Horse Expo Booth 413 -

A Slower Year, but Drive On!

While most shifts at Expo this year saw lower attendance – and in fact the Expo only used two of the normal three buildings at the Maryland State Fairgrounds in Timonium for exhibitors – the parking lots were still full. We handed out about 220 bags of information on driving, down about 100 from recent years. Sales of Intro clinic registrations, memberships, and books were down as well, according to **Julia Skelley**, but magazine sales were about even. With the ADS covering many of the expenses for the joint booth, My Lady's Manor did accomplish the main goals – of advertising the sport of carriage driving to horse enthusiasts and of directing them to information about driving safely.



The booth expanded from 10'x15' to 10'x20' this year and the 15 foot wide wood panel center section again held our display items of previous years by **Melinda Russell** – ADS and MLMDC graphics, two large photos and two framed montage photo sets of members driving – and a pair of **Jack Day's** carriage lamps, as well as a new CAA sign. Conveniently, the Expo's drapery visible in the new width on either side was hunter green!

Held in conjunction with the USEF meeting in Cincinnatti, Ohio, the ADS BOD meeting took place on Saturday and Sunday, January 17 -18, 2009. First and foremost, the ADS continues to budget and run in the black, something which cannot be done without the generosity of its members. Hello and Happy New Year to all of the My Lady's Manor Driving Club members, your families, & friends. Originally from Baltimore, I now reside in Carroll County, Maryland, with my wife, **Angela.** Angela, who is originally from the Jersey Shore, has been recruited into the club and now manages Membership. M is for Miniature Horse

The result of nearly 400 years of selective breeding, historians tend to support the Miniature Horse breed as a derivative of many sources. In prehistoric times small horse breeds were most likely the products of surviving harsh natural climates and limited feed. Today, knowledge of genetics allows breeding specifically for size.

The first mention of a small horse being imported into the United States was in 1888, but there was little public awareness of true Miniatures until 1960. Popular belief is that American Miniature horses utilized the blood of English and Dutch mine horses brought into this country in the 19th century and used in some Appalachian coal mines as late as 1950. The American Miniature Horse also drew upon the blood of the Shetland pony.

Throughout its past, the Miniature Horse has been bred for pets, novelty, research, monetary gain, mining work, exhibition, and royal gifts. 
