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# **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

English 3/4 focuses on literature and themes surrounding several literary genres: fiction, nonfiction (functional documents, speeches, persuasive letters), and poetry. It is also a class that develops analytical skills through reading and writing. The writing of responses to literature, persuasive letters and essays, expository essays, business letters, and narrative writing are a major component of the class. English 3/4 is a class sophomores are required to pass in order to fulfill rigorous A-G requirements that are necessary for graduation of high school and for direct entrance after high school into California's State University and the University of California system. Overall, critical and analytical thinking and writing are the focus of this class.

# CAHSEE

Through the development of valuable skills that address Common Core Standards (http://www.corestandards.org/ELA-Literacy), sophomores should aim to surpass a score of 380 on the English portion of the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE). A score of 380 or above displays proficiency in English Language Arts state standards at the ninth and tenth grade level, whereas any score at or above 350 is still considered passing.

Meet the tenth grade English Literature Development standards for California public schools.

# REQUIRED TEXTBOOKS AND MATERIALS

\*McDougal Littell's <u>The Language of Literature</u> textbook (10th Grade/Blue Book)
\*Independent reading books of students' own choosing.
\*Student Gmail Account – Will be set up (or verified) at the beginning of the course.

#### PROJECTS & ESSAYS

To enhance their learning, students will not only complete an essay for every unit of study, but they will also complete a project that will enable the student to learn in various ways. Past opportunities for projects have included project menus that included: film production, poetry, research, performance, and journal reflections.

#### ABSENCE POLICY

Upon return from absence, it is the student's responsibility to locate, pick up, complete, and turn in assignments. Please report excused absences to the attendance office to prevent truancy F's.

#### CLASSROOM POLICIES

Students use the bathroom at teacher's discretion, as they should go during passing periods and lunch break. Students must sign in and out of class properly. Students will have SIX restroom passes per semester. Non-emergency bathroom breaks are not permissible the first or last 10 minutes of class (consistent with UCHS policy).

#### Citizenship Grade

All students are subject to the citizenship rubric. Failure to have all of the necessary supplies each day will result in a loss of citizenship and academic possible credit.
