Livestock ID Process

All breeding beef, dairy goats, meat breeding goats, breeding sheep, lamas, dairy, dogs, horses and swine in Steele County will be identified following the online self-ID process. That means YOU enter all identification information for these project animals into 4honline yourself. All market goats, market sheep, and rabbits must be identified at a central ID after which 4-H staff will enter your ID information into 4honline. You should have already received your species ID letter in the mail. All livestock IDs must be completed in 4honline by May 15. If you are enrolled in a livestock project and have not received a letter, call or stop by the office.

Rabbits

You will need to have your rabbit tattooed and verified at a Central Verification Day. These dates are Thursday, May 8 from 5:30 - 7 PM at the SCCC and Saturday, May 10 from 9-11 AM at the Horse Barn. NOTE: Tattooing will NOT be available on May 10th, so if your rabbits still need to be tattooed by ID time, register for the Central ID on May 8th. You must attend one of these verification days if you want your animal properly ID'd for the county fair. Failure to do this will result in county and state fair consequences.

Market Sheep & Market Goats

Central Weigh In and Verification Day for Market Sheep and Market Goats will be held at the Beef Barn on Thursday, May 8th from 6-7 PM and again on Saturday, May 10th from 8 AM-12 Noon. Please call the office to schedule your time. Watch the mail for your identification letter. All market animals **must be** ID'd at the verification days; failure to do so will result in county and state fair consequences.

Swine

There will be NO Central Weigh and Verification Day for swine. You will need to stop at the Extension Office to get ear tags and tagger and then self-ID your animals in 4honline!

Breeding Beef, Breeding Sheep, Breeding & Dairy Goats, Dairy, Lama, Dog, Horse & Poultry

There is NO Central Verification Day for breeding beef, breeding sheep, meat breeding or dairy goats, dairy, dog, horse, lama or poultry. However, these IDs must be completed in 4honline by May 15 also!

Dog

A Dog Project Meeting is set for **Tuesday, April 29**th at 5 PM at the Steele County Community Center. **DO NOT BRING YOUR DOG!** We will review rules and expectations of both 4-Hers and parents for the project. We will also be setting the training and show schedule at this meeting.

The Pot Luck Meal Approach to Managing a 4-H Club

Last month we discussed *creating a welcoming environment: steps of 4-H program planning.*

This month we focus on managing a 4-H Club. Effective club management is a lot like planning a pot luck meal. A pot luck meal is a gathering for a large number of people, where everyone brings a prepared food item to share with others at the gather. Pot luck meals offer a wide variety of great food and limit the workload for any one individual. Pot lucks meals and effective 4-H Clubs don't just happen, they take planning and management by the leaders and a willingness to share in the responsibility by each of the participants.

Club leaders have a very important role in managing the 4-H club. Leaders serve as mentors and motivators for young people as well as coordinate with other adults and youth in the club to create an environment where young people thrive and grow.

Animal Identifications Due May 15

All 4-H animal projects must be owned or leased and all ID information submitted on or before May 15 (The exception is market beef and dairy steers, which had a deadline of February 18.)

Beginning this year, Minnesota 4-H is using its online enrollment system, 4HOnline, as the preferred method of submitting ID data. If families do not have Internet access a paper based process is still available. But in all cases, ID data must be submitted online, arrive in the Extension office, or be postmarked no later than May 15.

Species specific information about ID'ing 4-H animals and using 4HOnline for animal ID will be sent to members enrolled in 4-H animal projects. More information is also available online at www.4-H.umn.edu/animal-ID or you may contact your county Extension office.

Sign Up for the 2014 4-H Engineering Design Challenge: Build a Rube Goldberg Machine!

The new 2014 4-H Engineering Design Challenge asks youth to build a Rube Goldberg Machine that can zip a zipper. Rube Goldberg Machines use everyday items that interact in a series of chain-reactions to complete a simple task (The game Mouse Trap is a Rube Goldberg Machine!)

What: Youth teams build a Rube Goldberg Machine that will zip a zipper. Teams will chat online with U of M Engineering student mentors; work with adult leaders, and journal online about the process.

Who: Teams of 3-10 youth in grades 3-8 led by at least one adult volunteer leader.

Where: Teams that complete online requirements can compete in contests at their county fair, and will be eligible to compete at the Minnesota State Fair.
