#### ENDORSE CITY MAYORS' RESOLUTION - REVENUE SHARING/NEW DEAL:

WHEREAS revenue sharing was introduced by the Government of Saskatchewan as an innovative and forward thinking program in the 1970s to provide alternate sources of revenues to Saskatchewan communities from the broader tax revenues of the Province to fund community services, programs and activities to sustain their economic, environmental, cultural and social quality of life and competition based on community choices and priorities;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Saskatchewan in the 1980s and early 1990s was faced with significant fiscal challenges and requested all Saskatchewan residents including urban municipalities to bear the burden of fiscal recovery which was readily accepted as a necessity by all Saskatchewan communities. This required significant reductions in the revenue sharing available to Saskatchewan communities that necessitated property tax increases, service reductions or deferral of capital expenditures. In the case of the City of Melfort, in 1990 \$510,437 in revenue sharing grants was received representing 11.2% of the operating budget. In 2003, including the significant escalation of revenue sharing grants of \$30 million over the past three years, the City of Melfort received \$301,077, or 4.55% of the City's operating budget;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Saskatchewan has recognized the need to increase funding to urban municipalities from the broader Provincial tax base as the Provincial financial position and economy improves and through that decision has provided an additional \$30 million to the revenue sharing pool over the past three years. This commitment is acknowledged to be significant recognition of the need to share provincial revenues with communities and has improved their fiscal position but still leaves the revenue sharing pool at a level significantly less than it was in relative terms for urban municipalities and at approximately half of what it would have been had the pool and escalation indexes continued to be in place;

AND WHEREAS the Province of Saskatchewan is to be commended for taking the lead with the Government of Canada to pursue negotiations for the New Deal for infrastructure funding and has committed that no claw back will occur at the Provincial level. The New Deal funding will provide capital infrastructure for community needs but will not address the oncoming municipal financial needs for services and community expectations to maintain and sustain their quality of life, competitive position and community autonomy;

AND WHEREAS it is widely recognized that communities need financial autonomy to fulfill their community expectations, community capacity and decision making to sustain the environmental, economic, social and cultural growth of communities and Saskatchewan:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that SUMA request the Provincial Government:

- In recognition of the buoyancy of the Provincial economy, to reinstate the revenue sharing pool to an appropriate level from the general revenues of the province that reflects the original commitments to revenue sharing before reductions occurred through Provincial austerity; and
- 2. Once the revenue sharing pool is established to an appropriate and acceptable level, that it be indexed utilizing the original revenue sharing tax base indices of personal income, corporate income, fuel and retail sales; and

3. The Provincial Government commit to working with SUMA and all Saskatchewan Municipalities to define the desired outcomes from this new revenue consistent with the principles and criteria for the New Deal negotiations so that municipalities have both the capacity to maintain and grow their infrastructure and sustain the delivery of community expectations through service delivery in a framework of local autonomy, capacity building and accountability.
