### Who Should Attend

This course is designed for physicians, pharmacists, nurses, dietitians, social workers and diabetes educators.

### Purpose

Diabetes is a major public health problem. Currently, an estimated 25.8 million Americans have diabetes and 79 million have pre-diabetes. It is estimated that the number of Texans with diabetes will QUADRUPLE by 2040. Health care providers need to stay abreast with best practices in the treatment of diabetes and prevention of costly and devastating com-plications. This is the Seventh Annual Diabetes Management Conference and will provide the latest research for the prevention and treatment of chronic kidney disease and vascular complications. Other topics to be presented include insulin titration, inflammation and metabolic syndrome, exercise and diabetes, and the risks and benefits associated with statin therapy. How to use cognitive behavioral therapy will be presented to assist clinicians in helping patients engage more positively in self-care behaviors.

### Educational **Objectives**

Upon completion of this symposium, the participants should be able to link the educational objectives to Core Competencies (Medical Knowledge and Patient Care) and be able to:

- Describe the pathophysiology of chronic kidney disease (CKD) and preventative measures for patients with diabetes

- Identify the link between inflammation, nutrition, and chronic disease Describe various insulin initiation and titration protocols for optimal glycemic control
- Discuss the benefits of exercise and make specific recommendations to patients with diabetes to initiate a safe and sound exercise program
- Discuss the risks and benefits associated with use of statin therapy with patients who have diabetes
- Utilize cognitive behavioral therapy techniques to motivate patients in adopting self-care behaviors for diabetes


