#### **Early Release Day**

We'd like to remind you that Friday, February 14th is an Early Release Day. There will be no afternoon classes for students. On this Early Release day, the staff will participate in professional development to enhance student learning.

Dismissal for all Kindergarten to Grade 8 "walk in" students or those being picked up by parents/designated adults will be at the end of period three – 12:00 p.m. If you are picking up your kindergarten child, please do so in the front courtyard area. Grade 1 – 8 students will meet you at the back door near the gym.

Bussed students will be transported home at approximately 12:05 p.m., and can be expected to return home approximately 3 - 3 1/2 hours earlier than usual.

We understand that on early release days there is often a need for alternate pick up arrangements (i.e., with a grandparent, babysitter, friend, walking, bicycle, etc.). We ask that if your child will be traveling home on Friday in an alternate manner, please communicate this to us via telephone or a note to the teacher.

#### How Do I Know When to Keep My Child Home From School?

As a parent, making the decision to keep your child home can sometimes be challenging. Nobody wants their child to miss school unnecessarily. According to Public Health, your child should stay home if they are experiencing:

Vomitting/Diarrhea through the night or in the morning

Fever ... this indicates active infection

**Eye Irritations with yellow discharge or redness** ... it could be pink eye which is contagious **Runny Nose** ... especially with thick mucous

Head Lice ... child should stay home until treated with special shampoo and nits removed **Rashes** ... only your doctor can diagnose, so have it checked out

**Stomach Aches & Headaches** ... keep your child home for observation and if they happen often, see your doctor

Sore Throat ... can usually spread infection

Cough ... night cough or any continuous coughing

Toothaches ... child should be seen by a dentist

If your son or daughter appears ill in the morning, please keep him or her home. Learning is difficult when you are not feeling well and we wish to prevent the spread of sickness to other students. Sometimes one day at home resting can ensure that a student doesn=t become more seriously ill in days that follow. If your son/daughter becomes ill with a communicable disease (i.e., chicken pox, pink eye, impetigo, etc.), please check with your doctor before he/she returns to school.

**Please Note:** Students are not kept in at recess due to illness as fresh air and exercise are essential to a healthy mind and body. If your child is well enough to be at school, we consider him/her well enough to be outside. Colds and coughs will not be affected if the student is properly dressed and does not over-extend him/herself. We feel very strongly that if the child is too ill to go out for recess, it would be in the child's best interest to remain home for the day. If you believe your child is an exceptional case, please contact Mrs. Friesen to discuss the situation.

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### Stress

Adults are not the only people who feel stress. Kids do too. Some stress is normal, but too much is not good for anyone.

When kids feel too stressed, they may: Complain of tummy aches or headaches Cry or whine a lot Seem sad or angry Have trouble sleeping Not want to go to school Seem to not care about the things they normally like doing Have trouble getting along with their family or friends



You can help your child deal with stress by:

Making sure they gets physical activity and time to play Providing nutritious meals Spending time with your child, ask them how they feel and show them that you love them: hugs and kisses will make them feel good. Have fun together! Have bedtime routines to help them relax at the end of the day Make sure they get enough sleep Start the day with morning routines Learn to manage your stress

Transportation for Your Kindergarten Child Starting school is a very exciting time in both a parent's and a child's life. It is also a time when there are many new things to get used to and lots of questions about how things work. We hope this information will answer some of your questions about the transportation of your child to school.

About NSTS	Niagara Student Transportation Services (NSTS) is a consortium between the District School Board of Niagara (DSBN) and the Niagara Catholic District School Board (NCDSB).
Transportation Eligibility	Our goal at NSTS is to provide safe, efficient and on-time transportation services, allowing your child to arrive at school ready to learn and return home safely at the end of their day. We are responsible for the safe transportation of 32,000 students daily with the help of contracted services from school bus and taxi operators.
	DSBN and NCDSB Transportation Policies stipulate that students in Junior and Senior Kindergarten must be at least 800 metres from their home school to be eligible for transportation. Once a student's address is determined eligible for service, transportation is automatically assigned. If you do not require service, please email NSTS and we will adjust your child's record accordingly.
	As students advance grade levels, the distance for eligibility increases for stu- dents attending their home school to 1,600 metres for grades 1 to 8 and 2,500 metres for students in grades 9 to 12.
Half-Day and Full-Day	If your child is registered in a full-day program, transportation will be provided on regular morning and afternoon routes. Both DSBN and NDCSB offer mid-day transportation services to support half-day Kindergarten classes. To ensure that transportation is arranged efficiently for half day programs, NSTS works with schools to group students eligible for transportation on the same side of day.
Bus Stop Locations	In general, pick-up and drop-off locations are designated at central points. Cen- tral bus stops are typically located within 400 metres of a student's residence. A house bus stop may be provided if a student is not physically able to access the central bus stop.
Changes to Address Information	NSTS automatically downloads student records from the school. If you change your address or change daycare providers, please update your child's informa- tion with your school so transportation can be arranged accordingly.
One Pick-Up and One Drop- Off Address	To ensure the safety of your child, students may only have one pick-up and one drop-off location. The pick-up location may be different from the drop-off loca- tion, but each must be consistent 5 days a week. The reason for tvhis policy is a consistent schedule eliminates the chance of a mistake being made by one of the many people responsible for the transportation of your child.
