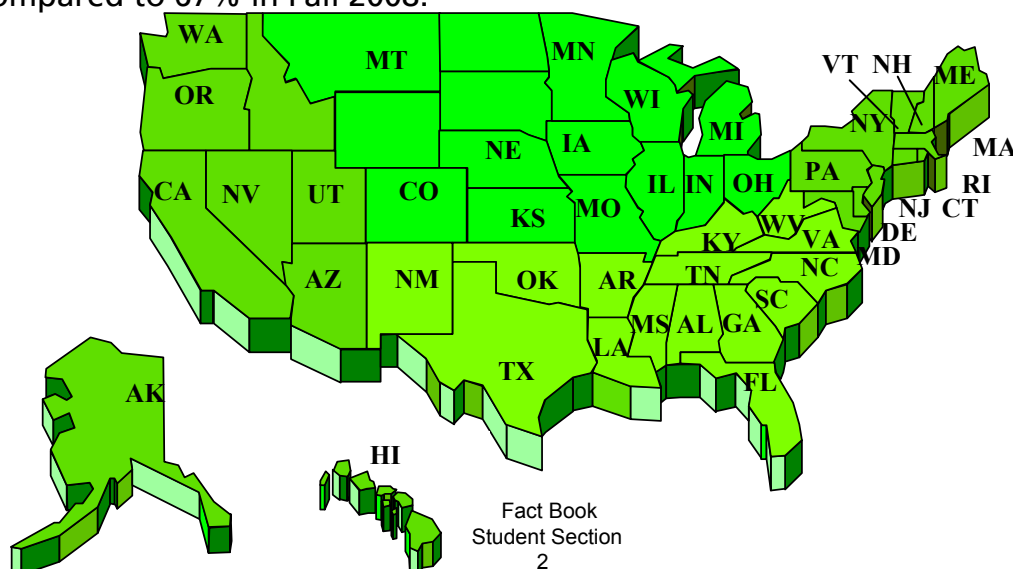
There were no significant changes in the demographic profile of the student body between Fall 2008 and Fall 2009.

- Female students account for 58% of the student body, compared to 57% in Fall 2008.
- The average age of students was 20 years for undergraduates and 28 years for graduate students. This is compared to 20 years and 29 years in fall 2008. The average age of new undergraduate freshmen remained at 18 years.
- Black, Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander, and American Indian students increased to 41% of the student population compared to 40% in Fall 2008.
- Roman Catholic students account for 47% of the student body compared to 48% of the Fall 2008 student population.



## Geographical Distribution of the Student Body

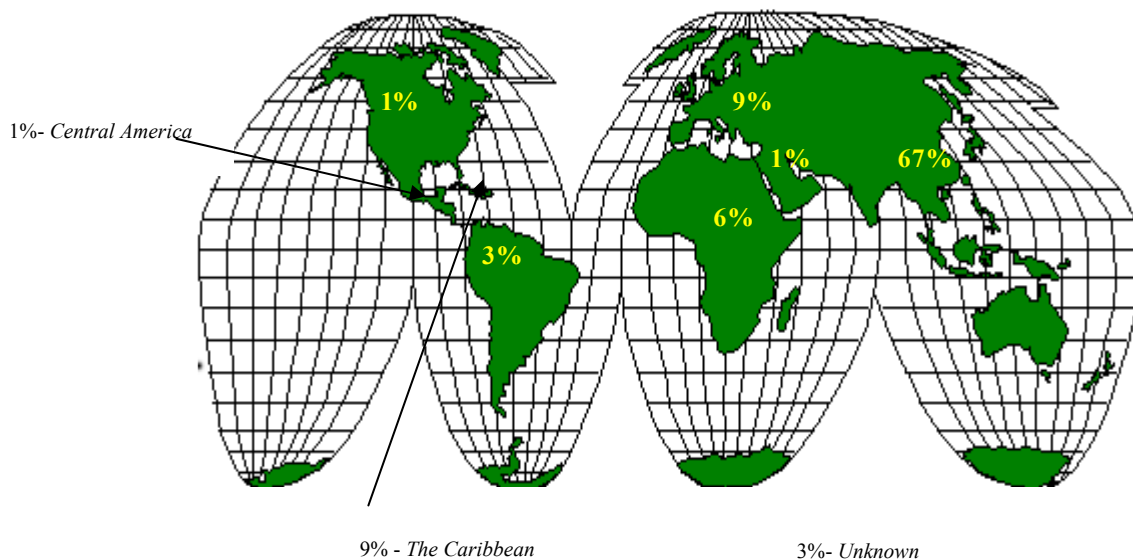
- Students come from 46 states, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and US Virgin Islands. In Fall 2008, students came from 44 states, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and US Virgin Islands.
- Almost half of the students (48%) come from New York City. An additional 25% come from Nassau and Suffolk Counties, New York. This is compared to 51% from NYC and 23% from Nassau and Suffolk Counties in Fall 2008. Sixty-four percent come from the primary market (NYC and Nassau County) compared to 67% in Fall 2008.





- Non-Resident (International) students increased by 5% from 1,236 to 1,295, the largest number ever enrolled. They represent 6% of the total population. They account for 4% of the undergraduate population and 13% of the graduate population.
- Non-Resident (International) students come from 94 countries compared to 102 in Fall 2008.
  - Five countries account for 67% of the students: People's Republic of China, India, South Korea, Trinidad and Tobago, and Republic of China (Taiwan).
  - Undergraduate Non-Resident students come from 86 countries.
  - Graduate Non-Resident students come from 57 countries.
- When permanent residents are factored in, 111 countries are represented in the student body.

**Fields of Study**

- Excluding Undecided and College Advantage Program (formerly known as the High School Extension Program), the five most popular programs on the undergraduate level are: Pharmacy; Liberal Studies; Psychology; Biology; and Accounting.
- The five most popular programs on the graduate level are: Law; Pharmacy; Business Administration; Accounting; and Adolescent Education.

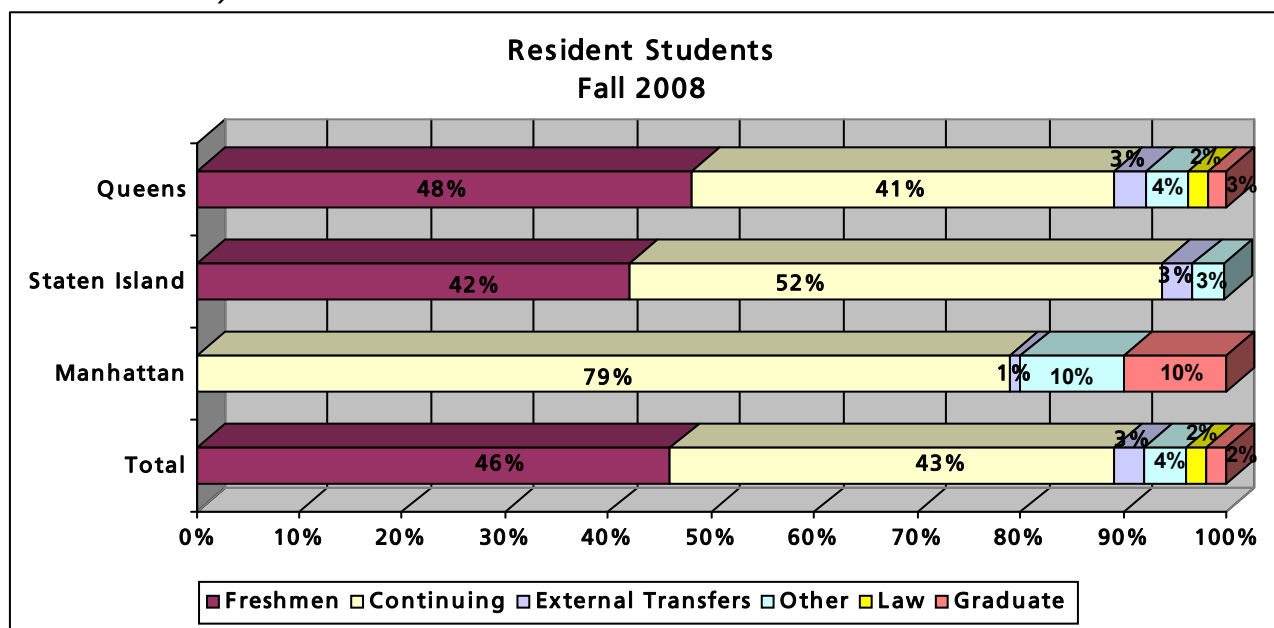

## Characteristics of Resident Students

- There are a total of 3,804 resident students: 3,385 on the Queens campus; 241 on the Staten Island campus; and 178 on the Manhattan campus. Queens figures include students living in the Garden Apartments on Union Turnpike and in the apartments on Henley Road. An additional 14 students live in facilities in Paris, France and Rome, Italy.
- Queens campus:
  - 48% freshmen; 41% continuing students; 3% external transfers; 3% other undergraduate; 2% law; and 2% graduate.
  - Students come from 43 states, District of Columbia, Guam & US Virgin Islands.
  - Non-resident (International) students come from 35 countries.
  - 43% male and 57% female.
  - 52% Black, Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander, or American Indian.
- Staten Island campus:
  - 42% freshmen; 52% continuing students; 3% external transfers; 3% other undergraduate.
  - Students come from 21 states. Non-Residents (International) students come from 5 countries.
  - 33% male and 67% female.
  - 48% Black, Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander, or American Indian.
- Manhattan campus:
  - 79% continuing students; 1% external transfers; 10% other undergraduate; and 10% graduate.
  - Students come from 18 states & US Virgin Islands.
  - Non-Residents (International) students come from 10 countries.
  - 37% male and 63% female.
  - 47% Black, Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander, or American Indian.
- Overall, 56% of the total Fall 2009 freshman class resides in residence facilities. This has continually increased from the 20% of the Fall 1999 (*first year of residence facilities*) freshman class.



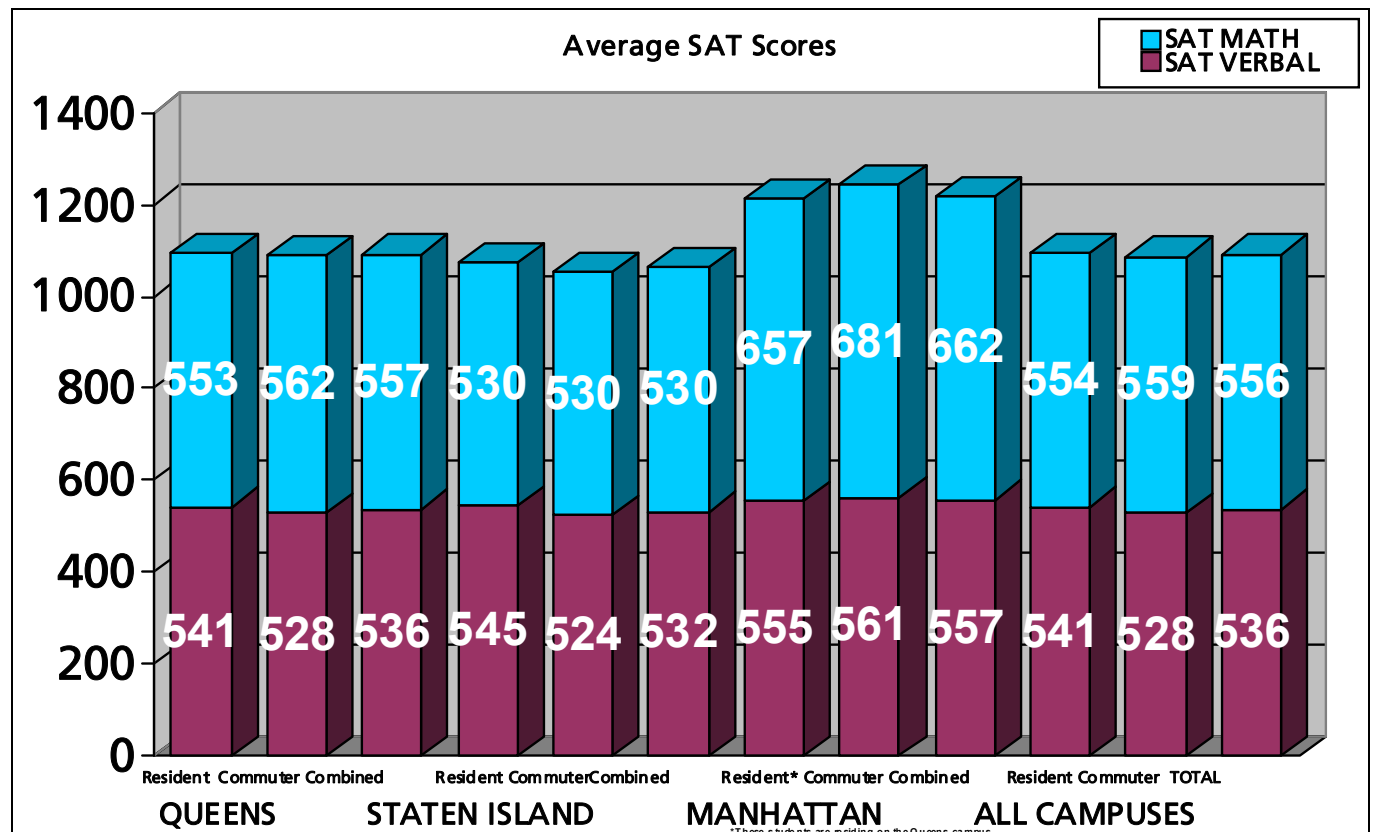
## Characteristics of Incoming Students

## Retention and Graduation Rates for Undergraduate Students

- Seventy-eight percent of full-time baccalaureate students who were freshmen in Fall 2008 returned to the University in Fall 2009. This is higher than the 76% for the Fall 2007 freshman class.
- The changes in rates for each ethnic group were:

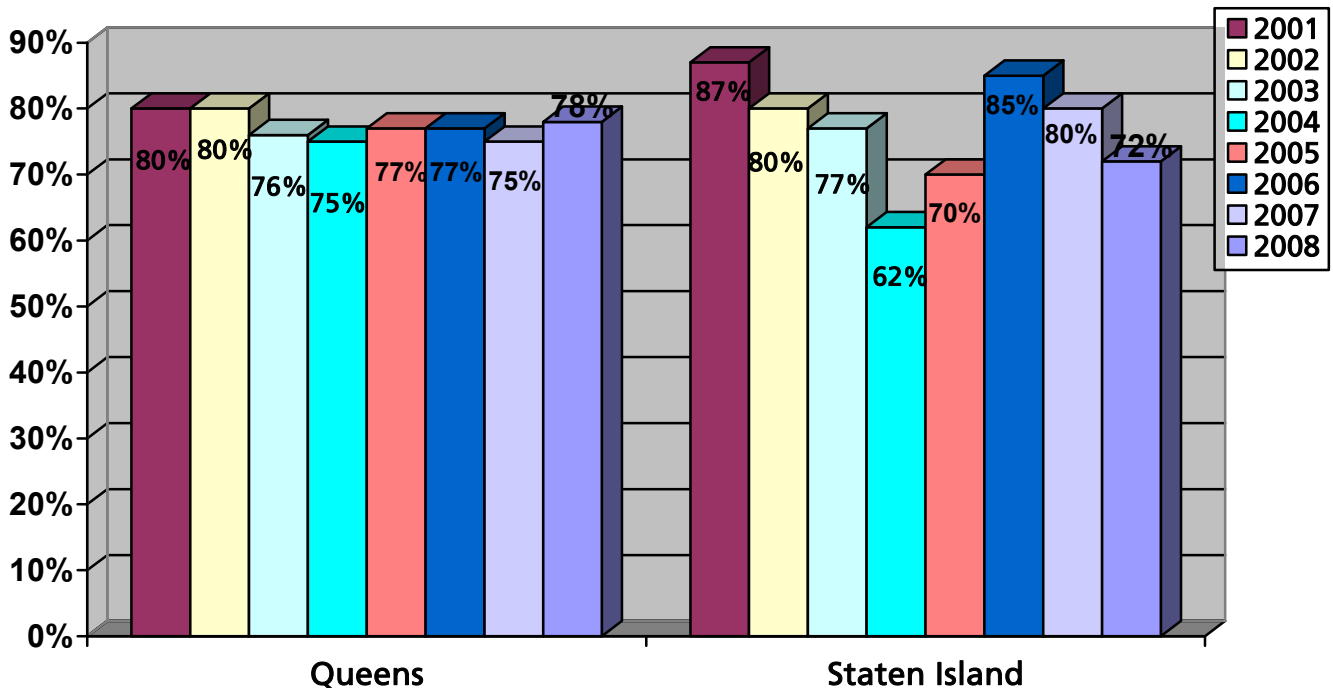

- For females, the retention rate increased from 78% for the Fall 2007 freshman class to 80% for the Fall 2008 freshman class. The retention rate for males increased from 73% for the Fall 2007 freshman class to 76% for the Fall 2008 freshman class.
- For the freshmen class of 2003, 58% graduated within six years which is lower than the 61% for the class of 2001.

### Retention Rates for Resident Students

- Queens campus:
  - Seventy-eight percent of the freshmen living in the residence halls in Fall 2008 returned in Fall 2009 to the University, while 57% returned to live in residence facilities. This is compared to 75% and 49% respectively for the Fall 2007 freshman class.
- Staten Island campus:
  - Seventy-two percent of the freshmen resident students in the Fall of 2008 returned to the University in Fall 2009, while 60% returned to live in residence facilities campus. This is compared to 80% and 60% respectively for the Fall 2007 freshman class.

*Includes students who return to the residence halls and those who did not and is based on All freshmen(Baccalaureate and Associate degree-seeking students)*

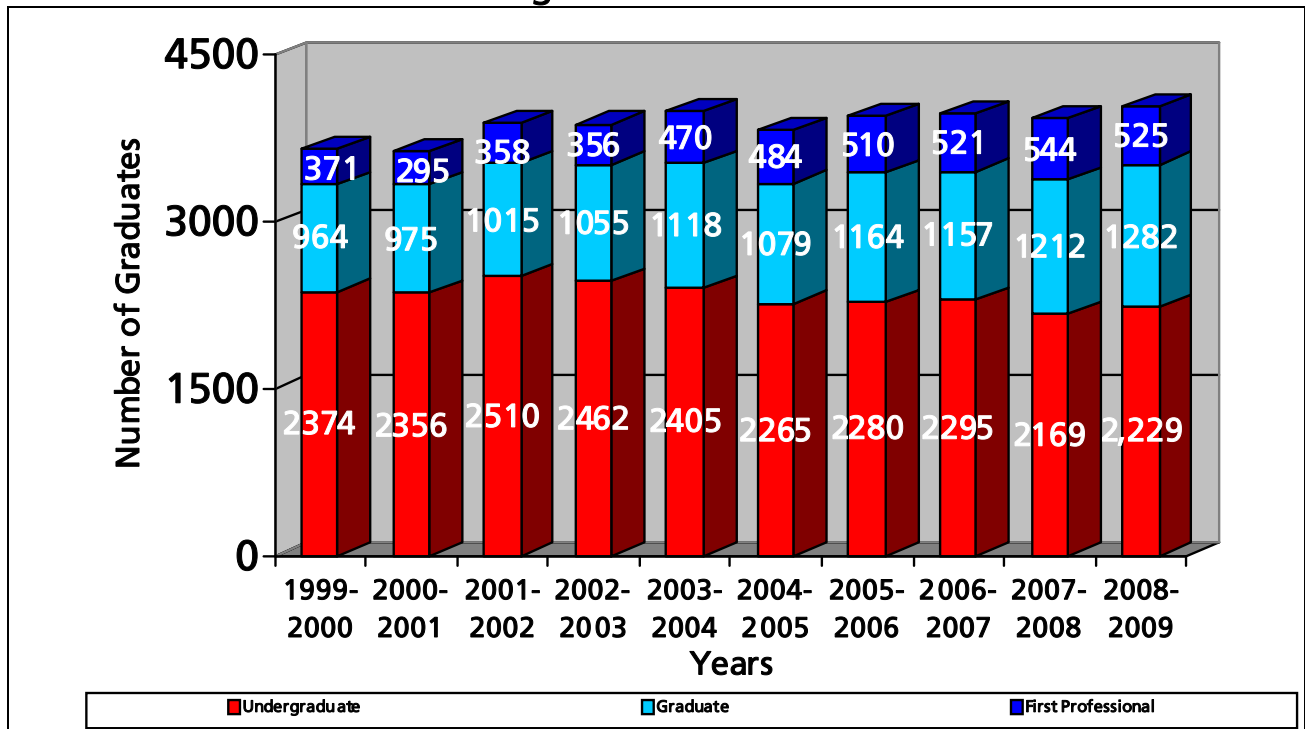
### Retention and Graduation Rates for Graduate Students

- Eighty-two percent of first-time graduate students (including law students) in the Fall of 2008 returned to the University in Fall 2009.
- Based on the Fall 2002 cohort, 82% of first-time graduate students graduated within 7 years which remained the same from the fall 2001 cohort.

## Degrees Conferred

- St. John's University conferred 4,036 degrees in the 2008-2009 academic year compared to 3,925 in 2007-2008. Degrees were awarded at the associate, baccalaureate, master, doctoral, law and other first professional level. Post master's diplomas and undergraduate certificates were also awarded.
- Fifty-four percent of the graduates were baccalaureates. Twenty-eight percent were master's. Seven percent were law graduates. All of the figures remained the same from 2007-2008.
- Ninety-eight doctoral degrees were conferred with more than half of them being conferred in St. John's College. This is compared to 57 in 2007-2008.
- Sixty percent of our graduates were female, compared to 61% in 2007-2008. Thirty-seven percent of our graduates were Black, Hispanic, American Indian, or Asian/Pacific Islander compared to 39% in 2007-2008.

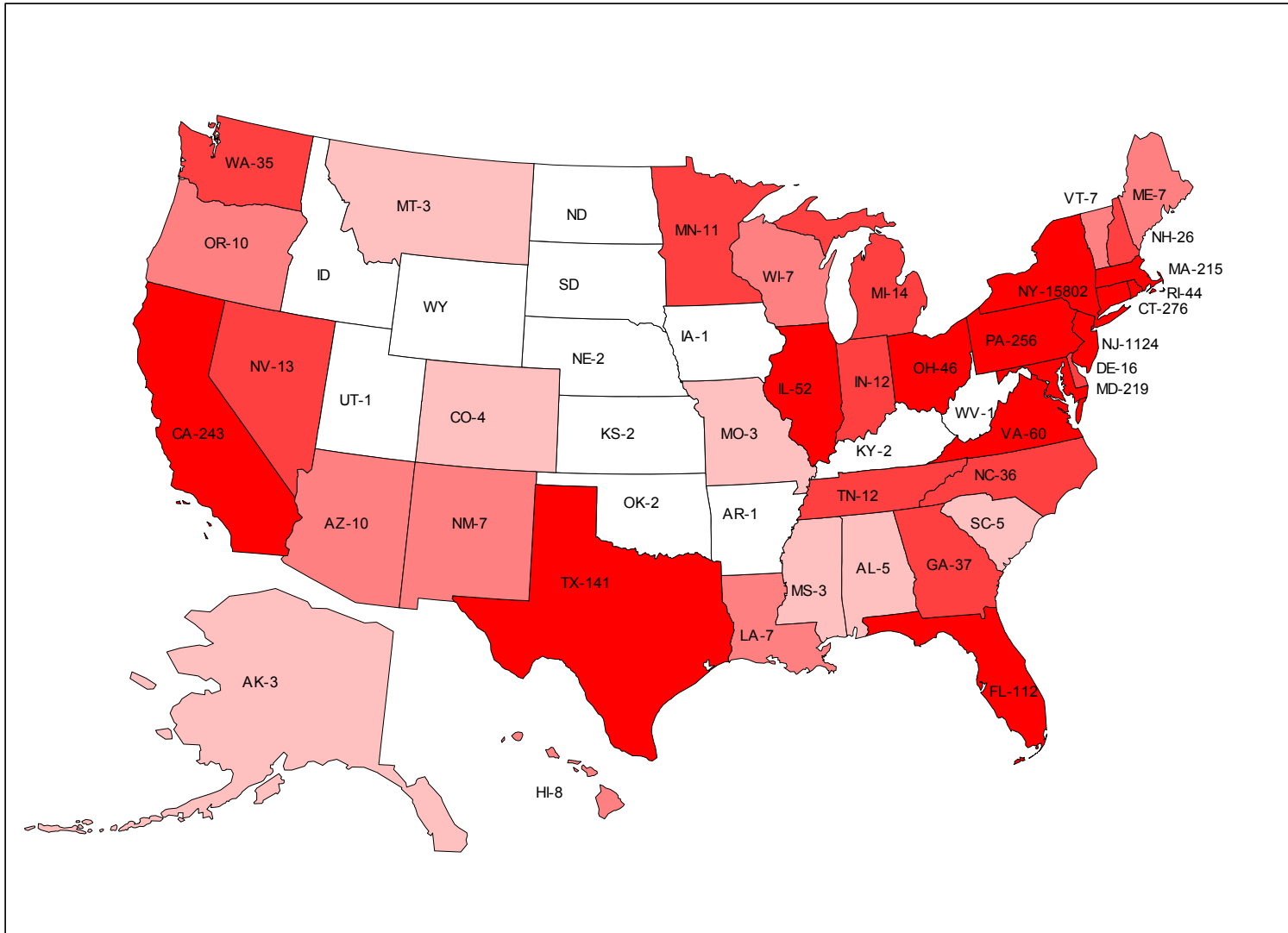


## Total Students

- *Almost half of the students (48%) come from New York City. An additional 25% come from Nassau County and Suffolk Counties, New York. This is similar to that of Fall 2008 where 51% were from NYC and 23% from Nassau and Suffolk Counties.*
  - ◆ *48% of the undergraduates come from New York City. An additional 30% come from other areas of New York State.*
  - ◆ *48% of the graduate students come from New York City. An additional 30% from other areas of New York State.*
- *Students come from 46 states, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and US Virgin Islands. Fifteen percent of the student body comes from states outside of New York. This is comparable to 44 states and 14% in Fall 2008.*
  - ◆ *Undergraduates come from 45 states, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and US Virgin Islands. Eighteen percent of undergraduates come from states outside of New York which is similar to the 16% in Fall 2008.*
  - ◆ *Graduate students come from 35 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. Eight percent of graduate students come from states outside of New York. This is similar to the 7% in Fall 2008.*
- *There are 1,295 Non-Resident (International) students that represent 6% of the total student population. This is the largest number ever enrolled.*
  - ◆ *Non-resident students come from 94 countries, compared to 102 in Fall 2008.*
  - ◆ *5 countries account for 67% of the non-resident students: People's Republic of China, India, South Korea, Trinidad and Tobago, and Republic of China(Taiwan).*
  - ◆ *Undergraduate non-resident students come from 86 countries and represent 4% of the undergraduate population.*
  - ◆ *Graduate non-resident students come from 57 countries and represent 13% of the graduate student population.*

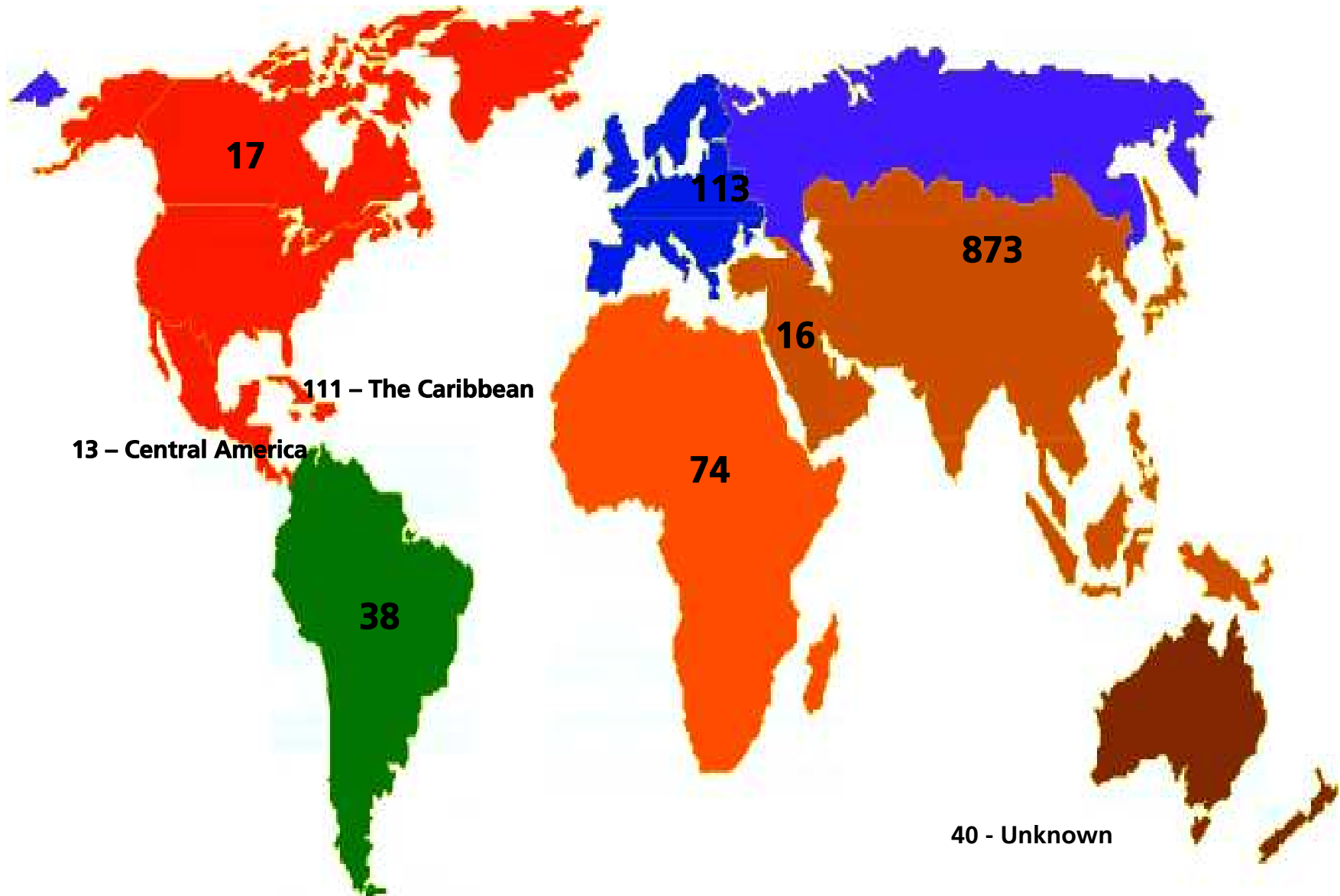

## Number of Non-Resident (International) Students by Region – Fall 2009

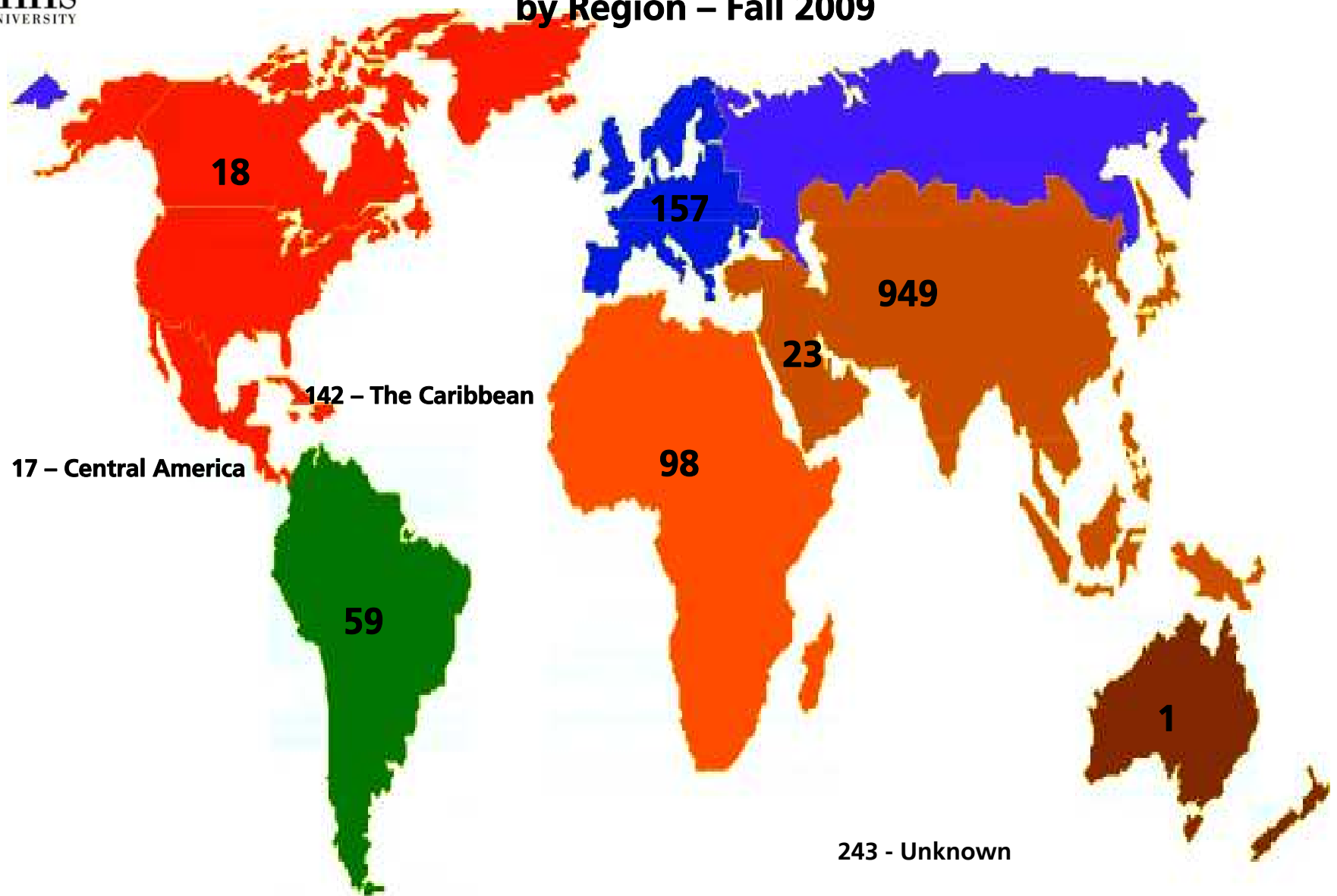

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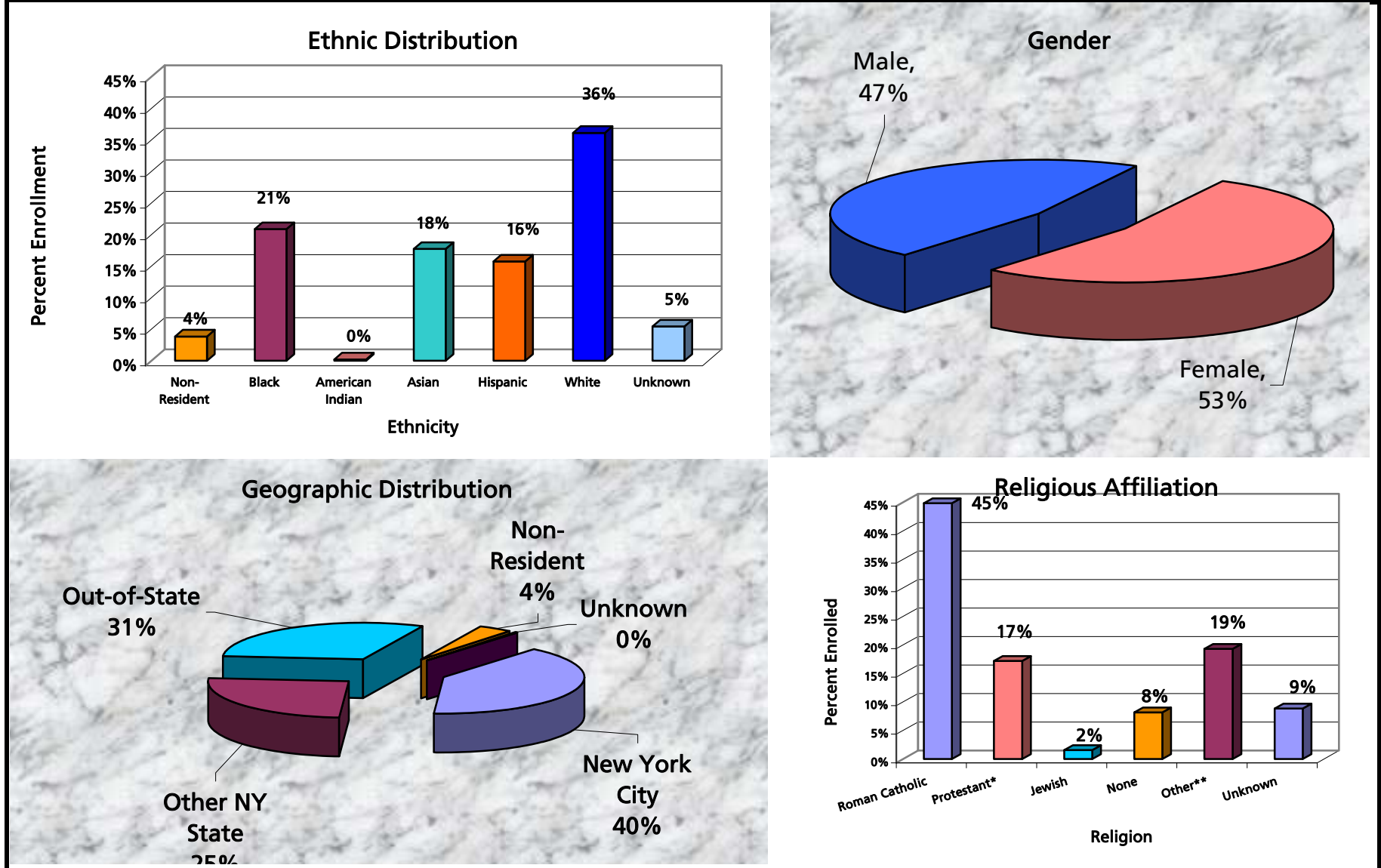

- *The mean SAT score for freshmen resident students is 1095 and 1087 for commuter students. This is compared to 1091 and 1082, respectively in Fall 2008.*
- *Top majors of Freshmen, excluding Undeclared, are Liberal Studies, Pharmacy, Biology, Psychology, and Physician Assistant.*
- *56% of the Freshmen class live in residence facilities on the Queens, Staten Island, and Manhattan campuses compared to 54% in Fall 2008.*

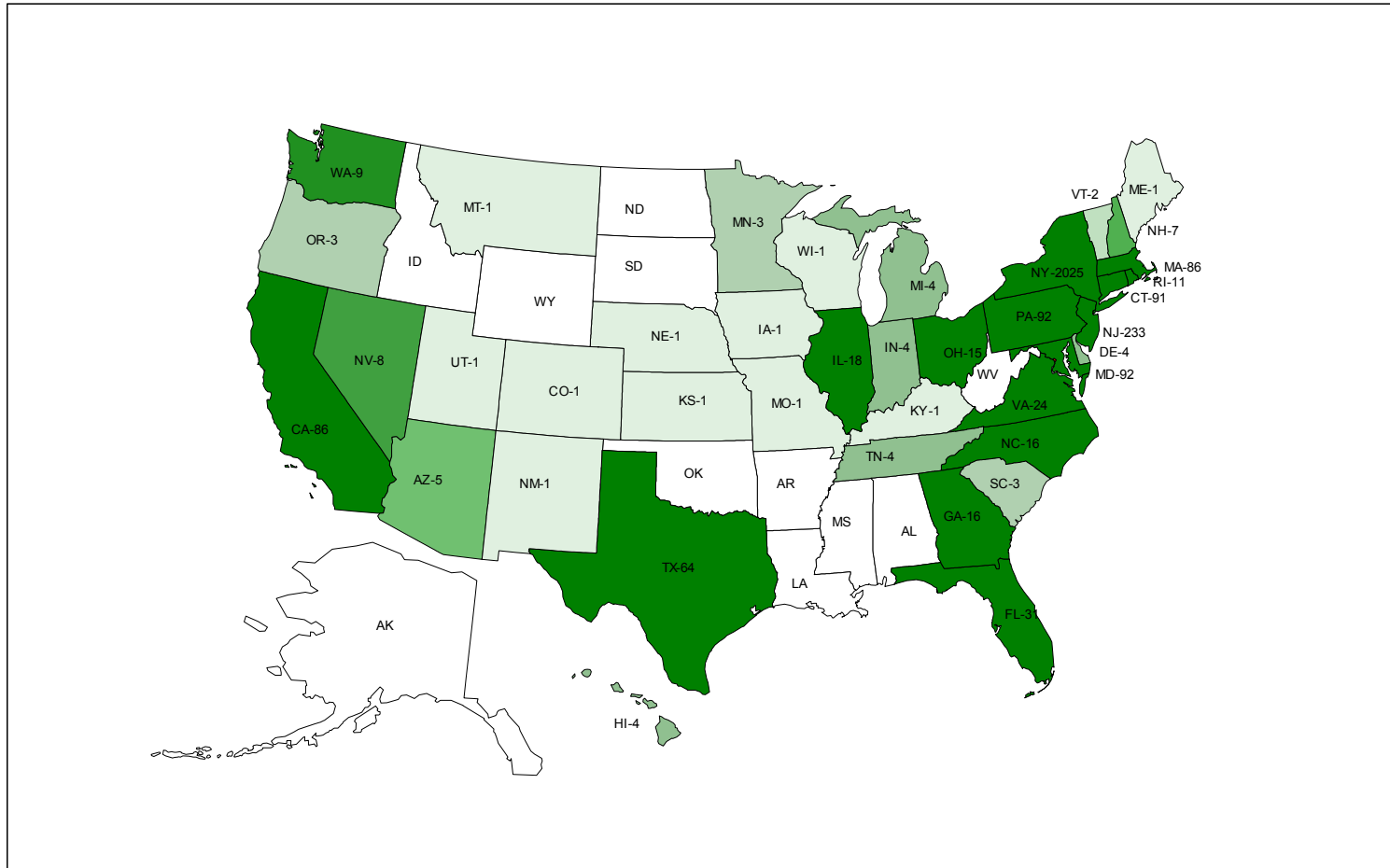

## Undergraduate Admission

### *University*

- Total inquiries increased over 30% from 84,822 in 2008 to 111,321 in 2009.
- Total applications and acceptance were at all time highs.
- New freshmen applications continued to increase, more than doubling since 2006, exceeding 52,000 in 2009.
- Secondary market applications continued to increase, more than double the primary market (38,889 vs. 14,091).
- The acceptance rate continued to decline, reflecting our increasing selectivity. In 2009, the acceptance rate is 43%, and in 2000 it was 80%.
- The enrollment rate continued to decrease from 39% in 1999 to 14% in 2009.

### *Queens Campus*

- Total inquiries increased from 81,953 in 2008 to 109,114 in 2009.
- Total applications and acceptance were at all time highs.
- New freshmen applications continued to increase, almost doubling since 2006 and exceeding 40,000 in 2009 for the first time.
- The acceptance rate continued to decline from 80% in 2000 to 44% in 2009.
- The enrollment rate continued to decrease almost 50%, from 27% in 2004 to 14% in 2009.

### *Staten Island Campus*

- New freshmen applications continued to increase, more than tripling since 2007, exceeding 8,000 in 2009.
- The acceptance rate continued to decrease from 82% in 2000 to 34% in 2009.
- The enrollment rate decreased almost 50% from 17% in 2008 to 9% in 2009.

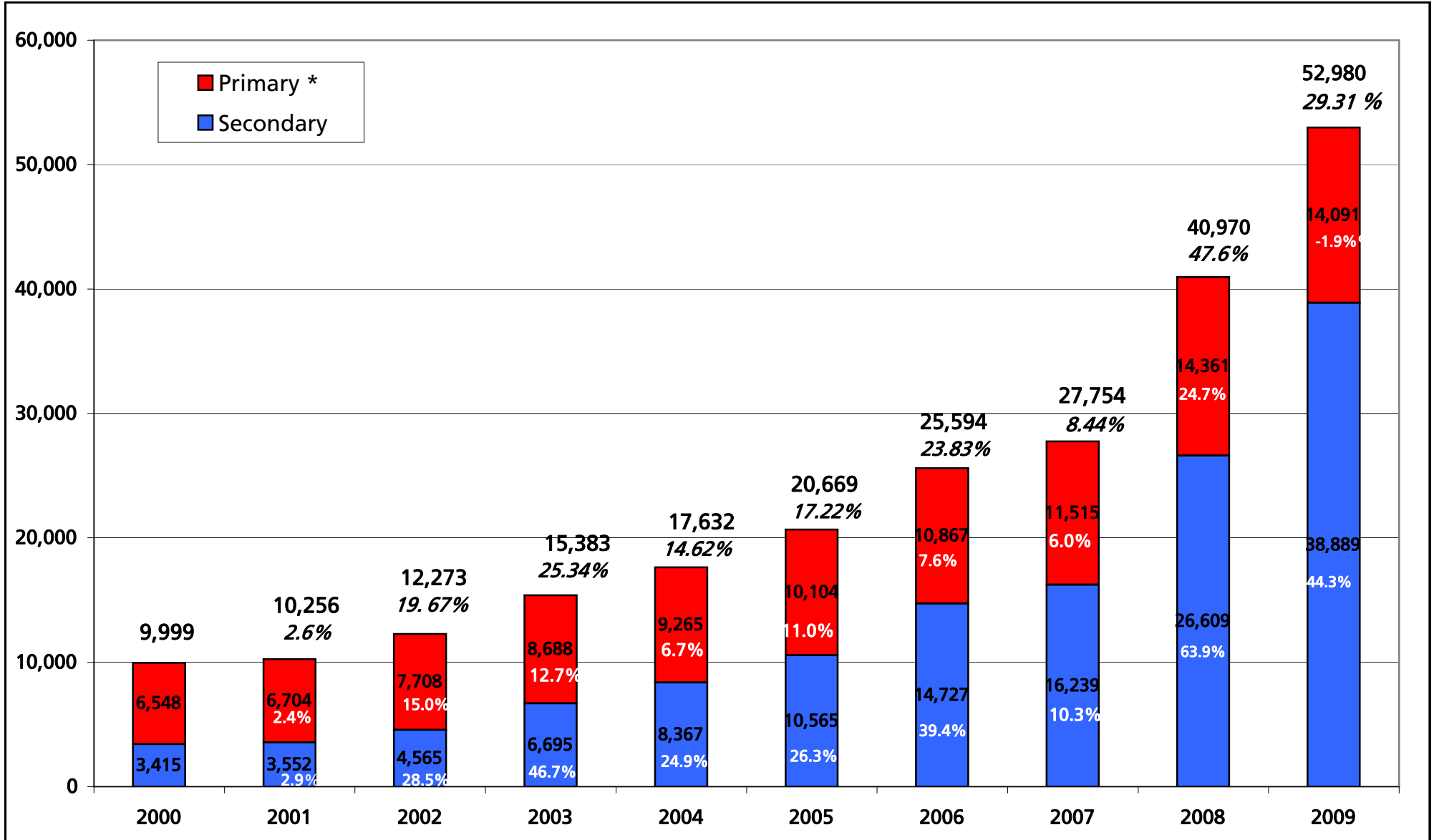
### *Manhattan Campus*

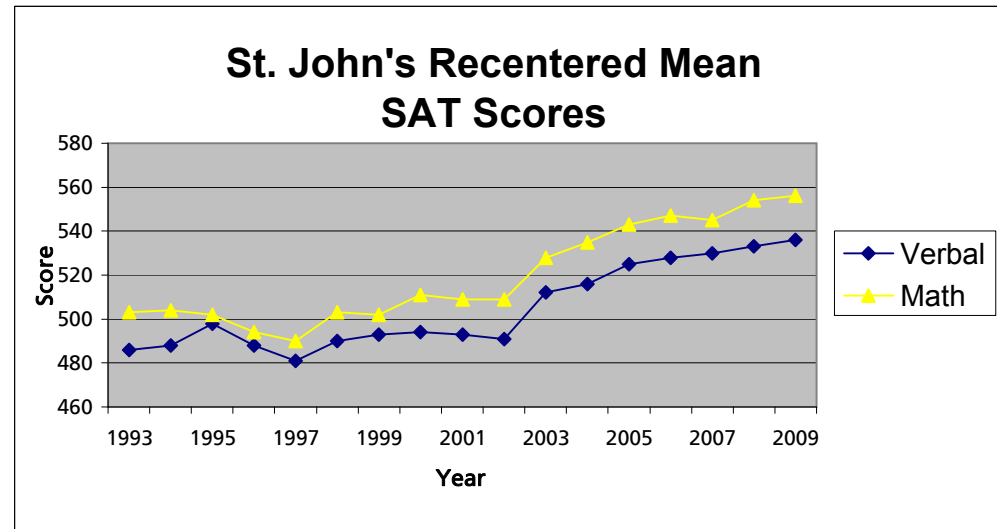

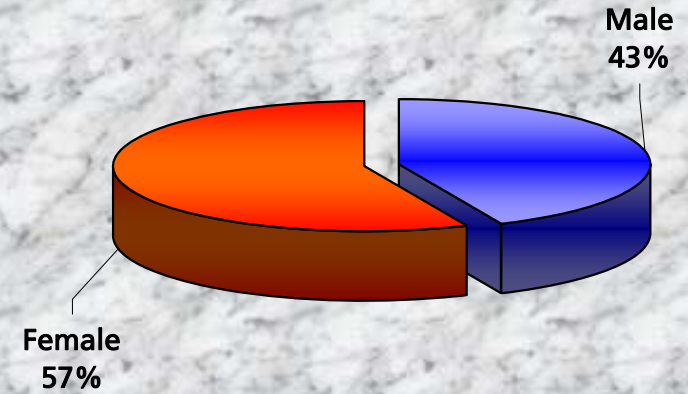

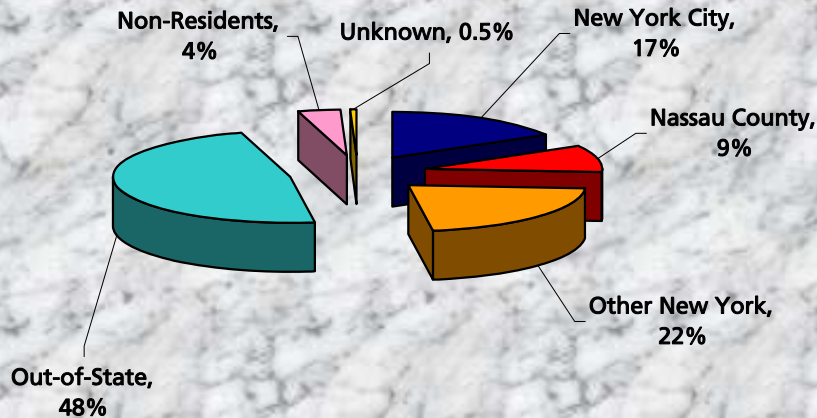
**Ethnic Distribution**



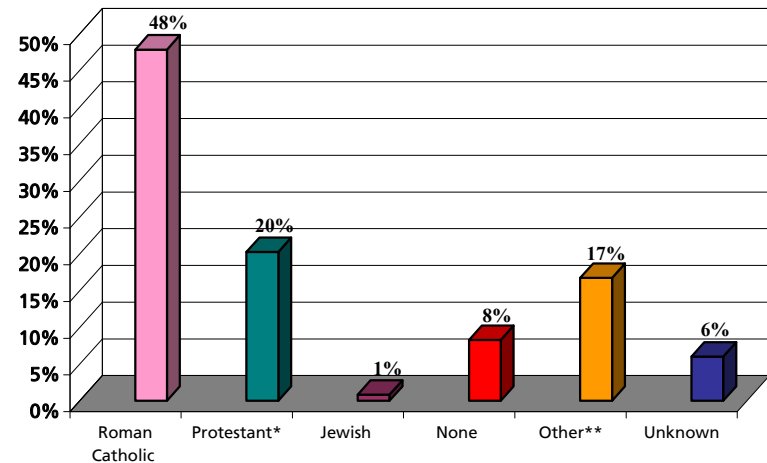
**Gender**

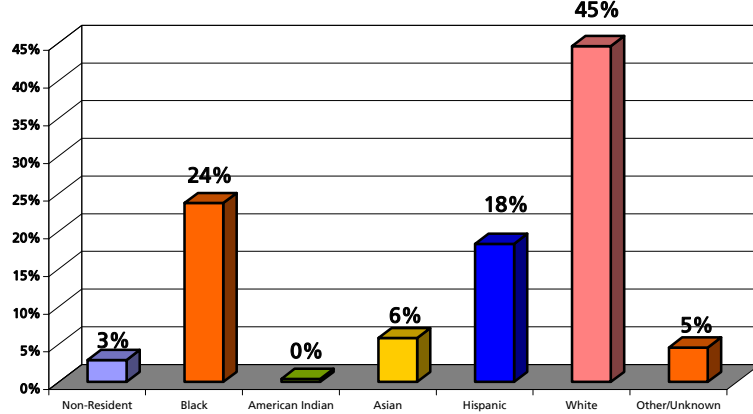


**Geographical Distribution of Resident Students

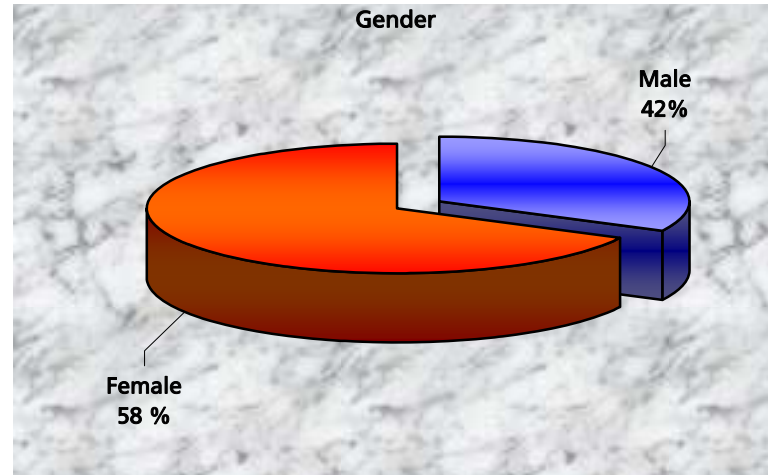

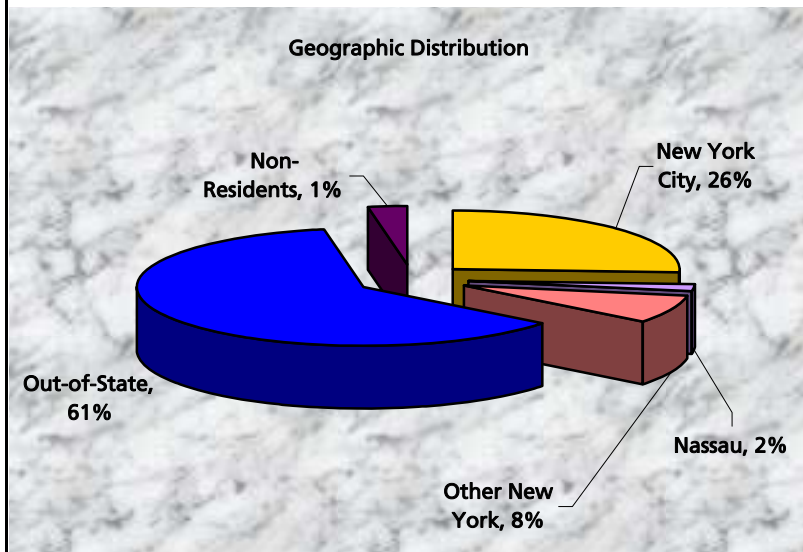
**Ethnic Distribution**



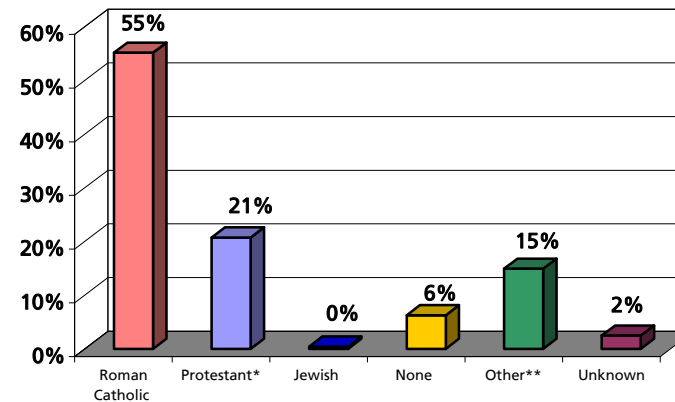

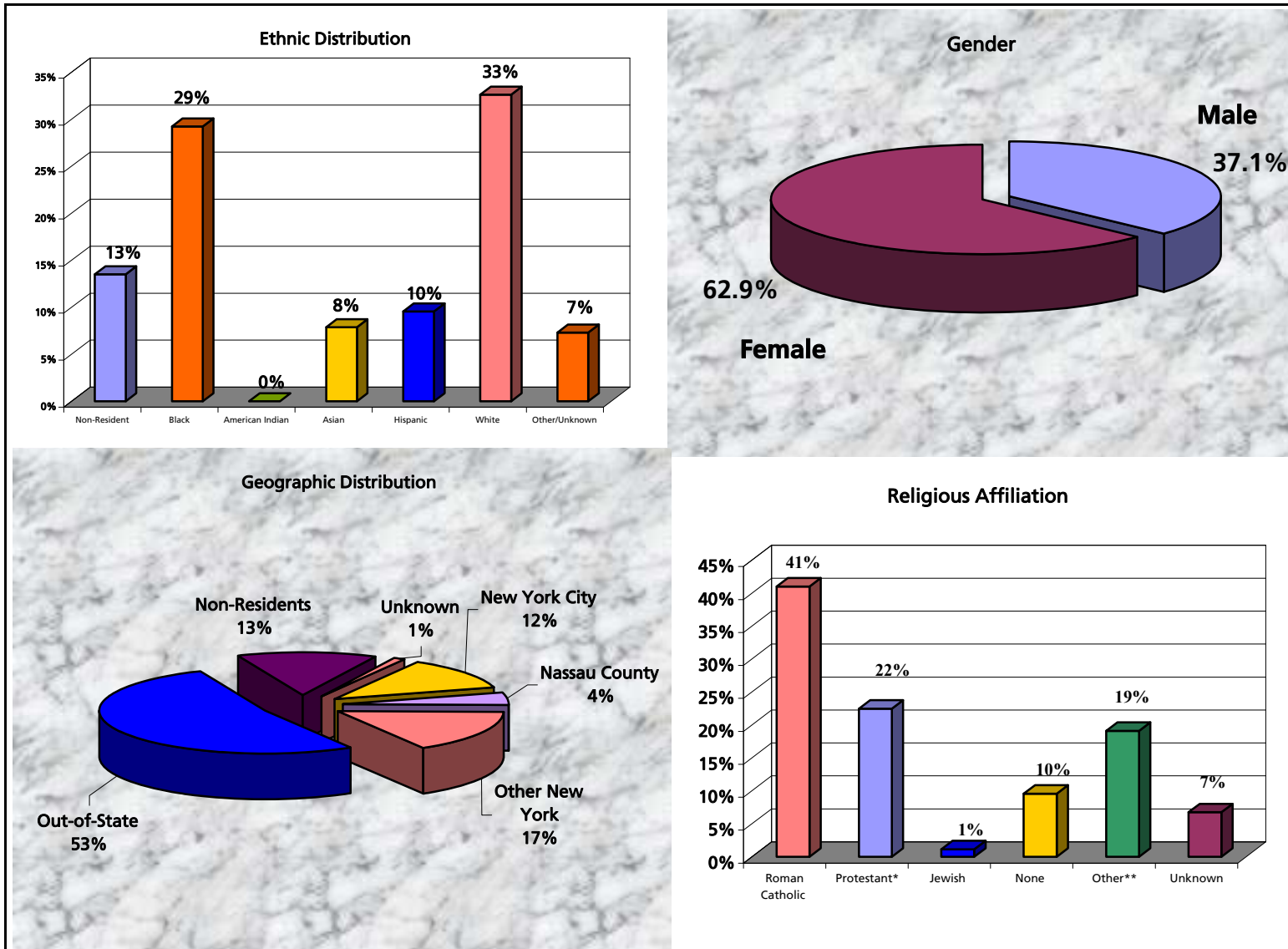

## 2008-2009 Degrees Conferred

- *There were 4,036 degrees conferred in the 2008-2009 academic year. This is compared to 3,925 in 2007-2008. Degrees were awarded at the associate, baccalaureate, master, doctoral, law, and other first professional level. Post master's diplomas and undergraduate certificates were also awarded.*
- *Fifty-four percent of the graduates were baccalaureates. This remained the same from 2007-2008.*
- *Twenty-eight percent were master's, the same as in 2007-2008.*
- *Seven percent were JD law graduates, which remained the same from 2007-2008.*
- *Ninty-eight doctoral degrees were conferred with more than half of them being conferred in St. John's College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. This is compared to 57 in 2007-2008.*
- *Sixty percent of our graduates were female compared to 61% in 2007-2008.*
- *Thirty-seven percent of our graduates were Black, Hispanic, American Indian, or Asian compared to 39% in 2007-2008.*

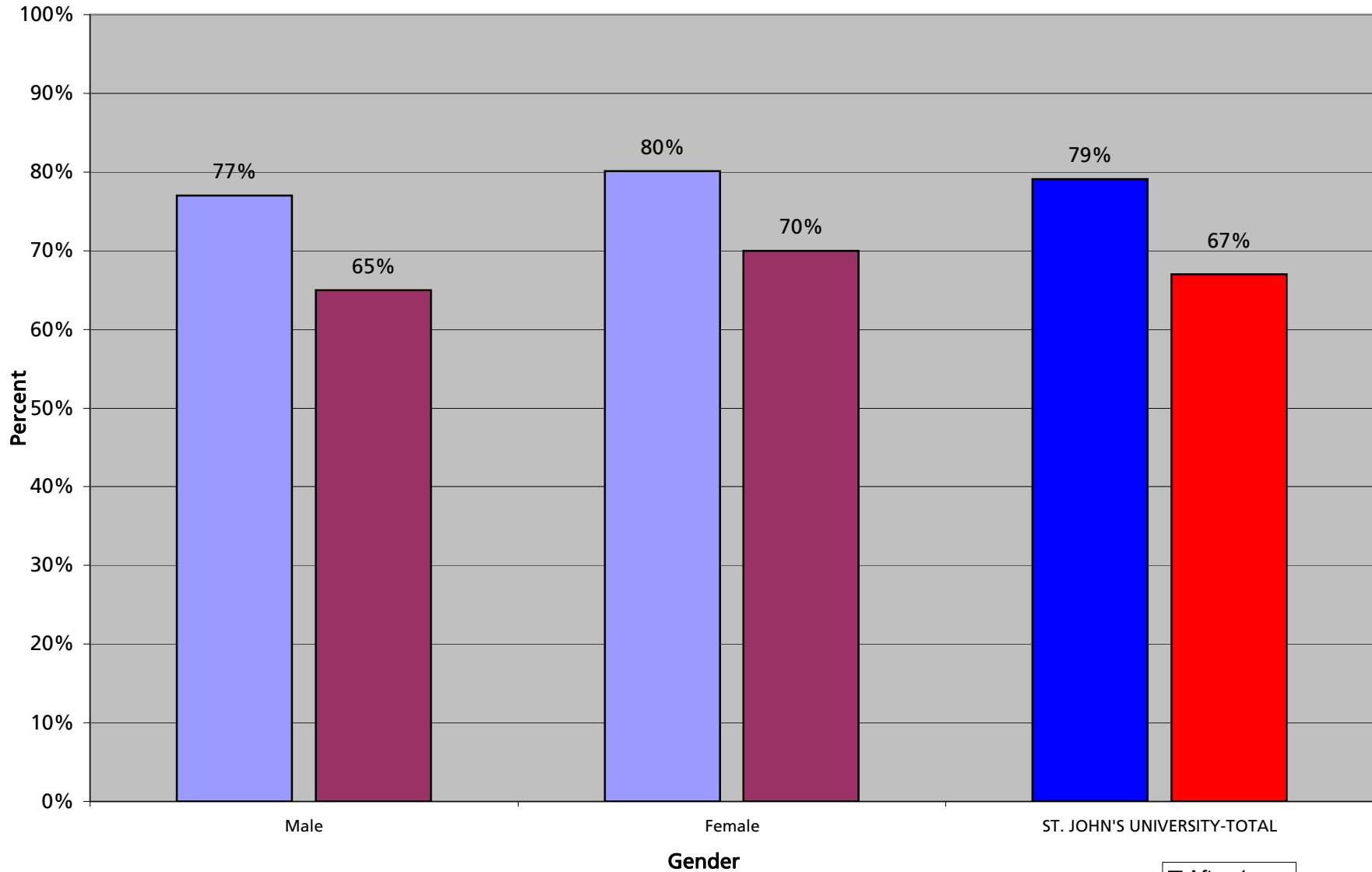

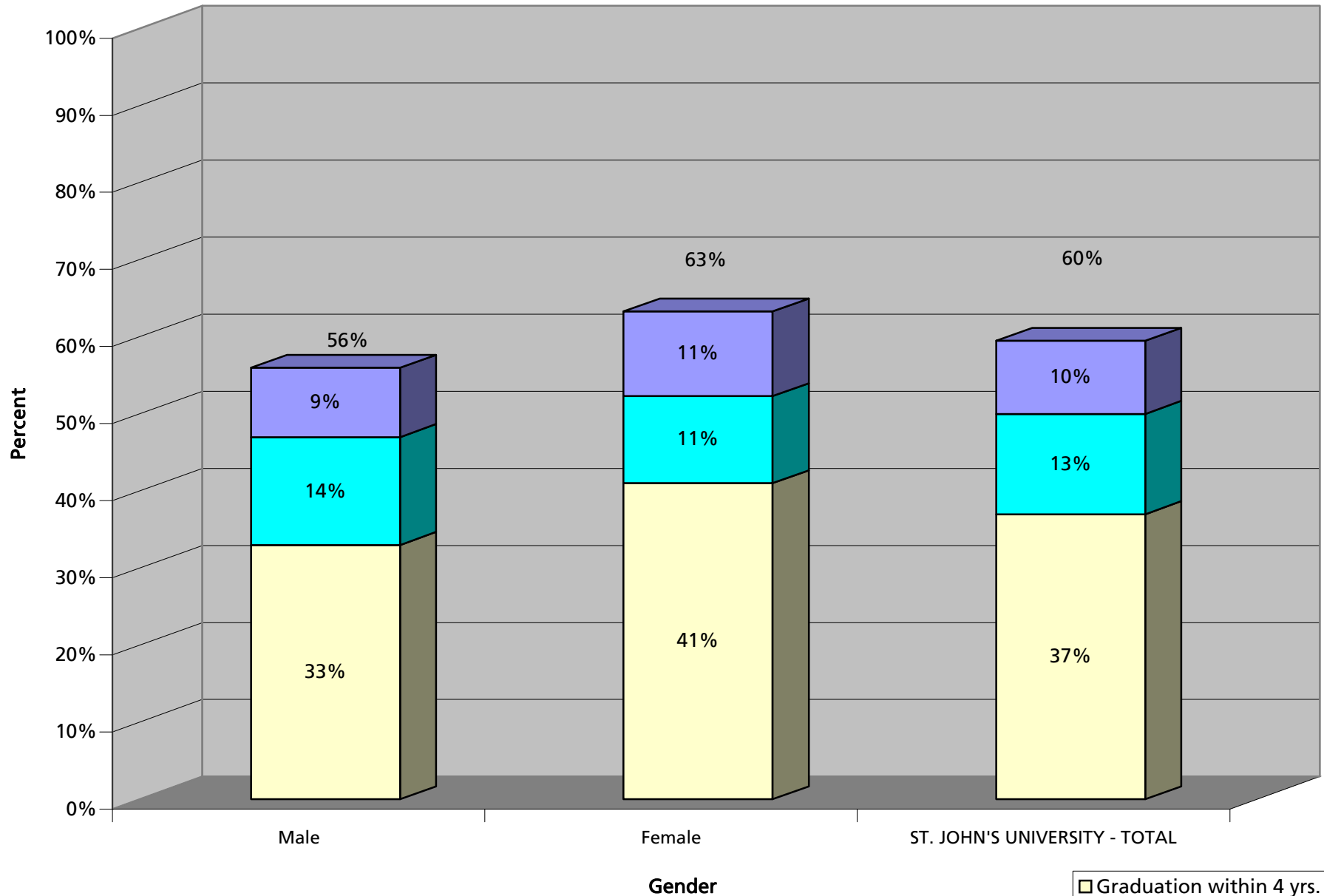
### Composite Retention Rates of Full-time Baccalaureate Degree-Seeking First-time Freshmen by Gender 2001 - 2008

2001 - 2005

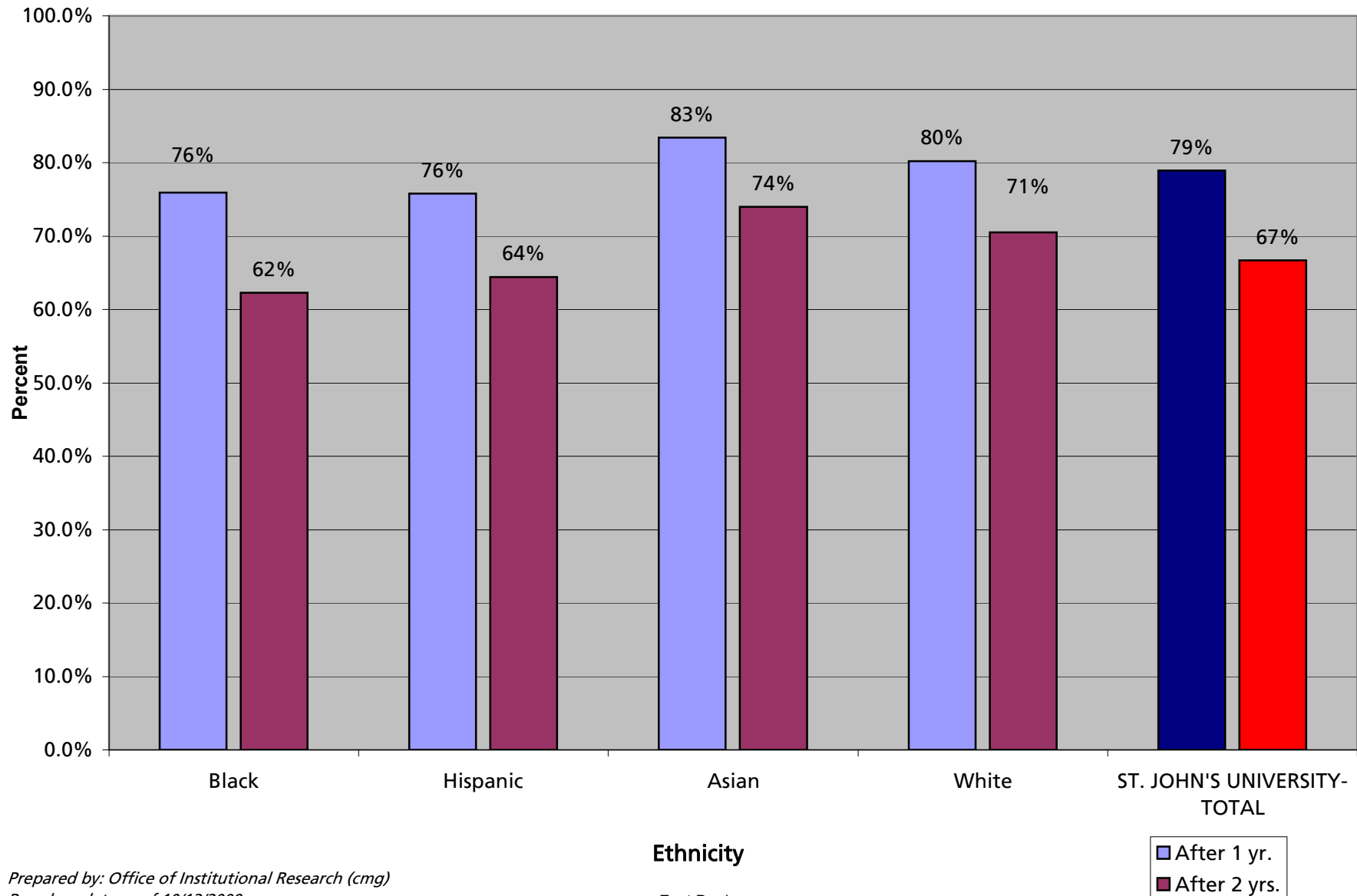

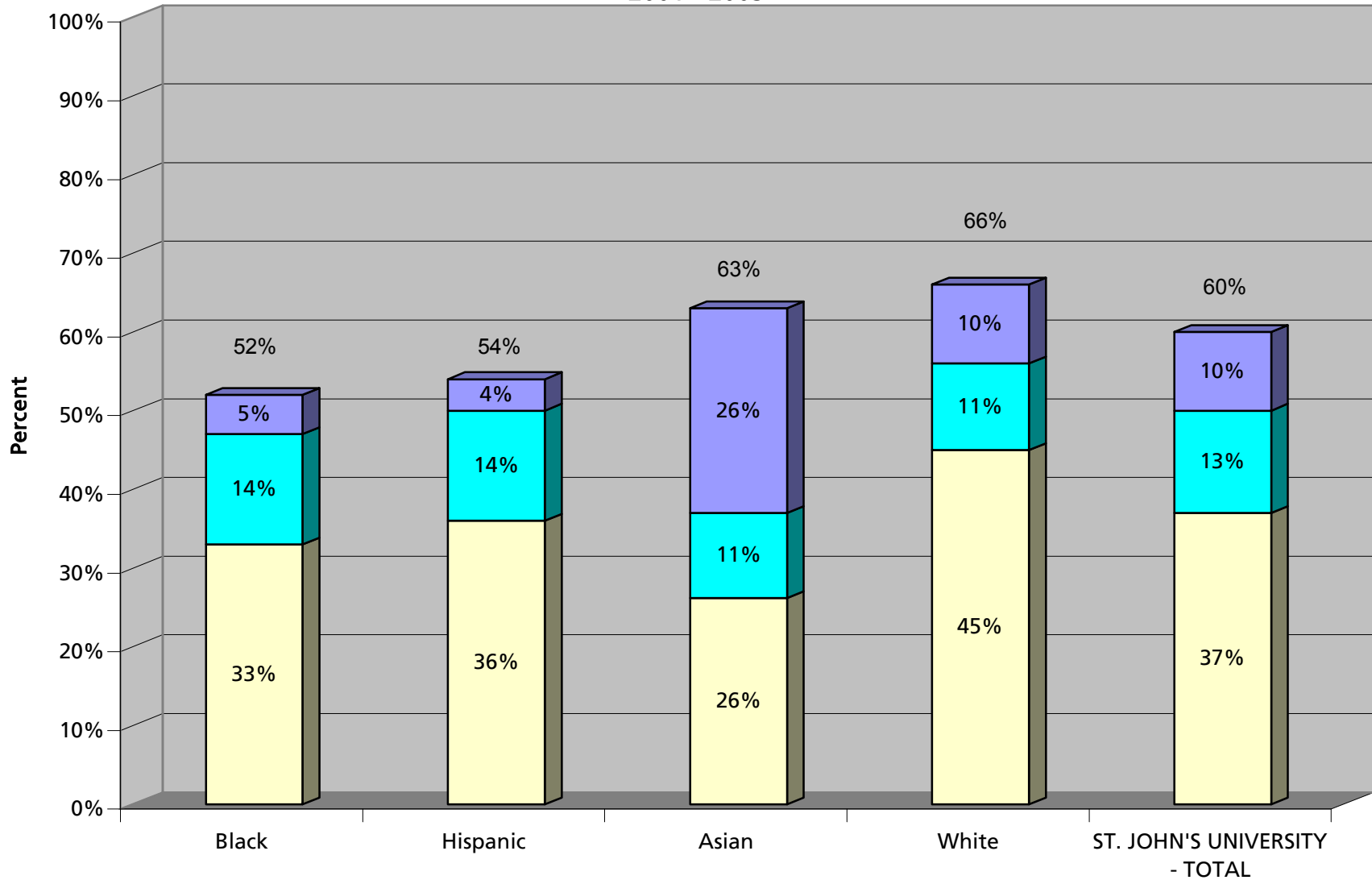
Composite Retention Rates

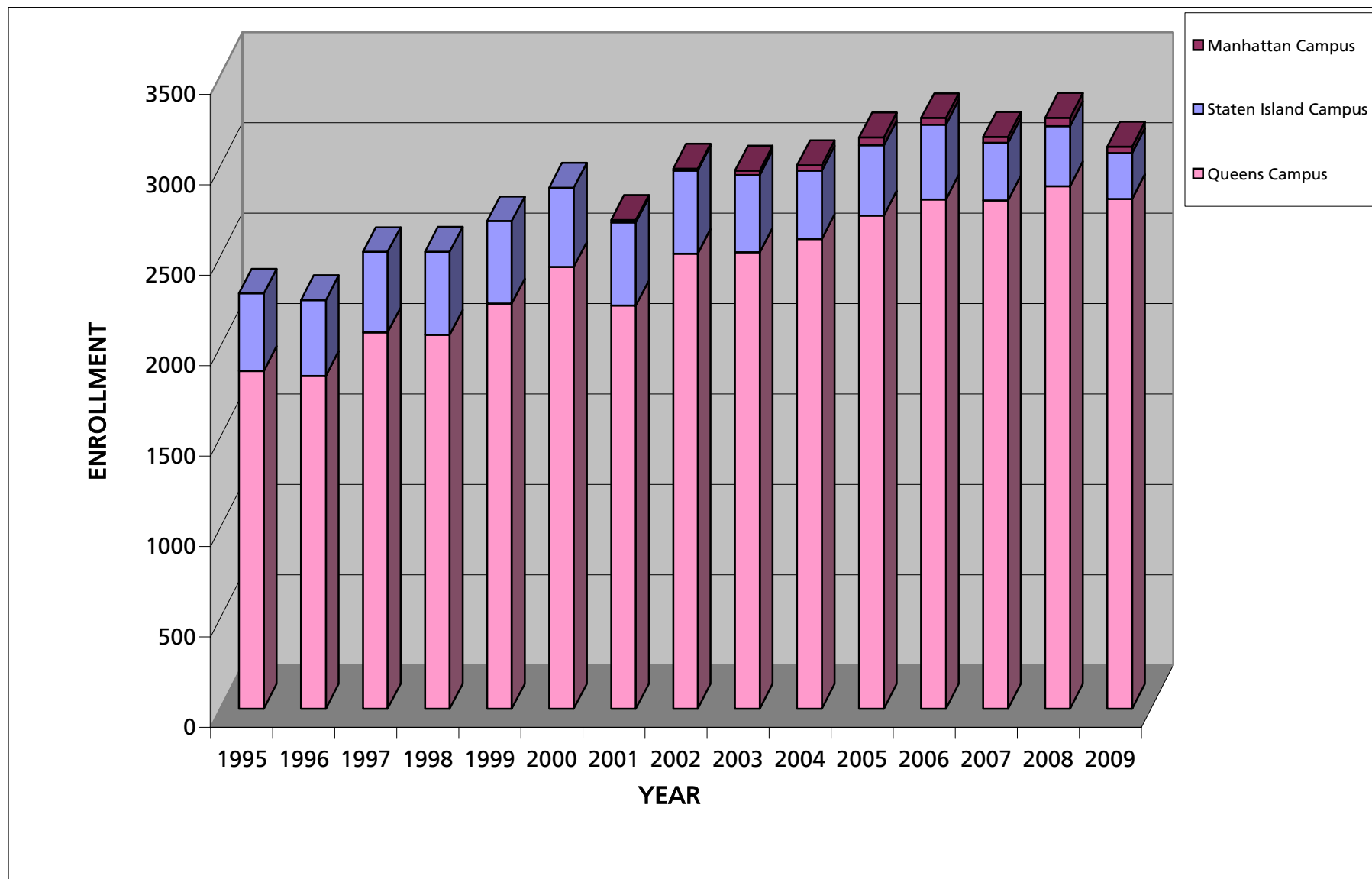

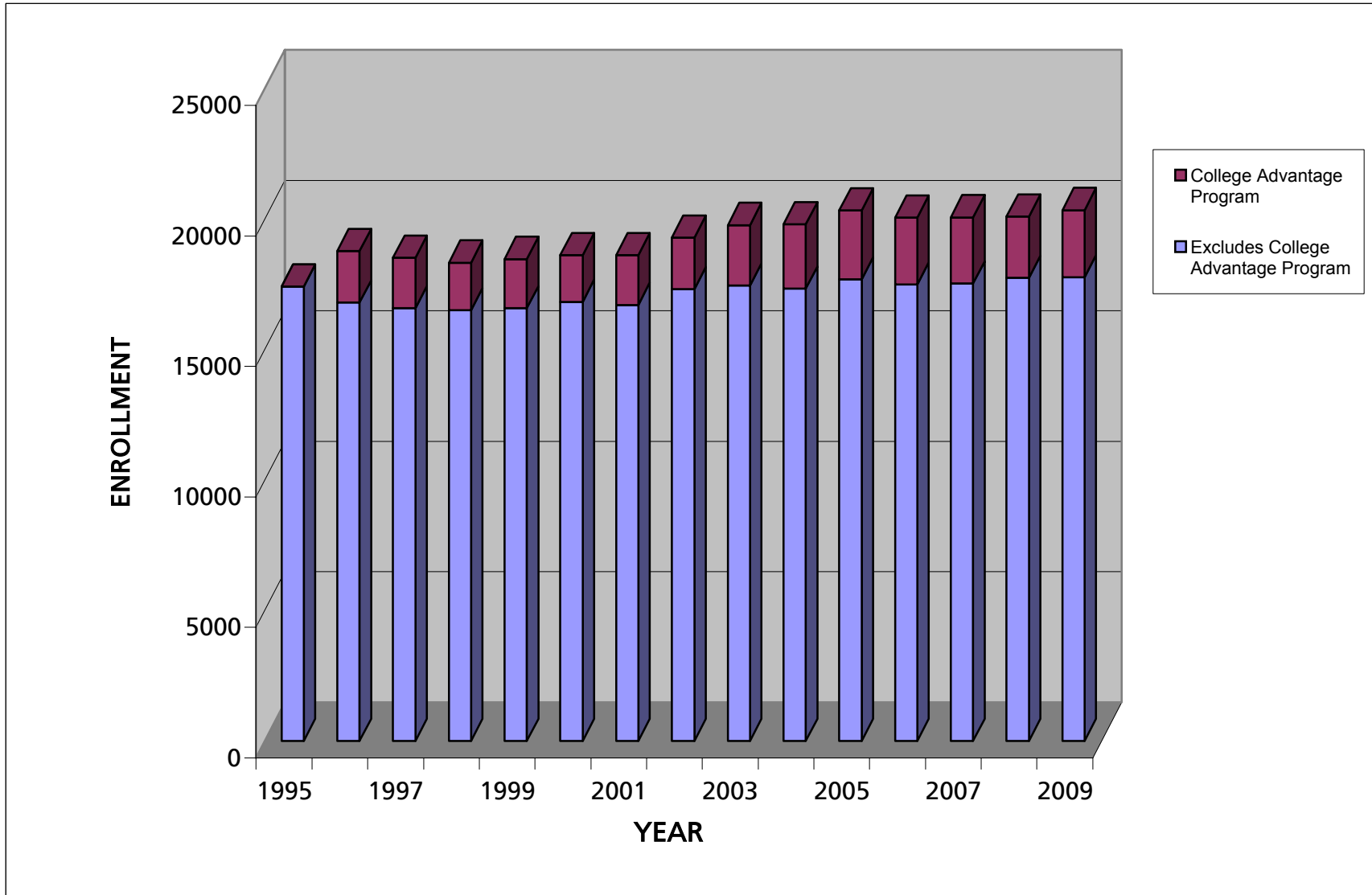

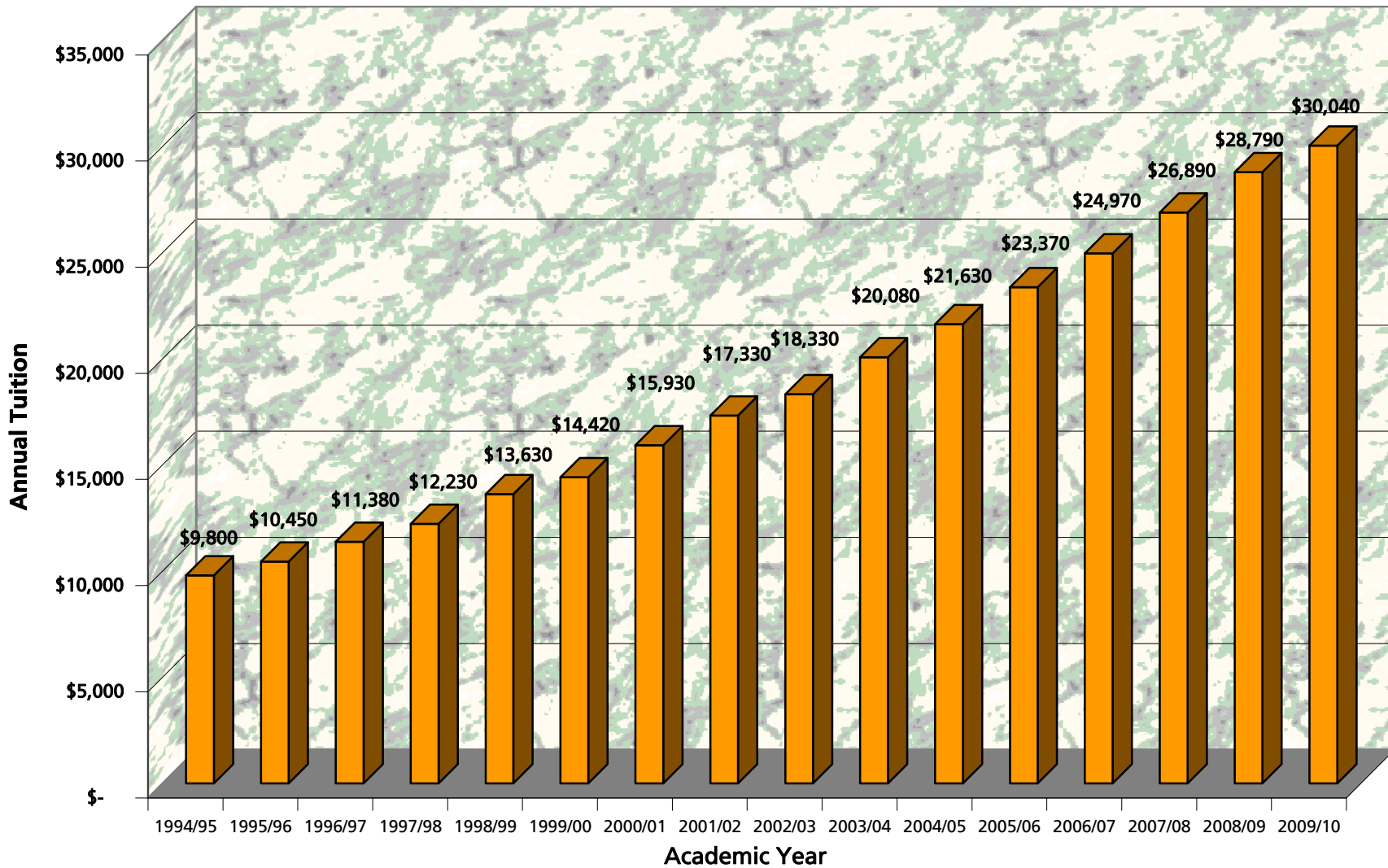

### Annual Undergraduate Tuition and Fees-1994/95 - 2009/10



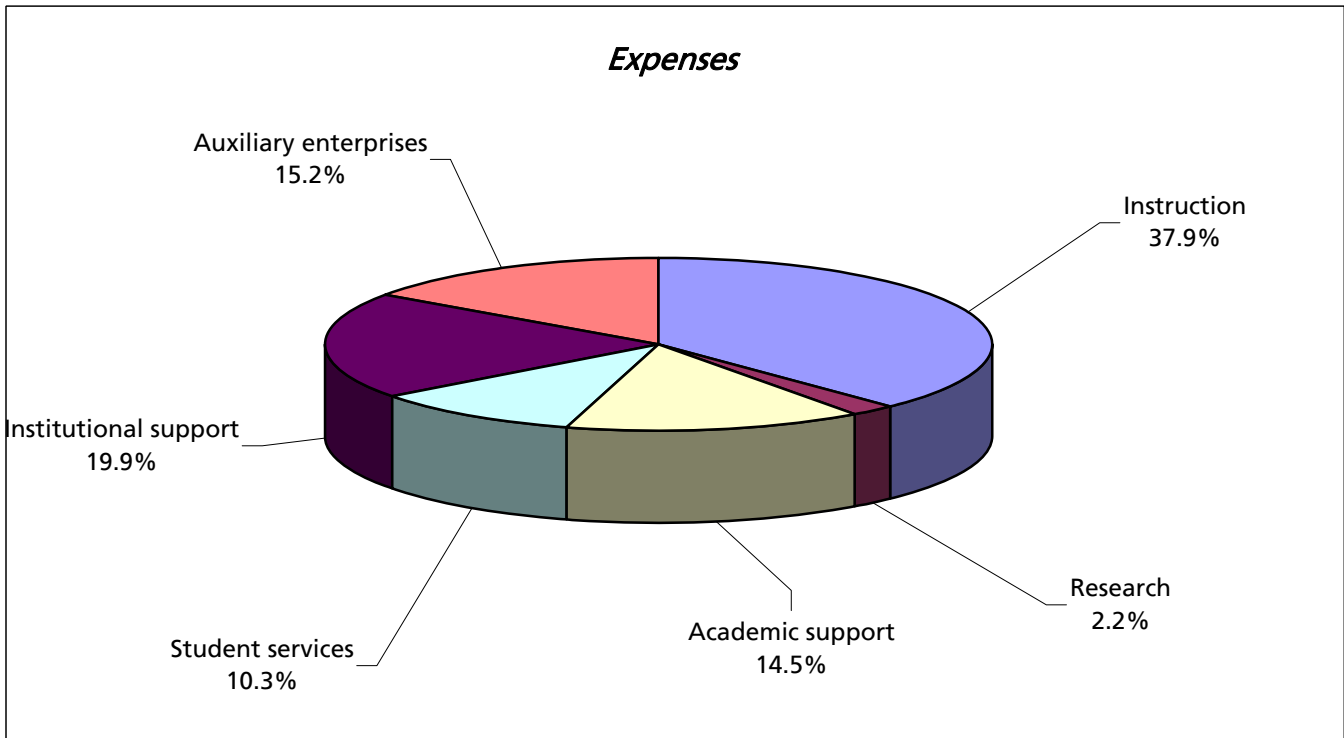
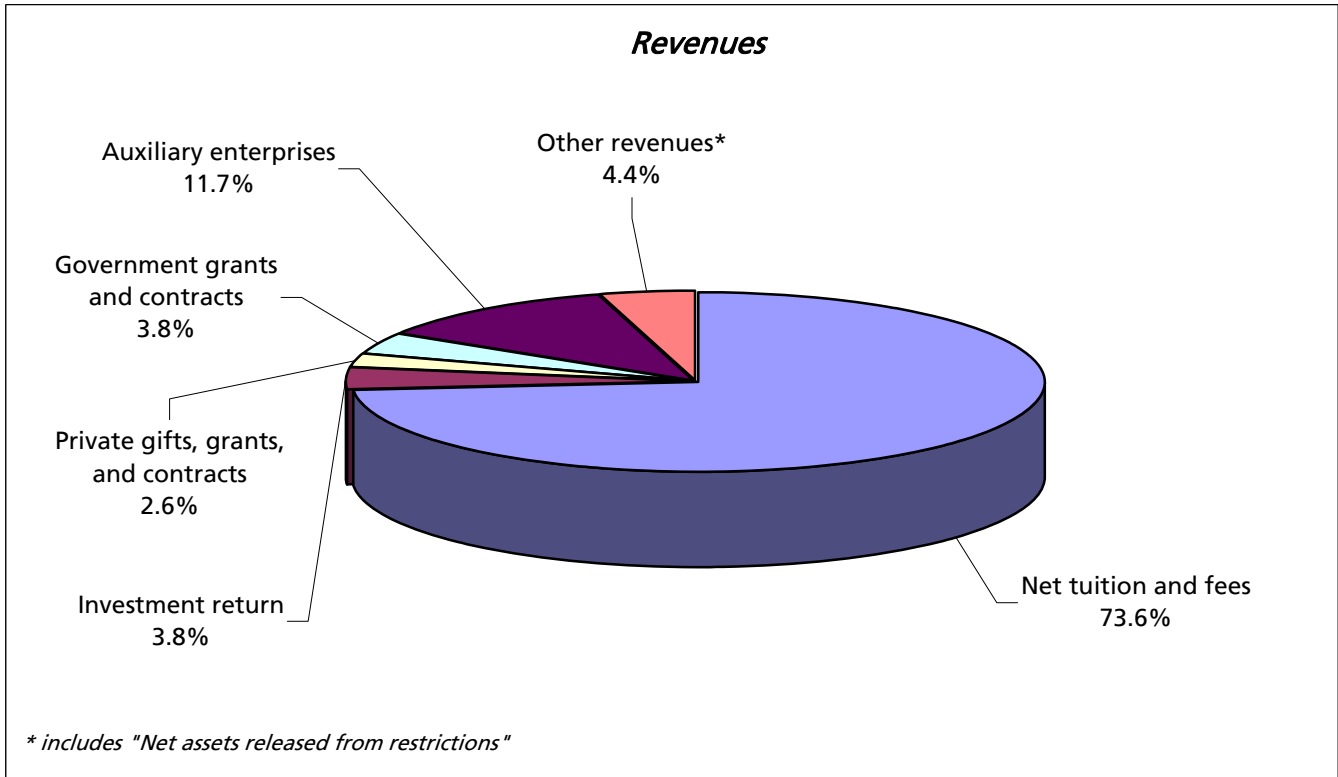

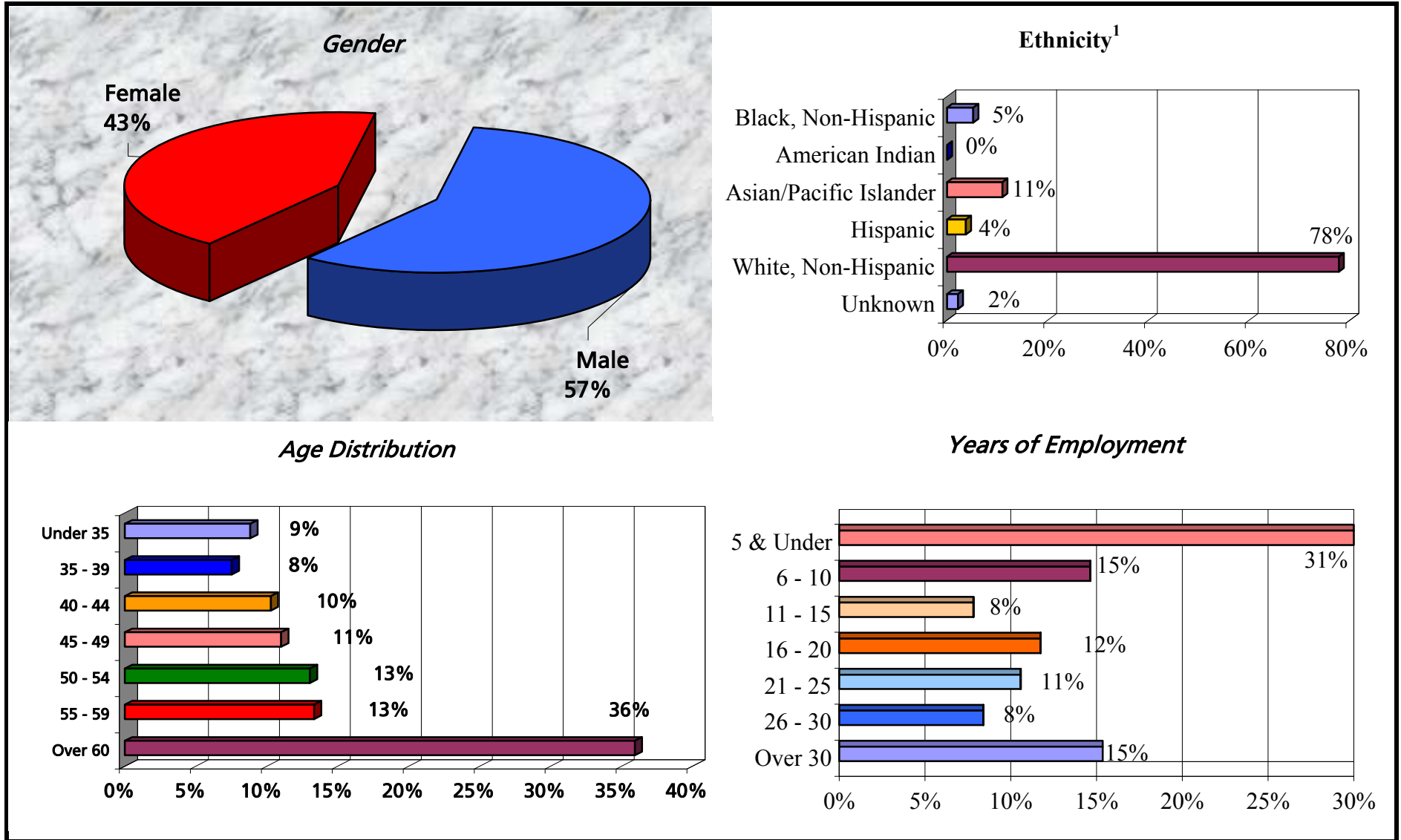

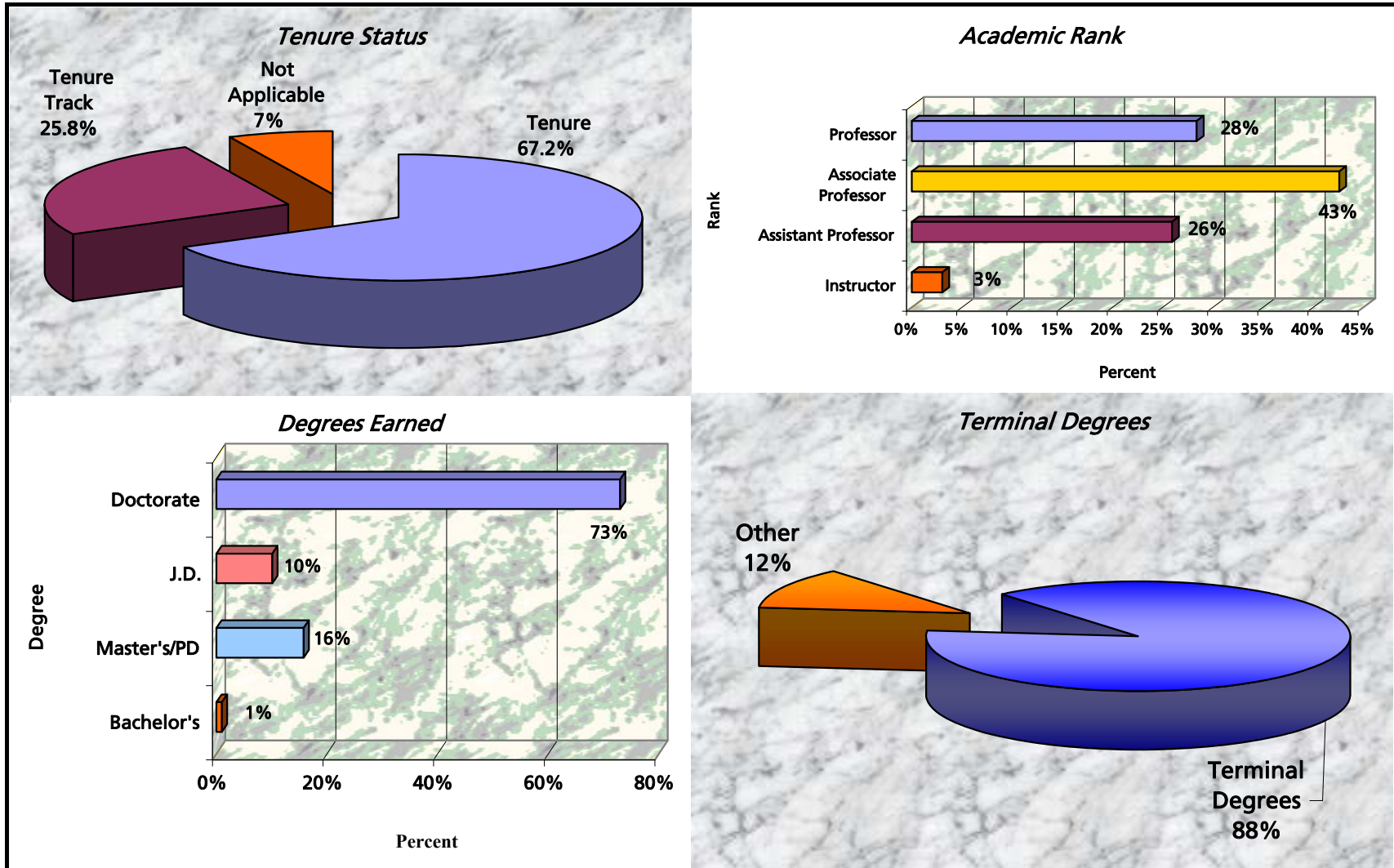

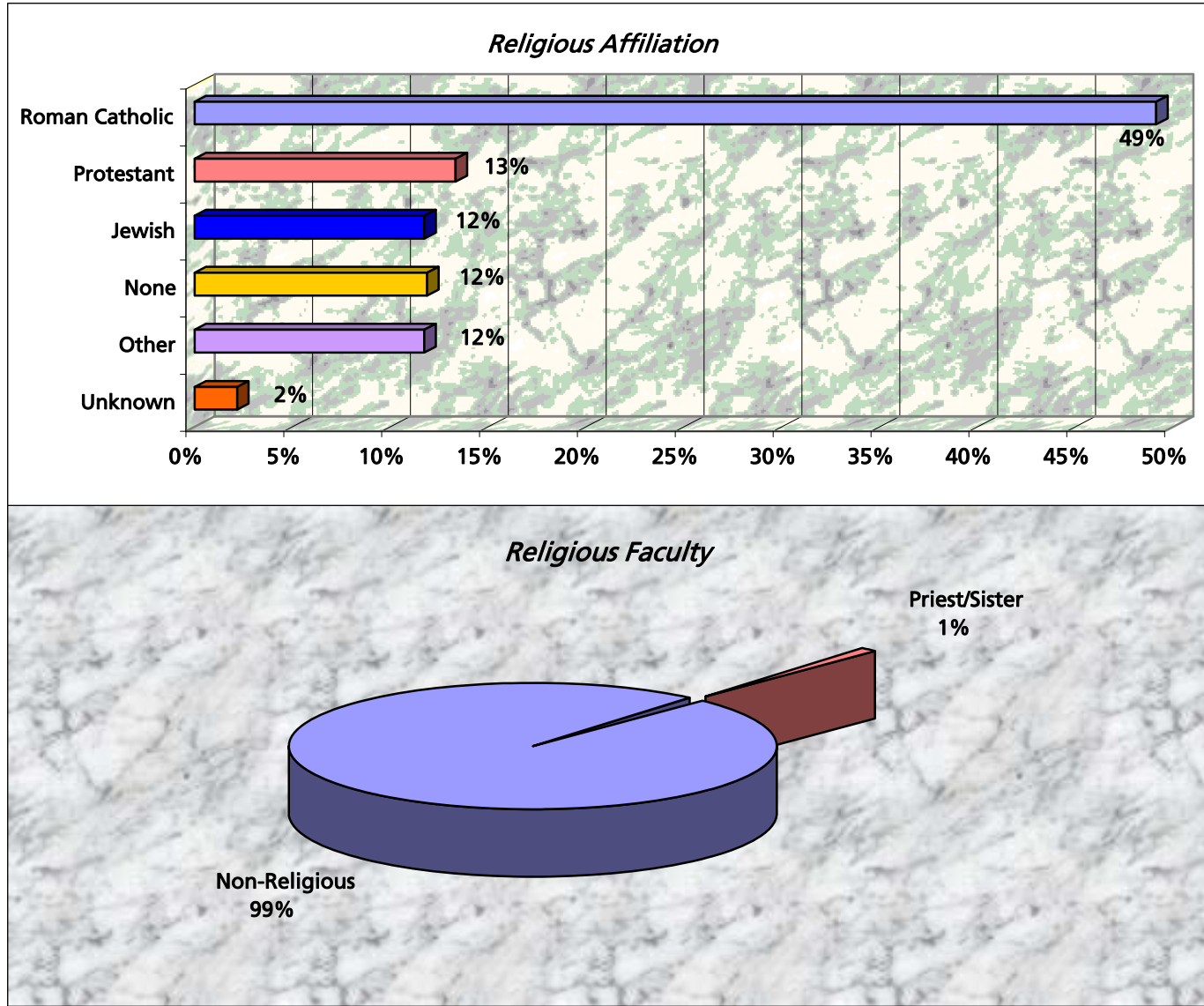
## Demographic Characteristics of Full-time Faculty Fall 2009

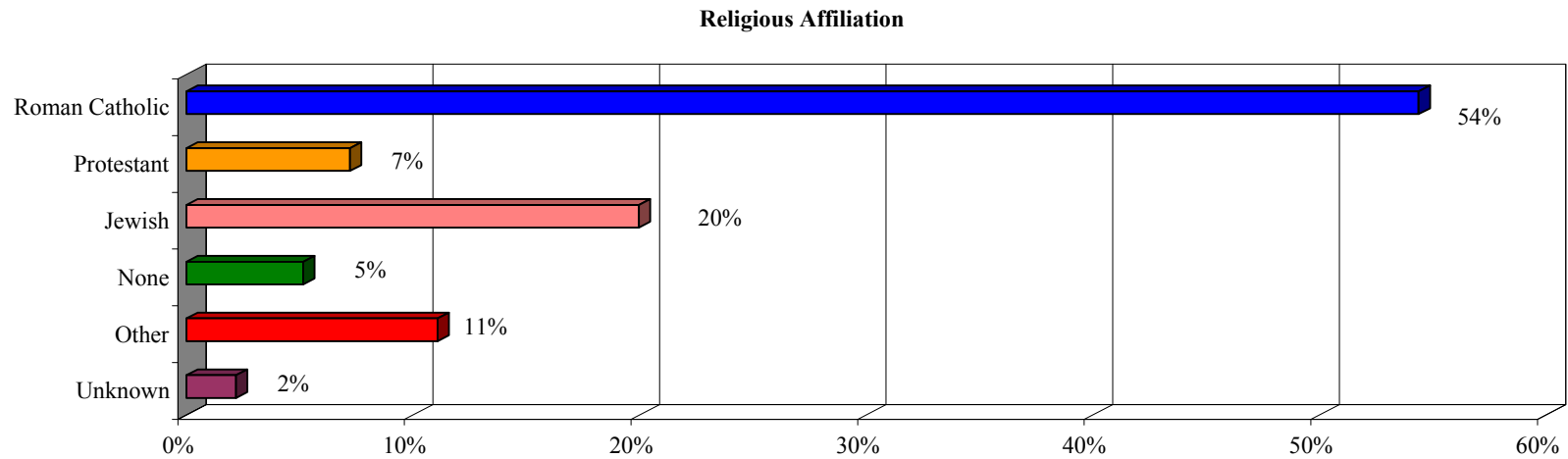
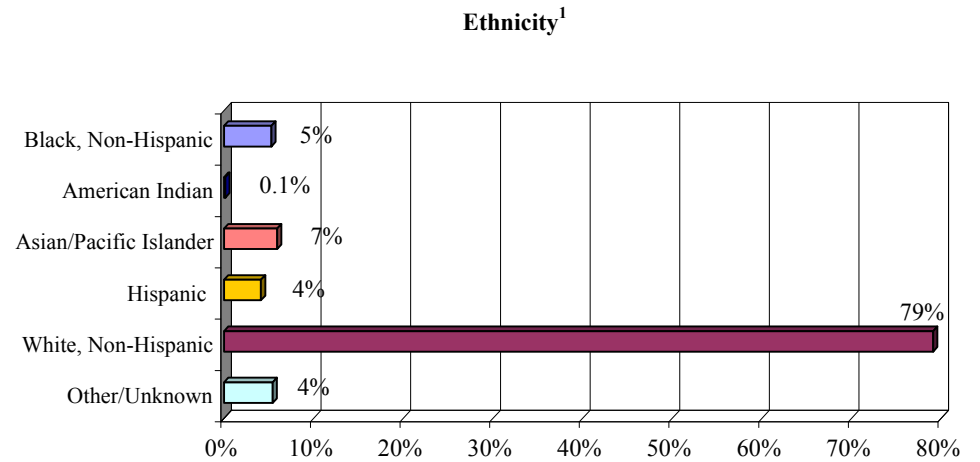
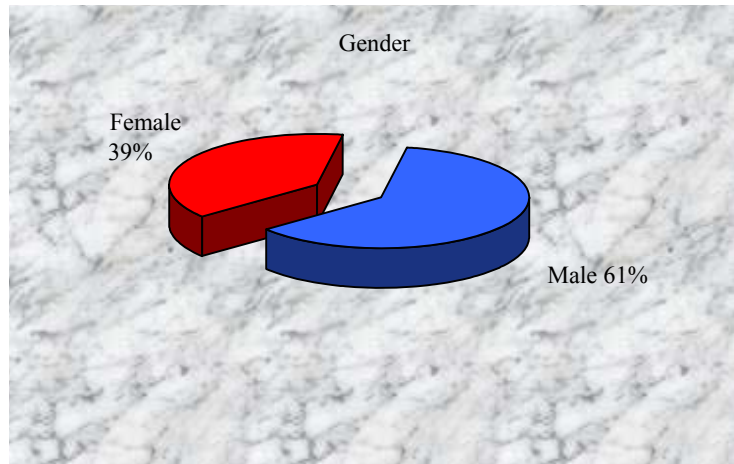
