The fall weather is upon us and it is hard to believe that October has come and gone! None the less, I am happy to say learning at school is blazing along as students and staff work diligently within school curriculum and plan for a variety of things along side of it.

Congratulations is extended to our Grade 5 students with their amazing presentation of "We Interrupt This News Cast....". It was evident that teachers and students took the time to present a very creative story about weather and electricity and how they can be very disruptive to our daily lives. I look forward to our next grade level presentation in November by our Grade 3 classes as well as our Remembrance Day assembly by our Character Council.

I draw your attention to the following important items:

- Many school fees are still outstanding. Please go to MY CBE ACCOUNT on our school website to make direct payment. Should you be experiencing hardship paying fees, information about fee waiver application is available through the following link: <u>http://www.cbe.ab.ca/registration/fees-and-waivers/Pages/default.aspx</u>
- Bus passes received have been issued. Bus drivers will be asking students for them to prove ridership. We suggest a plan for storage and carrying back and forth to school be organized between student and parent to ensure they get to and from school in a manner that they will not be lost. If a bus pass is lost, contact the office for a replacement cost of \$5.
- Grade level presentations/performances will now be shared 3 times two daytime presentations followed by an evening performance. This stems from us having to divide the school into two shows to accommodate student viewing while meeting fire code regulations. We encourage any parents who can come to the daytime performances to do so helping to alleviate overcrowding during the evening. To that end, 3 tickets will be issued per family to attend an evening performance. No extra tickets will be available for those wanting others to attend. Every person attending the performance must have a ticket no exceptions.
- Attending conferences is critical to keeping abreast of your child(ren)'s educational progress and an expectation in the TLC program. We encourage you to make all possible efforts to come to this important connecting time with teachers.
- Parking during P/T conferences in November is always tricky as our school is surrounded by housing. We ask that you respect and adhere to the parking signage posted in the neighborhood and be mindful of not parking in people's driveways or in ways that obstructs the flow of traffic. Plenty of on street parking is available at the south side in our 'hug and go' parking area.
- Brentwood School Website has been adjusted according to CBE protocol. All information can be found under the appropriate tabs/drop down links. Things such as calendars (*both electronic and printable*), newsletters, council/society information or communication tools, etc, are readily accessible under the school information, *parent or student tabs*.
- School Messenger will be our main communication tool. Much of what came home via paper in the past will now be sent via email attachment. Emergent issues will be sent via SRS text. School Nurse

It happens every fall: influenza arrives in Alberta, and takes a serious toll on our communities. Influenza is a real threat. It's also preventable.

Influenza immunization have been available, starting October 24, free of charge, to all Albertans six months of age and older. It's the single most effective means of protecting your family from influenza. By getting immunized early in the season, you will all have the opportunity to respond to immunization. and produce antibodies that will arm you against the influenza viruses you'll be exposed to again throughout the season.

Each year, influenza vaccine is developed to protect us against those strains of virus likely to circulate in our community. Though vaccine effectiveness may vary, know this: last season, influenza vaccine cut Albertan's risk of influenza by half. Without immunization, Albertans were completely at risk. And we do mean all Albertans.

Pregnant women, seniors, children, and individuals with underlying health conditions or compromised immune systems are at greater risk for severe complications; however. without immunization, even healthy Albertans - that includes you, parents! - are at risk of severe illness and even death. 62 Albertans died with influenza last season. and more than 1.600 Albertans were hospitalized. Let's do better this year. Let's make influenza one less thing your family has to deal with this winter. Prevention is your protection. Get immunized.

Academic success at the CBE

Earlier this fall we shared the results of our 2015-16 provincial achievement test and diploma exam results. Overall, our students demonstrated strong academic achievement and we are proud of what they have accomplished. We also know there are areas that we need to focus on, and we are committed to doing that.

In fact, we use these provincial results as tools to help us celebrate and build on our successes, and to target areas for growth and improvement. To that end, I am very encouraged to see that areas we had previously targeted for growth have seen marked improvement in this year's results. I am confident that this will continue in the areas we target in the future.

Provincial achievement testing is one of several ways the CBE measures student success. Other measures include report card data, student survey data and the province's Accountability Pillar. When reviewing our academic results, it's easy to focus on the charts and numbers. However, we know that behind every number is a student. And behind every student is a team of people, helping them reach their goals.

Thank you to everyone who is part of these teams – our parents, community members and our CBE staff – for all do to help students succeed. These results demonstrate that the resources, both human and financial, we are directing to students in the classroom are positively impacting student success.

Highlights

CBE students in Grades 6 and 9 outperformed the province at the acceptable standard and the standard of excellence on 18 out of 20 measures. Students' results on diploma exams are also impressive. In 10 of

11 exams, CBE students outperformed the province at the acceptable standard and the standard of excellence.

More than 40 per cent of CBE students writing the Biology 30 and Chemistry 30 diploma exams have achieved the standard of excellence for four years in a row.

In Physics 30, more than 40 per cent of CBE students have achieved the standard of excellence for five straight years. This year they reached a new high with 47.9 per cent achieving the standard of excellence.

In Science 30, a subject that had been previously identified as an area for growth, results have increased at the acceptable standard and standard of excellence.

We have noted some improvements in math, and we want to support further improvement over time. Overall improvement in our Knowledge and Employability courses is also identified as an area for continued attention.
