Elite Honors for Ewald

Patrick Ewald, Class of 2012, was honored for his academic and athletic abilities by being named to the IHSA Academic All-State team and by winning the prestigious Don Morris Multi-Sport Conference Award.



Ewald was only the second student athlete in Alleman's history to be named to the elite IHSA All-State Academic Team. Nominees needed to possess a minimum 3.50 grade point average on a 4.0 scale after their seventh semester, have participated in at least two IHSA sponsored activities during each of the last two years, and demonstrated outstanding citizenship.

Ewald was in the top ten of his graduating class, participated in football, basketball and track; and was involved in numerous student organizations at Alleman, including vice president of Sigma Alpha Delta (Students Against Destructive Decisions).

Ewald is the son of Dick and Mary Ewald of Taylor Ridge. He is now attending the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland.

2012 Athletic Hall of Fame Inductees

During a post-game ceremony on Friday, August 24, 2012, new members were inducted into the Alleman Athletic Hall of Fame. This now brings the total number of inductees to eighty. A complete list of inductees is on our website at under Athletics. There have been many great contributors to the Alleman athletic program in the past 63 years. This latest group of inductees has added their own special "Touch of Class".

Gary DeMarlie, 1958

Gary was a three year basketball letter winner, in addition to earning two varsity letters in both Baseball and Track. He led his Basketball team to an outstanding 46-13 record over a two-year period, 1956-57 & 1957-58. Gary was selected to the All-Quad City



1st team, All-Northern Illinois 1st team, and the prestigious Chicago Tribune top-25. He earned a full athletic scholarship to Regis University (Denver, CO). Gary was the Rangers' starting guard for three years, and earned four varsity letters during his 1959-62 college athletic career. He graduated with a B.S. in Business Administration. (deceased December 8, 2006)

Stacey Burgmeier Keller, 1998

Stacey was one of the most accomplished softball players in Alleman school history earning four varsity letters. She was a big part of the 1998 IHSA Class A State Championship team, and a team member on three State qualifying teams in 1995, 1997 & 1998. During her four years the



Pioneers' overall team record was 108-25. Stacey was a four time All-Conference selection and part of two Western Big 6 Conference titles in 1997 & 1998. Several marks during her career still rank #1 in school history – Career at Bats (427), Games Played (139), and Runs Batted In (109). She ranks #2 in Hits (82), Doubles (28) and Triples (20). She also left her mark in the IHSA record books – ranks #4 Most Runs Scored – Inning (3) and ranks #3 Most Hits – Inning (3). Following graduation Stacey returned to serve as Alleman JV Softball coach from 1999-2005.

1988 4 X 100M Girls Relay

This relay team dominated the track in 1988 – they won the Class A Sectional and helped Alleman win the team title. They headed to State with great expectations and won the IHSA Class A State relay Championship in a record time of 49.03. That State record stood for 17 years – and still remains an Alleman school record to this day. These same student-athletes had an outstanding year in 1989 as well – they helped claim another Class A Sectional team title and their 4 x 200m relay team went on to finish 2nd at the Class A State meet. Their time of 1:46.72 remains an Alleman school record.

Each relay member earned All-State honors and many individual accomplishments of their own. Jenny Van Weil finished 8th in the 1990 State long jump and her jump of 18'-1" in 1989 remains an Alleman school record. Jensie Grigsby finished 6th at State in the 200m in 1989 and was part of the 1991 4 x 400m relay team that earned a 6th place finish at State. She still holds school records in four events and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2010. During their time at Alleman they were under the direction of longtime Alleman coach, Phil Sailer.

2004-05 Girls Basketball Team

The 2004-05 team finished with an outstanding 31-7 overall record on their way to the IHSA Class A State Championship! This State basketball title was a first for the Quad City area – girls or boys. During this championship season, the Pioneers also captured several other big titles - the State Farm Classic in Bloomington and Galesburg's MLK Classic. Individual honors were earned as well - Amanda Clifton was selected to the IBCA All-State 3rd team. All-Conference 1st team and shared team MVP honors with Katie Manning. Emily Chesser earned IBCA All-State 4th team and Megan Marlier was the team's Most Improved. The 2004-05 Pioneer team was chosen by the Dispatch newspaper as Player of the Year – the first and only time an entire team has been selected. If ever there was a team who embodied what a team really means - it was our 2004-05 Girls Basketball State Championship team!
