

INTERNATIONAL UNDERGRADUATE AND ESL APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

HOW TO APPLY

Return this completed application along with the following required items:

- 1. \$50 nonrefundable application fee. (Paper application form only. Online undergraduate application is free.)
- Official high school or university transcripts. (Original transcripts in languages other than English must be accompanied by English translations.)
- 3. Copy of your TOEFL score card. (Not required for ESL)
- 4. Copy of your passport
- Financial Declaration. (Official document showing us that you have the necessary funds to attend Saint Martin's. Amount should cover the cost of tuition, room, board and fees.)
- Completed Housing Contract or Housing Waiver Form. (If you choose to complete the housing waiver form, you also need to submit an essay explaining your need to live off campus.)
- \$40 international express courier fee for I-20 visa documents (This fee is optional, but will ensure faster delivery of your visa documents.)

- Indicate a person who has had a significant influence on you and describe that influence.
- Describe a character in fiction, a historical figure, or a creative work (as in art, music, science, etc.) that has had an influence on you, and explain that influence.
- A range of academic interests, personal perspectives, and life experience adds much to the educational mix. Given your personal background, describe an experience that illustrates what you would bring to the diversity in a university community or an encounter that demonstrated the importance of diversity to you.
- Choose a topic of your own.
